FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007: SECTION 115

4. All non-native fish must be destroyed and disposed of appropriately.

9. The holder must post a written report to the Director of Fisheries (G.P.O. Box 1625, Adelaide S.A. 5001) immediately after undertaking the exempted activity, providing details of the location, time and conditions of the collection.

10. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Management Act 2007, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007: SECTION 115
