HIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified for general information that he has in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty The Queen, this day assented to the undermentioned Acts passed by the Legislative Council and House of Assembly in Parliament assembled, viz.:

No. 62 of 1999—An Act to provide for local government; and for other purposes.

No. 63 of 1999—An Act to regulate the conduct of local government elections; and for other purposes.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, A. Levings, or persons acting as his agents (hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder') of the School of Ecology and Environment, Deakin University, P.O. Box 423, Warrnambool, Vic. 3280, is exempt from section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, in that the permit holder shall not be guilty of an offence when possessing up to a maximum of 30 king crabs (*Pseudocarcinus gigas*) below the legal minimum length (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity') from the date of this notice until 31 October 1999.

SCHEDULE 1

1. Any king crabs (*Pseudocarcinus gigas*) taken pursuant to this notice are for research purposes only and must not be sold.

2. PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture retains the right for a departmental officer or an officer of the South Australian Research and Development Institute to observe the permitted activity at any time.

3. All king crabs (*Pseudocarcinus gigas*) taken pursuant to this notice may only be taken by the registered boats *William F. Burton* Y073, *Potential* N009, *Soul Commitment* N014 and *Eliza K* N040.

4. Whilst engaged in the permitted activity the permit holder must have in his possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a Fisheries Compliance Officer.

5. The permit holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, J. Theakstone (hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder'), P.O. Box 581, Port Lincoln, S.A. 5606, is exempt from section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, in that the permit holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking king crabs (*Pseudocarcinus gigas*) for the purpose of trade or business (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity').

SCHEDULE 1

1. This permit is valid from the date of gazettal of this notice to 31 October 1999.

2. The permit holder while engaged in the permitted activity may only haul pots on a maximum of 15 days per calendar month.

3. The permit holder must notify the Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 at least two hours prior to conducting the permitted activity.

4. The permit holder must comply with all instructions provided by the national king crab research principal investigator, Andrew Levings, concerning the recording of research data.

5. All species other than king crabs (*Pseudocarcinus gigas*) and rock lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) taken pursuant to the permitted activity must be immediately returned to the water.

6. All rock lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) taken pursuant to the permitted activity must be measured, sexed and then immediately returned to the water.

7. The permitted activity may only be conducted from the boat *Potential*, registration No. N009.

8. A maximum of 100 pots/traps may be used to conduct the permitted activity.

9. The permitted activity may only be conducted in those waters between longitude 133°30'E and longitude 132°30'E.

10. PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture retains the right for a departmental officer or an officer of the South Australian Research and Development Institute to observe the permitted activity at any time.

11. Whilst engaged in the permitted activity the permit holder must have in his possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a Fisheries Compliance Officer.

12. The permit holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, K. J. Mathison (Y073) (hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder'), P.O. Box 187, Robe, S.A. 5276, is exempt from licence condition No. 206, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, in that the permit holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking king crabs (*Pseudocarcinus gigas*) during the closed rock lobster season (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity').

SCHEDULE 1

1. This permit is valid from the date of gazettal of this notice to 31 October 1999.

2. The permit holder while engaged in the permitted activity may only haul pots on a maximum of 15 days per calendar month.

3. The permit holder must notify the Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 at least two hours prior to conducting the permitted activity.

4. The permit holder must comply with all instructions provided by the national king crab research principal investigator, Andrew Levings, concerning the recording of research data.

5. All species other than king crabs (*Pseudocarcinus gigas*) and rock lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) taken pursuant to the permitted activity must be immediately returned to the water.

6. All rock lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) taken pursuant to the permitted activity must be measured, sexed and then immediately returned to the water.

7. The permitted activity may only be conducted from the boat *Willie B*, registration No. Y073.

8. A maximum of 100 pots/traps may be used to conduct the permitted activity.

9. The permitted activity may only be conducted in those waters between longitude 135°30'E and longitude 134°30'E.

10. PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture retains the right for a departmental officer or an officer of the South Australian Research and Development Institute to observe the permitted activity at any time.

11. Whilst engaged in the permitted activity the permit holder must have in his possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a Fisheries Compliance Officer.

12. The permit holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

SCHEDULE 1

1. This permit is valid from the date of gazettal of this notice to 31 October 1999.

2. The permit holder while engaged in the permitted activity may only haul pots on a maximum of 15 days per calendar month.

3. The permit holder must notify the Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 at least two hours prior to conducting the permitted activity.

4. The permit holder must comply with all instructions provided by the national king crab research principal investigator, Andrew Levings, concerning the recording of research data.

5. All species other than king crabs (*Pseudocarcinus gigas*) and rock lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) taken pursuant to the permitted activity must be immediately returned to the water.

6. All rock lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) taken pursuant to the permitted activity must be measured, sexed and then immediately returned to the water.

7. The permitted activity may only be conducted from the boat *Soul Commitment*, registration No. N014.

8. A maximum of 100 pots/traps may be used to conduct the permitted activity.

9. The permitted activity may only be conducted in those waters between longitude 132°30'E and longitude 129°E (not including those waters of the Great Australian Bight Marine Park).

10. PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture retains the right for a departmental officer or an officer of the South Australian Research and Development Institute to observe the permitted activity at any time.

11. Whilst engaged in the permitted activity the permit holder must have in his possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a Fisheries Compliance Officer.

12. The permit holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

1. This permit is valid from the date of gazettal of this notice to 31 October 1999.

2. The permit holder while engaged in the permitted activity may only haul pots on a maximum of 15 days per calendar month.

3. The permit holder must notify the Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 at least two hours prior to conducting the permitted activity.

4. The permit holder must comply with all instructions provided by the national king crab research principal investigator, Andrew Levings, concerning the recording of research data.

5. All species other than king crabs (*Pseudocarcinus gigas*) and rock lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) taken pursuant to the permitted activity must be immediately returned to the water.

9. The permitted activity may only be conducted in those waters between longitude 134°30'E and longitude 133°30'E.

10. PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture retains the right for a departmental officer or an officer of the South Australian Research and Development Institute to observe the permitted activity at any time.

11. Whilst engaged in the permitted activity the permit holder must have in his possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a Fisheries Compliance Officer.

12. The permit holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

TAKE note that the notice made under section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, and published in the *South Australian Government Gazette* on page No. 872, dated 16 August 1999, being the third notice on that page, referring to a charter boat operator exceeding the daily bag limit, is hereby revoked.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 and William A. Browne, P.O. Box 179, Moonta, S.A. 5558 (hereinafter referred to as the 'charter boat operator') is exempt from the provisions of Clause 71AA and Clause 70 (b) of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1984, and section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, insofar as the charter boat operator may exceed the boat limits as specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3.

SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *M391* (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted boat') from the charter boat operator in South Australia, for the purpose of recreational fishing for scalefish and blue swimmer crab.

SCHEDULE 2

1. The charter boat operator may engage in the taking of no more than 20 blue swimmer crabs (*Portunus pelagicus*) per paying passenger in any one day where the number of paying passengers exceeds six.

2. The charter boat operator may engage in the taking of no more than one half of the daily bag limit (for those species of scalefish subject to such a limit as specified in the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1984) per paying passenger in any one day where the number of paying passengers exceeds five.

SCHEDULE 3

1. This exemption is valid from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2000.

2. The charter boat operator shall not use any other boat for the purpose of engaging in the permitted activity except the 'permitted boat'.

3. The charter boat operator shall not sell any blue swimmer crabs taken pursuant to this notice.

4. The charter boat operator shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

5. While engaged in the permitted activity the charter boat operator shall have in their possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be so produced.
