FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Laura Phipps of the District Council of Mount Barker, P.O. Box 54, Mount Barker, S.A. 5251 or persons acting as her agents (hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder') is exempt from the provisions of the Fisheries Act 1982, but only insofar as the permit holder may engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity'), using the gear specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2000.

SCHEDULE 1

The collection of native and introduced fish, including those species protected pursuant to section 42 of the Fisheries Act 1982, from the waters of Mount Barker Creek, Dawsley Creek and the Bremer River.

SCHEDULE 2

1 seine net, maximum length 2 m, minimum mesh 3 mm.

10 fish traps, maximum dimension 1 m, maximum entrance size 10 cm.

1 dab net per person.

SCHEDULE 3

1. All fish collected pursuant to this notice must be returned to the water on completion of scientific evaluation.

2. The permit holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

3. While engaging in the permitted activity, the permit holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

4. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the permit holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, persons acting as agents of Miltaburra Area School (hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder'), RSD 70, Streaky Bay, S.A. 5680 are exempt from section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, in that the permit holder shall not be guilty of an offence when engaging in the activity specified in Schedule 1, in the waters specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2000.

SCHEDULE 1

Activities involving the taking, possessing and subsequent release of aquatic organisms including specimens below the legal minimum length (not including species protected pursuant to section 42 of the Fisheries Act 1982) from the waters specified in Schedule 2 for education purposes at Miltaburra Area School.

SCHEDULE 2

South Australian marine coastal waters, including intertidal 'rocky' reef areas, adjacent to Streaky Bay.

SCHEDULE 3

1. All organisms taken by the permit holder are for display purposes only and may not be sold.
2. An employee of the Miltaburra Area School must be present at all times whilst the permit holder is conducting the permitted activity.
3. No more than five specimens of any species may be taken or possessed at any one time.
4. The permit holder must ensure that organisms taken pursuant to this notice are kept only with specimens taken from the same location.
5. All organisms released pursuant to this notice must be released as near as practicable to the point of capture.
6. Within 14 days of the collection of organisms pursuant to this notice, the permit holder must provide a report in writing to the Director of Fisheries, (Attention Roger Hill, G.P.O. Box 1625, Adelaide, S.A. 5001), giving the following details:
 - the date and time of collection;
 - the name and number of each species taken, including any mortalities resulting from collecting; and
 - details of any organisms released.
7. The permit holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by the notice.
8. Whilst engaged in the permitted activity, the permit holder must have in their possession of a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer.
9. Before collecting any organisms pursuant to this notice, the permit holder must advise a Fisheries Compliance Officer of PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture on 1800 065 522 with the following details:
 - of the proposed location of collection;
 - the proposed time and date on which the collections are to be made;
 - details of any boats which may be used in the permitted activity; and
 - the name of the authorised person conducting the permitted activity.
