*Proclamation By The Governor*

*Preamble*

1. The following land is, for the purposes of section 18 of the Act, adjacent or subjacent land belonging to the Minister that is within a harbor:

Area B in General Registry Office Plan No. 820 of 2000.

2. Part of the land is within the area of The District Council of Robe.

3. Unless otherwise provided by proclamation, adjacent and subjacent land and structures situated on that land (other than land and structures in private ownership) within a harbor are under the care, control and management of the Minister: *see* section 18(4) of the Act.

4. It is proposed that the land referred to in clause 1 and any structure belonging to the Minister on that land be placed under the care, control and management of The District Council of Robe.

5. The District Council of Robe has been consulted and given an opportunity to make representations on the matter.

#### UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

#### BY-LAWS MADE UNDER THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA 1990

##### *Amended By-law 5*

5.1 No person shall drive a vehicle within the University grounds:

- (i) at a speed exceeding 15 km/h with the exception of University Boulevard at Mawson Lakes Campus where the speed will not exceed 40 km/h;
- (ii) on a road on which a notice is erected stating a speed limit, at a speed exceeding that so stated;
- (iii) negligently or without reasonable consideration for other persons in the vicinity; or
- (iv) in such a manner as to cause undue noise.

##### *Amended By-law 7*

7.1 No person shall on University grounds:

- (i) use any indecent language or be guilty of any offensive or disorderly conduct on (the) University grounds;
- (ii) be guilty of any offensive or disorderly conduct which hinders or interferes with any activities lawfully conducted on the University grounds;
- (iii) disrupt any teaching activity, examination or official meeting or proceeding of the University; or
- (iv) throw, place, deposit, or leave on the University grounds, any rubbish, refuse, paper, bottles or glass (broken or otherwise) or any litter of any kind or nature whatsoever.

7.2 An authorised person may remove from the University grounds any person who commits an offence against By-law 7.1.

7.3 A person who commits an offence against By-law 7.1 shall not enter or re-enter the University grounds without the prior approval of council or its delegate.

(In relation to 7.2, 'authorised persons' are members of senior management, security staff, campus service managers, site services managers and Director/Managers of Units with University-wide responsibilities authorised as stipulated by delegated power of the Vice Chancellor).

*New By-law 14*

- 14.1 Where it appears necessary to the council or its delegate, for the purpose of maintaining good order on the University grounds or to protect property or to prevent the hindrance to or interference with any activities conducted on the University grounds, the council or its delegate may bar any person from entering upon or remaining in the vicinity of the University grounds, upon such terms and for such period as determined by the council or its delegate.
- 14.2 Any person who contravenes or knowingly fails to obey a determination made pursuant to By-law 14.1 shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty in an amount from time to time determined by the council for that purpose and to pay compensation for any damage.
- 14.3 Any student of the University who is refused entry to University grounds pursuant to By-law 7.3 or is the subject of a determination pursuant to By-law 14.1 shall be dealt with pursuant to the provisions of Statute No. 7 of the Statutes of the University within 14 days of their removal from the University grounds or a determination being made.
