FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Helen Tassie, Education Officer of the Malacological Society of South Australia Inc. (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), c/o Marine Invertebrates Section, South Australian Museum, North Terrace, Adelaide, S.A. 5000, or her agents are exempt from the provisions of clause 63D of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1984, to engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 2 from 27 October 2000 to 31 October 2000 inclusive.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that, pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, N. D. and W. P. Ramsey of Clean Seas Aquaculture Pty Ltd (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), P.O. Box 80, Arno Bay, S.A. 5603 is exempt from the Fisheries Act 1982, insofar as they may take yellowtail kingfish (*Seriola lalandi*) for the purpose of aquaculture broodstock in the waters specified in Schedule 1 subject to the conditions in Schedule 2 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity') from date of gazettal of this notice until 30 September 2000.

SCHEDULE 1

South Australian coastal marine waters of Spencer Gulf north of latitude 32°48.54'S except for areas gazetted as aquatic reserves.

SCHEDULE 2

1. The exemption holder may take a maximum of 30 yellowtail kingfish (*Seriola lalandi*). All yellowtail kingfish taken pursuant to this notice may not be sold or transferred to another party.

2. The exempted activity may only be conducted by Craig Edwards, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M128.

3. All yellowtail kingfish taken pursuant to this notice must be kept on the registered aquaculture site of Land Based Aquaculture Licence No. FT00560.

3. The exemption holder shall notify the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 at least 24 hours prior to conducting the exempted activity with the following information:

- details of the boat that will be used to engage in the exempted activity;
- the name of the person who will be conducting the exempted activity;
- the intended place and time of launching and retrieval of the nominated boat for that day; and
- the intended area of conducting the exempted activity.

4. The exemption holder shall record the number of wild broodstock held pursuant to this notice in a register to be maintained at the registered aquaculture site, which must be made available for inspection by a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer upon request.

5. PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit retains the right for a departmental officer to accompany the fisher at any time during the exempted activity.

6. While engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder shall carry or have about or near his person a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer upon request.

7. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
