1—Short title

Ministerial Exemption ME9903272—Variation

TAKE NOTICE that the Ministerial exemption notice number ME9903272 in the name of Mr Adam Harman of Lateral Environmental Pty Ltd, ACN: 643 816 782, made under section 115 of the *Fisheries Management Act 2007*, dated 10 August 2023, and published in the *South Australian Government Gazette* dated 17 August 2023, on page 3031, being the first notice on that page, relating to undertaking environmental studies is hereby varied by -

- 1. Inserting "44" immediately following the word "clauses" where it occurs in the first paragraph, being a clause within schedule 6 of the *Fisheries Management (General) Regulations 2017* which the exemption holder is also exempt during the remainder of the term of the notice.
- 2. Inserting the following gear that may be used under the exemption into Schedule 1:
 - 4 x fyke nets 5 m dual wings, 600 mm hoop with 6 mm mesh
 - 6 x opera house style nets designed and constructed for the purpose of taking Yabbies oval in shape, 680 mm in length x 450 mm in width x 200 mm in height with 2 mm mesh and an exclusion ring no greater than 45 mm.
- 3. Inserting the following conditions into Schedule 3:
 - 11. All nets left unattended must be clearly marked with name and Ministerial exemption number on a tag if set close to shore or on a 2 litre buoy if set away from shore.
 - 12. All nets left unattended must be removed from the water and cleared every 16 hours.

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007

Ministerial Exemption ME9903273

TAKE NOTICE that pursuant to section 115 of the *Fisheries Management Act 2007* (the Act), Ms Leslie Morrison of Flinders University, Sturt Rd, Bedford Park (the 'exemption holder'), and her nominated agents, are exempt from Section 70 of the *Fisheries Management Act 2007* and regulation 5(a), and clause 74 of Schedule 6 of the *Fisheries Management (General) Regulations 2017* within the waters specified in Schedule 1 but only insofar as the activities undertaken are consistent with the educational activities specified in Schedule 3 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 4, from 7 September 2023 until 6 September 2024, unless varied or revoked earlier.

- Up to 6 x niskin bottles
- Up to 30 Plastic corers (4 cm and 10 cm diameter x 20 cm length).

SCHEDULE 4

- 1. The exemption holder will be deemed responsible for the conduct of all persons conducting the exempted activities under this notice. Any person conducting activities under this exemption must be provided with a copy of this notice, which they must have signed as an indication that they have read and understand the conditions under it.
- 2 Nominated agents of the Exemption Holder are teaching Staff of the College of Science and Engineering, Flinders University.
- Nominated agents may be assisted by students undertaking studies related to the courses specified in Schedule 2 at Flinders 3. University, under the conditions prescribed in this notice, providing those students are under the supervision of a nominated agent.
- 4. Any equipment used to collect fish during the exempted activity must be appropriately decontaminated prior to and after its use.
- The exemption holder or nominated agent must not cause or permit the use of more than two (2) hand-held nets by any one person 5. at any one time whilst undertaking the exempted activity.
- Any species (other than noxious species) caught pursuant to this notice that is not being collected as part of the education or 6. research program must be returned to the water as soon as practicable. Noxious species must not be returned to the water and must be disposed of appropriately.
- 7. Any protected species incidentally caught while undertaking the exempted activity must be returned to the water unencumbered as soon as reasonably practicable and cannot be retained.
- 8. The specimens collected by the exemption holder are for education or research purposes only and must not be used for any commercial purpose.
- 9. Organisms collected pursuant to this notice must not be released into waters of the State if they have been kept separate to their natural environment for any length of time.
- 10. The exemption holder or agent must not conduct any other fishing activity whilst undertaking the exempted activity.
- At least 1 hour before conducting an activity under this notice, the exemption holder or nominated agent must contact the Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA) Fishwatch on **1800 065 522** and answer a series of questions about the 11. exempted activity. The exemption holder or nominated agent will need to have a copy of this notice in their possession at the time of making the call and be able to provide information about the area and time of the exempted activity, the specific gear to be used, vehicles and/or boats involved, the number of permit holders undertaking the exempted activity and other related questions.
- The exemption holder must provide a report in writing detailing the activities carried out pursuant to this notice to PIRSA, Fisheries and Aquaculture (GPO Box 1625, ADELAIDE SA 5001) within 14 days of the activity being completed with the 12. following details:
 - the date and location of sampling;
 - the gear used;
 - the number and description of all species caught and their fate;
 - the number and description of any samples/biopsies collected;
 - any interactions with protected species and their fate; and
 - any other information regarding size, breeding or anything deemed relevant or of interest that is able to be volunteered.
- While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder and agents must be in possession of a signed copy of this notice 13. and carry their identification card issued by Flinders University. Such notice and identification must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Officer if requested.
- The exemption holder, or agent must not contravene or fail to comply with the Act or any regulations made under the Act, except 14. where specifically exempted by this notice.

This notice does not purport to override the provisions or operation of any other Act including, but not limited to, the Marine Parks Act 2007 and the River Murray Act 2003.

LIQUOR LICENSING ACT 1997

South Australia

Liquor Licensing (Dry Areas) Notice 2023 (No.1)

under section 131(1) of the Liquor Licensing Act 1997

1—Short title

This notice may be cited as the Liquor Licensing (Dry Areas) Notice 2023 (No.1).

2—Commencement

This notice comes into operation on 22 September 2023.

3—Interpretation

(1) In this notice—

principal notice means the *Liquor Licensing (Dry Areas) Notice 2015* published in the Gazette on 5.1.15, as in force from time to time.

(2) Clause 3 of the principal notice applies to this notice as if it were the principal notice.

4—Consumption etc of liquor prohibited in dry areas

- (1) Pursuant to section 131 of the Act, the consumption and possession of liquor in the area described in the Schedule is prohibited in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule.
- (2) The prohibition has effect during the periods specified in the Schedule.







Department means the Department for Infrastructure and Transport;

Federation means the Federation of Historic Motoring Clubs SA Incorporated;

MR334 form means an 'Approval for Registration of Vehicle on the Club Registration Scheme (MR334)';

Prescribed log book means a log book in a form approved by the Registrar;

Registrar means the Registrar of Motor Vehicles;

Regulations means the Motor Vehicles Regulations 2010.

4—Recognition of motor vehicles clubs

The motor vehicle clubs specified in Schedule 1 are, subject to the conditions set out in clause 5, recognised for the purposes of regulation 16 of the Regulations.

5—Conditions of recognition

A motor vehicle club specified in Schedule 1 must comply with the following conditions:

- (a) the club must maintain a constitution approved by the Registrar;
- (b) the club must nominate and have members authorised by the Registrar (authorised persons). The club's authorised person(s) are responsible for approving applicants and motor vehicles for registration under the Scheme. This includes confirming that Scheme applicants are financial members of a club; any other details as required by the Registrar on the MR334 form; and to inspect members' vehicles when requested to do so by the Registrar;
- (c) the club must issue a prescribed log book to club members for each of their vehicles to record vehicle use;
- (d) the club must cancel a member's prescribed log book when a member resigns, must ensure that a statutory declaration is provided when a member's log book is lost or destroyed, must keep details of members' prescribed log book return sheets and forward copies of the same to the Registrar or Federation annually as required;
- (e) the club must create and maintain records detailing all its financial members, its authorised persons, all vehicles for which an MR334 form has been issued, all statutory declarations received and prescribed log books issued and returned to the club;
- (f) the club must keep records for a period of 5 years from the date of the document and these records must include all duplicate MR334 forms, all records of motor vehicle inspections undertaken in accordance with paragraph (b), all statutory declarations provided by members for the purposes of paragraphs (d), all prescribed log books issued by reference to their serial number, the member's name and the vehicle for which it was issued, and to make all such records available for inspection or provide copies of the records at the request of the Registrar for audit purposes;
- (g) the club must ensure, as far as practicable, that all members comply with the Code of Practice;
- (h) the club, as far as practicable, must report to the Registrar or the Federation details of members and motor vehicles not complying with the conditions and criteria set out in the Code of Practice for the Scheme;
- (i) the club must provide to the Registrar, within 2 months after the end of the club's financial year, an annual report detailing members from that financial year with vehicles registered under the Scheme who are no longer financial members of the club;
- (j) the club must notify the Registrar, in writing, within 14 days of resolution to cease operation as a club and must provide the club records specified in paragraph (f) to the Registrar within 14 days of its dissolution.
- Note-

Under regulation 16(3)(c) of the *Motor Vehicles Regulations 2010*, the Registrar may, by notice in the Gazette, withdraw the recognition of a motor vehicle club if satisfied that the club has contravened or failed to comply with a condition applying to its recognition by the Registrar, or if there is other good cause to withdraw the recognition.



- 3.4 By-law No. 5 Dogs By-law 2022; and
- 3.5 By-law No. 6 Waste Management By-law 2022.

4. Commencement, Revocation and Expiry

 - 10.2 so required by the authorised person for the purpose of special events, parades, road or footpath works or any other circumstances which, in the reasonable opinion of the authorised person, requires relocation or removal of the moveable sign.

4.16 Donations

ask for or receive or indicate that the person desires a donation of money or any other thing.

7.1.1 any person in charge of the animal shall forthwith remove it from that land on the reasonable request of an authorised person; and

- 7.3 clause 7.1.2 of By-law 3 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 7.1.2 any authorised person may remove any animal from the land if the person fails to comply with the request, or if the authorised person reasonably believes no person is in charge of the animal.
- 7.4 clause 7.2 of By-law 3 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 7.2 An authorised person (acting reasonably) may direct any person who is considered to be committing, or has committed, a breach of this by-law to leave local government land

4.6 Donations

ask for or receive or indicate that the person desires a donation of money or any other thing.

 - 6.1 Subject to paragraphs 4 and 5, a person may enter any dog off leash area for the purpose of exercising a dog under the person's control.

- 10.4 clause 5.2.1 of By-law 6 is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 5.2.1 ensure that the recyclables container kept on the occupier's premises is approved by the Council; and

 - 10.1.5.1 in the case of a genuine emergency; or
 - 10.1.5.2 where a vulnerable person is being assisted by the vulnerable person's caregiver, parent or guardian;
 - Of 10153
 - if the person is intersex, transgender or gender diverse; or
 - 10.1.5.4 if the person is a person with a disability; or 10.1.5.5 if the person is assisting a person with a disability
 - Amendments to 'Directions' clause
