1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *SACE Board of South Australia Regulations 2023*.

2—Commencement

These regulations come into operation on the day on which they are made.

3—Interpretation

In these regulations—

Act means the *SACE Board of South Australia Act 1983*;

Amendment Act means the *Senior Secondary Assessment Board of South Australia (Review) Amendment Act 2008*;

prescribed certification requirements means any qualification requirements for the achievement of the SACE—

- (a) prescribed by the *Senior Secondary Assessment Board of South Australia Regulations 2000* (repealed); or
- (b) determined by the Board.

4—Transitional arrangements

- (1) The Board may continue to award the qualification in existence on the commencement of the Amendment Act on such basis as the Board may determine from time to time.
- (2) The prescribed certification requirements will continue to apply (as may be relevant) for students undertaking senior secondary education (within the meaning of the *Senior Secondary Assessment Board of South Australia Act 1983* immediately before the commencement of the Amendment Act) until otherwise determined by the Board.
- (3) All approvals given or other steps taken by the Board before the commencement of the Amendment Act (and still having force or effect immediately before that commencement) will continue to have effect in all respects on and after that commencement unless or until the Board determines otherwise.

- (4) All achievements recognised by the Board before the commencement of the Amendment Act (and being so recognised at the time of that commencement) will continue to have effect in all respects on or after that commencement (unless the Board has valid grounds to revoke the recognition of an achievement in a particular case after that commencement).

5—Fees

The Board may, in appropriate cases, waive or reduce fees that would otherwise be payable to the Board under the Act.

*Form 5—Notice of Acquisition***1. Notice of acquisition**

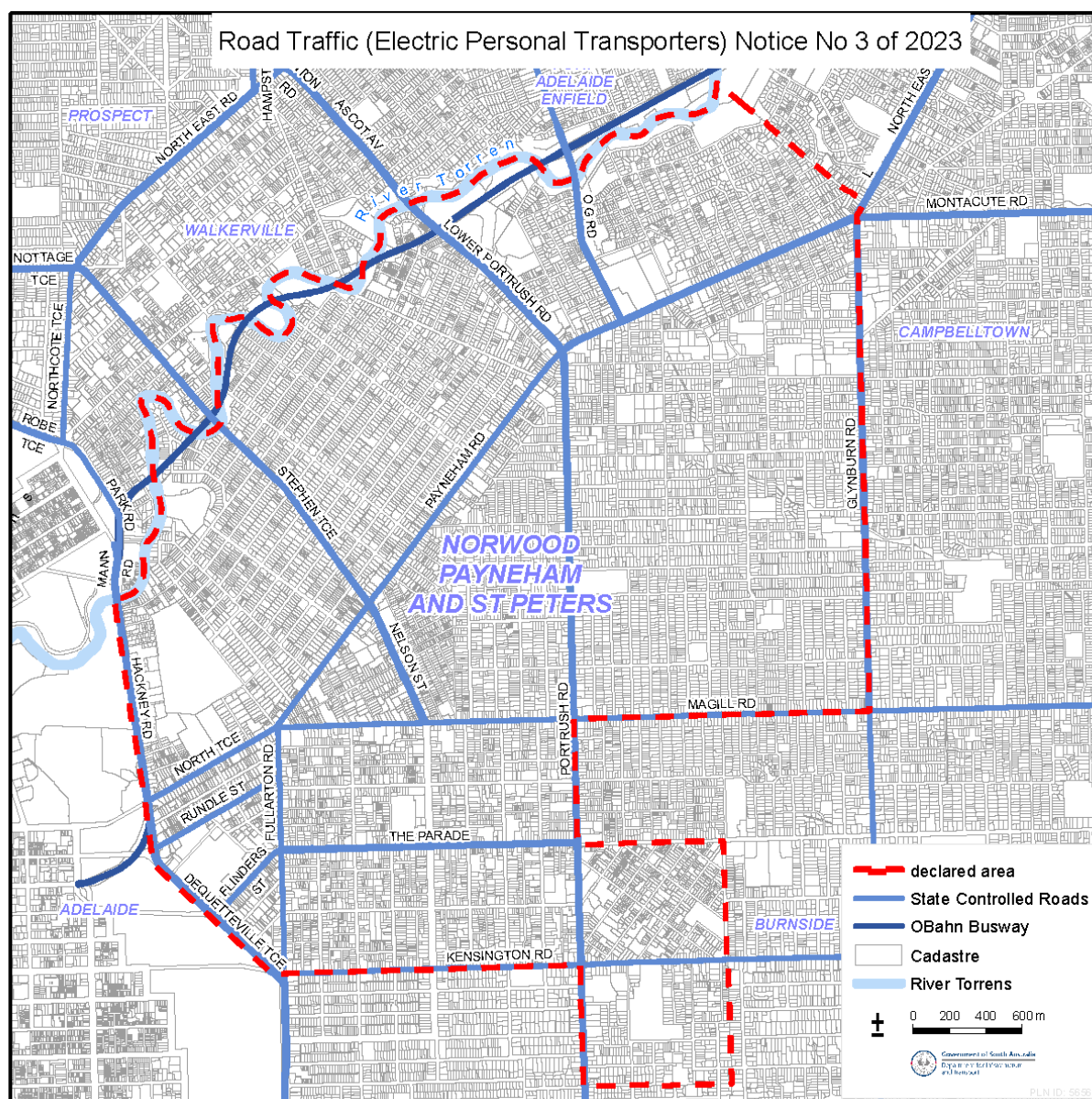

The Applicant is granted an exemption in the following terms:

Under the provisions of Section 92(1) of the *Equal Opportunity Act 1984* (SA) (the Act), but for the purposes only of meeting the Applicant's contractual obligations and the U.S. Export Regulations, the Applicant is granted an exemption from the provisions of Sections 52 and 54 of the Act for a period of three years commencing on 4 July 2023 in the following terms:

1. Pursuant to Section 92(1) of the Act, the Applicant is exempt from compliance with the provisions of Sections 52 and 54 of the Act to the extent that it may:
 - 1.1 request Personal Information from existing and potential employees and contract workers and require employees to provide details of any changes to their Personal Information;
 - 1.2 take the Personal Information into account in determining who should be offered employment or contract work in areas requiring access to U.S. Export Controlled Material and when making decisions as to the participation of employees or contract workers in such work;
 - 1.3 maintain records of the Personal Information of all employees and contract workers who have or may have access to U.S. Export Controlled Material;
 - 1.4 ensure that U.S. Export Controlled Material is disclosed only to persons who are authorised by U.S. Export Regulations controls to receive it;
 - 1.5 impose limitations or prohibitions on persons of particular nationalities having access to U.S. Export Controlled Material;
 - 1.6 disclose to other defence contractors for whom the Applicant performs work and to the USA and Australian governments, the Personal Information of all employees and contract workers who will have access to U.S. Export Controlled Material in the performance of their work; and
 - 1.7 establish security systems which will prevent the unauthorised re-export or re-transfer of U.S. Export Controlled Material.
2. This exemption is granted for a period of three years commencing on 4 July 2023 subject to the following conditions:
 - 2.1 It will apply only to conduct by the Applicant where:
 - (a) that conduct is necessary to enable it to enter into, perform and ensure compliance with contractual undertakings and the U.S. Export Regulations where access to U.S. Export Controlled Material is required for performance of contracts;
 - (b) it has taken all steps that are reasonably available (including steps which might be taken in negotiating and performing the terms of their agreements with contractors in the USA) to avoid the necessity for engaging in conduct which would otherwise be in breach of Sections 52 and 54 of the Act.

 - (i) what training is undertaken;
 - (ii) which employees undertake the training; and
 - (iii) how often the training is conducted.

A By-law to amend various By-laws of the City of Mitcham to address matters raised by the Legislative Review Committee

PART 1 – PRELIMINARY

1. **Title**
This By-law may be cited as the ‘By-law Amendment By-law 2023’ and is By-law No. 8 of the City of Mitcham.
2. **Authorising Law**
This By-law is made under sections 246 and 249 of the *Local Government Act 1999*.
3. **Purpose**
The objective of this By-law is to amend various provisions in Council By-laws in the manner set out in Part 2. The By-laws amended by this By-law are the following By-laws made by the Council on 9 August 2022 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 25 August 2022:
 - 3.1 By-law No. 2 - *Moveable Signs By-law 2022*;
 - 3.2 By-law No. 3 - *Local Government Land By-law 2022*;
 - 3.3 By-law No. 5 - *Dogs By-law 2022*; and
 - 3.4 By-law No. 7 - *Waste Management By-law 2022*.
4. **Commencement, Revocation and Expiry**
 - 4.1 Pursuant to section 249(6)(d) of the *Local Government Act 1999*, this By-law will take effect on the date that is it published in the *Government Gazette*.
 - 4.2 This By-law will expire on 1 January 2030.
5. **Interpretation**
In this By-law, unless the contrary intention appears:
 - 5.1 **Act** means the *Local Government Act 1999*;
 - 5.2 **Council** means the City of Mitcham;
 - 5.3 **By-law 2** means the *Moveable Signs By-law 2022* made by the Council on 9 August 2022 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 25 August 2022;
 - 5.4 **By-law 3** means the *Local Government Land By-law 2022* made by the Council on 9 August 2022 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 25 August 2022;
 - 5.5 **By-law 5** means the *Dogs By-law 2022* made by the Council on 9 August 2022 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 25 August 2022; and
 - 5.6 **By-law 7** means the *Waste Management By-law 2022* made by the Council on 9 August 2022 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 25 August 2022.

PART 2 – AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS

6. **Amendments to the Moveable Signs By-law 2022**
As and from the date that this By-law takes effect:
 - 6.1 clause 12.3.1 of By-law 2 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 12.3.1 *if, in the reasonable opinion of an authorised person, and notwithstanding compliance with this By-law, there is any hazard or obstruction or there is likely to be a hazard or obstruction arising out of the location of the moveable sign; or*
 - 6.2 clause 12.3.12 of By-law 2 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 12.3.2 *for the purpose of special events, parades, roadworks or in any other circumstances which, in the reasonable opinion of the authorised person, require relocation or removal of the moveable sign to protect public safety or to protect or enhance the amenity of a particular locality.*
7. **Amendments to the Local Government Land By-law 2022**
As and from the date that this By-law takes effect:
 - 7.1 clause 9.16 of By-law 3 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 9.16 **Donations**
Ask for or receive or indicate that the person desires a donation of money or any other thing.
 - 7.2 clause 9.25 of By-law 3 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 9.25 **Overhanging Articles**
Suspend or hang an article or object from a building, verandah, pergola, post or other structure where it might present, in the reasonable opinion of an authorised person, a nuisance or danger to a person using the land or, cause an unsightly condition.
 - 7.3 clause 10.12.5 of By-law 3 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 10.12.5 *enter any public convenience unless the person is of the gender indicated in writing or on a sign located on that facility except:*
 - 10.12.5.1 *in the case of a genuine emergency; or*
 - 10.12.5.2 *where a vulnerable person is being assisted by the vulnerable person’s caregiver, parent or guardian; or*
 - 10.12.5.3 *if the person is intersex, transgender or gender diverse; or*
 - 10.12.5.4 *if the person is a person with a disability; or*
 - 10.12.5.5 *if the person is assisting a person with a disability.*
 - 7.4 clause 11.2 of By-law 3 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 11.2 *A person who, in the reasonable opinion of an authorised person, is likely to commit or has committed, a breach of this By-law must immediately comply with a reasonable direction of an authorised person to leave that part of Local Government land.*
 - 7.5 clause 13 of By-law 3 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 13 **Removal of Animals and Objects**
An authorised person may remove an animal or object that is on Local Government land in breach of a By-law if the authorised person reasonably believes no person is in charge of the animal or object.
8. **Amendments to the Dogs By-law 2022**
 - 8.1 As and from the date that this By-law takes effect, clause 7.5 of By-law 5 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 7.5 *No dog is to be kept on any premises where, in the reasonable opinion of an authorised person, there is no secure or appropriate area where a dog may be effectively confined.*
9. **Amendments to Waste Management By-law 2022**
As and from the date that this By-law takes effect:
 - 9.1 clause 7.1 of By-law 7 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 7.1 *An occupier of premises must keep on the occupier’s premises a Domestic Waste Container and a Recyclables Container and, if directed by the Council in writing, a Green Organics Container.*

- 9.2 clause 7.2 of By-law 7 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 7.2 *An occupier of premises who has not been directed by the Council to keep a Green Organics Container on the premises may keep on the occupier's premises a Green Organics Container.*
- 9.3 clause 8.6.4 of By-law 7 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 8.6.4 *its use is, in the reasonable opinion of an authorised officer, otherwise impaired;*
- 9.4 clause 8.7.1.2(c) of By-law 7 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 (c) *if placed on a crossover, only on the part of a crossover (where it abuts the carriageway) that is closest to the edge of the crossover and not in the centre of the crossover or in any other place or manner that may be considered (in the reasonable opinion of an authorised person) to create a restriction or a danger for other pedestrians or vehicular access to the crossover; and*

This By-law was duly made and passed at a meeting of the City of Mitcham held on **20 June 2023** by an absolute majority of the members for the time being constituting the Council, there being at least two thirds of the members present.
