CONSTITUTION OF MINISTERS AS BODIES
CORPORATE; TRANSFER OF ASSETS, RIGHTS AND
LIABILITIES

Proclamation By The Governor

(L.S.) E. J. NEAL

PURSUANT to section 7 of the *Administrative Arrangements Act 1994* and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, I:

1. Dissolve the bodies corporate referred to in Schedule 1.

- (7) Vest the assets and rights and attach the liabilities of the former body corporate known as the Minister for Administrative Services or of the former body corporate known as the Minister for Information Services in the body corporate known as the Minister for Administrative and Information Services.
- (8) Transfer all the assets, rights and liabilities of the body corporate known as the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs to the body corporate known as the Minister for Transport and Urban Planning.

Proclamation By The Governor

- (b) a reference to the Minister for Minerals and Energy in a statutory instrument or any other kind of instrument, or a contract, agreement or other document (other than a reference to which paragraph (a) is applicable) will have effect as if it were a reference to the Minister for Primary Industries and Resources;
- (c) a reference to the Minister for Primary Industries in a statutory instrument under an Act will, if the Act was on 13 February 2000 committed to the administration of that Minister, have effect as if it were a reference to the Minister to whom the administration of the Act is for the time being committed;
- (d) a reference to the Minister for Primary Industries in a statutory instrument or any other kind of instrument, or a contract, agreement or other document (other than a reference to which paragraph (c) is applicable) will have effect as if it were a reference to the Minister for Primary Industries and Resources;

- (f) a reference to the Minister for Education, Children's Services and Training in a statutory instrument or any other kind of instrument, or a contract, agreement or other document (other than a reference to which paragraph (e) is applicable) will have effect as if it were a reference to the Minister for Education and Children's Services;
- (g) a reference to the Minister for Employment in an Act, a statutory instrument, any other kind of instrument, or a contract, agreement or other document will have effect as if it were a reference to the Minister for Employment and Training;
- (h) a reference to the Minister Assisting for Environment and Heritage in an Act, a statutory instrument, any other kind of instrument, or a contract, agreement or other document will have effect as if it were a reference to the Minister for Environment and Heritage;
- (i) a reference to the Minister for Year 2000 Compliance in an Act, a statutory instrument, any other kind of instrument, or a contract, agreement or other document will have effect as if it were a reference to the Premier;
- (j) a reference to the Minister for Administrative Services or the Minister for Information Services in an Act, a statutory instrument, any other kind of instrument, or a contract, agreement or other document will have effect as if it were a reference to the Minister for Administrative and Information Services;
- (k) a reference to the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs in a statutory instrument under an Act will, if the Act was on 13 February 2000 committed to the administration of that Minister, have effect as if it were a reference to the Minister to whom the administration of the Act is for the time being committed;
- (l) a reference to the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs in a statutory instrument or any other kind of instrument, or a contract, agreement or other document (other than a reference to which paragraph (k) is applicable) will have effect as if it were a reference to the Minister for Transport and Urban Planning.

Preamble

2. It is now necessary to provide for new appointments under that section.

PURSUANT to sections 9A and 11 of the *Administrative Arrangements Act 1994* and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, I—

1. Revoke the proclamation referred to in clause 1 of the preamble.

2. (1) Appoint the Minister for Tourism as a delegate Minister of the Minister for State Development.

(2) Appoint the Minister for Police, Correctional Services and Emergency Services as a delegate Minister of the Minister for Justice.

(3) Appoint the Minister for Minerals and Energy as a delegate Minister of the Minister for Primary Industries and Resources.

(4) Appoint the Minister for the Ageing and the Minister for Disability Services as delegate Ministers of the Minister for Human Services.

(5) Appoint the Minister for Administrative and Information Services and the Minister for Workplace Relations as delegate Ministers of the Minister for Government Enterprises.

(6) Appoint the Minister for Local Government and the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs as delegate Ministers of the Minister for Transport and Urban Planning.
