FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Russell K. Woodward or persons acting as his agents (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder') of Seaweed Sales Australia, 6 Kalka Crescent, Pasadena, S.A. 5042 is exempt from section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, but only insofar as he is permitted to collect and sell beach-cast seagrass/seaweed and algae material (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, in the waters specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted area').

SCHEDULE 1

1. A section of the foreshore within the low water mark and high water between Long Beach Road and Blackford Drain, Kingston SE.

2. Maria Creek outlet to Long Beach Road, Kingston SE.

SCHEDULE 2

1. The exemption holder may engage in the permitted activity from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 September 2000.

2. The exemption holder shall access the permitted area via Long Beach Road only.

3. No equipment used during the permitted activity shall be left within the permitted area at the completion of daily collection activities.

4. Only unattached beach-cast seagrass/seaweed and algae shall be harvested.

5. The method of removal shall not involve the taking of any sand. Sand taken incidental to the harvesting operations is to be returned to the foreshore.

6. No harvesting is to take place within 4 m of the toe of the foredune.

7. No material is to be stored or processed in any way on the foreshore.

8. The exemption holder must provide reports at the end of each calendar month to PIRSA Fisheries detailing for each species harvested:

- the species harvested;
- the amount harvested;
- the length of time taken to collect the species;
- the method used to process the species; and
- the use made of the species harvested.

9. The exemption holder must comply with any Local Government, State and Commonwealth legislation (including the holding of relevant planning approval) relating to the permitted activity.

10. While engaged in the permitted activity the exemption holder shall carry or have about or near his person a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer upon request.

11. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

4. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

5. Whilst engaged in the permitted activity, the exemption holder must have in their possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer.

6. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Boston Shellfish Pty Ltd (ACN 086 043 530), or persons acting as their agents (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), Tally-Ho-Too, Pine Freezer Road, Port Lincoln, S.A. 5606 are exempt from the provisions of sections 50 and 53 of the Fisheries Act 1982, insofar as they may engage in activities and do the acts specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted use') during the times specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3, from the waters specified in Schedule 4 (hereinafter referred to as the 'site').

SCHEDULE 1

The deposit, and subsequent removal and sale of southern rock lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted species'), into cages located in the area of water specified in Schedule 4, for the purpose of conducting research and development into their farming.

SCHEDULE 2

This permit is valid until 2400 hours on 30 June 2001.

SCHEDULE 3

1. The exemption holder must not farm or introduce any species at the site other than the permitted species.

2. The exemption holder must not use the site for any purpose other than the permitted use.

3. The exemption holder must ensure that the site is maintained in a good, tidy and safe condition to the satisfaction of the Minister for Primary Industries Natural Resources and Regional Development (hereinafter referred to as the 'Minister').

4. The exemption holder must remove and lawfully dispose of any waste or debris on the site as soon as is reasonably practicable and in particular must comply with any instructions issued from time to time by the Minister or an officer acting on behalf in relation to the removal from the site of any unhealthy or dead fish.

5. The exemption holder must mark the site boundary in accordance with any requirements of the Harbors and Navigation Act 1993 or other applicable Acts.

6. The exemption holder must at all times permit the Minister, his employees, agents or contactors or any employees, agents or contractors of the Crown to enter the site for any purposes of inspecting the site, the sea floor and the flora and fauna on or in the vicinity of the site.

7. The exemption holder must comply with all reasonable directions of any such person authorised by the Minister to inspect the conduct of the exemption holder's activities at the site.

8. The exemption holder must at all times comply with all laws, by-laws or regulations in force which relate to the site or the activities conducted in the site and with all notices, orders or requirements lawfully given or made by any authority or authorities in respect of the site.

9. The exemption holder must not do or permit to be done in upon or about the site anything which in the opinion of the Minister would cause or contribute to the degradation or pollution of any coastal land or the surrounding marine environment.

10. The exemption holder must maintain a Stock Movement Register for all of the permitted species introduced onto the site. The information must be recorded in sufficient detail so as to identify:

- the provider of each batch of stock, including the name and signature of the exemption holder or the exemption holder's delegate;
- all movements of stock onto and removed from the site;
- the date on which the stock was placed on or removed from the site;
- the numbers of stock moved on each occasion;
- mortalities of stock;
- the number of stock held on the site at the first day of every month.

11. The exemption holder must ensure the Stock Movement Register is written in ink in a bound book with consecutively numbered pages, each entry must be made immediately below the previous entry and each page must be filled before commencing the next page.

12. The exemption holder must keep the Stock Movement Register for 12 months from the date of last entry. A photocopy of the Register must be forwarded to PIRSA Fisheries Aquaculture Compliance on or before 30 June 2001.

13. The exemption holder must not use chemicals or drugs for therapeutic or prophylactic purposes except with the prior approval of the Minister.

14. In the event that the Minister is satisfied, on reasonable grounds, that the fish taken from the waters are not fit for human consumption or that consumption of fish taken from the waters could present a danger to the health of the consumer, the exemption holder must, in accordance with a written notice from the Minister, cease or suspend the conduct of the permitted use or else conduct the permitted use as directed within the notice.

15. The exemption holder must at all times indemnify the Minister, his officers, employees, contractors and agents from and against all claims, demands, actions, judgements, proceedings, damages, losses, costs, charges and expenses in respect of any loss of life, personal injury and/or damage to the property caused or suffered in any manner in or about the site.

16. The Minister may terminate this permit immediately by notice in writing served on the exemption holder.

17. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically permitted by this notice.

18. The exemption holder must retain a copy of this permit which has been supplied by the Minister, and if requested by a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Officer, produce that permit for inspection.

5. The fish farmer must check all farm stock every 24 hours for mortalities.

6. The fish farmer must report all notifiable diseases to the General Manager Aquaculture.

7. The fish farmer must notify the General Manager Aquaculture of a mortality rate over 5% in 24 hours.

8. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically permitted by this notice.

9. The exemption holder must retain the copy of this permit which has been supplied by the Director of Fisheries, and if requested by a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer, produce that permit for inspection.
