FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, The Sailing Ship Trust of SA Inc., P.O. Box 222, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015 (hereinafter referred to as the 'principal exemption holder'), and the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'other exemption holders'), are exempt from the bag and boat limit provisions of Clauses 66, 77A, 77C and 77D of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, if the number of other exemption holders on the permitted boat exceeds six, subject to the conditions specified in schedule 2, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 31 October 2002, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *One & All* (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted boat') from the principal exemption holder in South Australia, for the purpose of recreational fishing.

SCHEDULE 2

1. The exemption holders may engage in the taking of no more than one half of the daily bag limit (rounded up to the nearest whole number if necessary) for each species of fish referred to in Clauses 66, 77A, 77C and 77D of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, for each exemption holder on board the permitted boat, excluding the principal exemption holder and assistants.

2. The principal exemption holder shall not use any other boat other than the permitted boat for the purpose of engaging in the exempted activity.

3. The principal exemption holder shall not accept any fish taken by the other exemption holders as all or part of the consideration for the charter agreement.

4. While engaged in the exempted activity the principal exemption holder shall have in his possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be so produced.

5. The principal exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

6. The principal exemption holder shall not cause, suffer or permit any other exemption holder to contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Michael Spurling, c/o Glenelg Fishing Charters, 1 Barcoo Road, West Beach, S.A. 5024 (hereinafter referred to as the 'principal exemption holder'), and the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'other exemption holders'), are exempt from the bag and boat limit provisions of Clauses 66, 77A, 77C and 77D of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, if the number of other exemption holders on the permitted boat exceeds six, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *Opal III* (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted boat') from the principal exemption holder in South Australia, for the purpose of recreational fishing.

SCHEDULE 2

1. The exemption holders may engage in the taking of no more than one half of the daily bag limit (rounded up to the nearest whole number if necessary) for each species of fish referred to in Clauses 66, 77A, 77C and 77D of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, for each exemption holder on board the permitted boat, excluding the principal exemption holder and assistants

2. The principal exemption holder shall not use any other boat other than the permitted boat for the purpose of engaging in the exempted activity.

3. The principal exemption holder shall not accept any fish taken by the other exemption holders as all or part of the consideration for the charter agreement.

4. While engaged in the exempted activity the principal exemption holder shall have in his possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be so produced.

5. The principal exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Troy Jantzen (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder') from the School of Biological Sciences, Flinders University of South Australia, G.P.O. Box 2100, Adelaide, S.A. 5001 is exempt from the provisions of Regulations 13 and 14 and Clause 77A of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 but only insofar as to engage in the collection of southern calamary (Sepioteuthis australis) using a hand spear whilst scuba diving (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 1 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 April 2002.

SCHEDULE 1

1. The specimens collected by the exemption holder are for scientific and research purposes only and may not be sold.

2. A maximum of 60 southern calamary may be collected pursuant to this notice, with a daily maximum of 30 fish.

3. The exempted activity may only be conducted in State coastal marine waters between Marino Rocks and Rapid Bay, excluding aquatic reserves.

4. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

5. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holders must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

6. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice. Dated 19 October 2001.
