

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to Section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Robert J. Butson (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), 15 Mine Street, Port Wakefield, S.A. 5550, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M070, is exempt from the provisions of section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Regulation 5 and Paragraph 37 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holder may use a fish net specified in Schedule 1 for the purpose of trade or business in waters greater than 5 m in depth (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity') specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions in Schedule 3 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002.

SCHEDULE 1


One floating hauling net or purse seine net not exceeding 600 m in length and 160 meshes in depth, and with a mesh size of not less than 3 cm.

SCHEDULE 2

The waters of Gulf St Vincent and Investigator Strait within blocks 34, 35, 36, 43 and 44 as defined in the South Australian Commercial Fishing Summary Sheets.

SCHEDULE 3

1. The exemption holder may only conduct the exempted activity from a boat registered on Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M070.
2. The exemption holder must provide separate statistical catch and effort information, in the form of a daily log, with details of fishing conducted pursuant to the exempted activity.
3. PIRSA Fisheries Compliance retains the right for a departmental officer to accompany the exemption holder at any time while engaged in the exempted activity.
4. Whilst engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must have in his possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer.
5. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulation made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

TAKE notice that Roderick Matthew (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), 28 North Street, Port Wakefield, S.A. 5550, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M309, is exempt from the provisions of section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Regulation 5 and Clause 37 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holder may use a fish net specified in Schedule 1 for the purpose of trade or business in waters greater than 5 m in depth (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity') specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions in Schedule 3 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002.


One floating hauling net or purse seine net not exceeding 600 m in length and 160 meshes in depth, and with a mesh size of not less than 3 cm.

SCHEDULE 2

The waters of Gulf St Vincent and Investigator Strait within blocks 34, 35, 36, 43 and 44 as defined in the South Australian Commercial Fishing Summary Sheets.

SCHEDULE 3

1. The exemption holder may only conduct the exempted activity from a boat registered on Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M309.
2. PIRSA Fisheries retains the right for a departmental officer or an officer of the South Australian Research and Development Institute to accompany the exemption holder at any time while engaged in the exempted activity.
3. The exemption holder must provide separate statistical catch and effort information, in the form of a daily log, with details of fishing conducted pursuant to the exempted activity.
4. Whilst engaged in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must have in his possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer.
5. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulation made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to Section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Kenneth J. Sincok (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), 63 Wells Street, Streaky Bay, S.A. 5680, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M499, is exempt from the provision of Clause 61, Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking up to 150 razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) in any one day, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from South Australian coastal marine waters from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002.

SCHEDULE 1

1. All razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken pursuant to this notice shall be used for bait only.

2. The total number of razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken in any one day, shall be no greater than one hundred and fifty.

3. The exemption holder must include all razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken under this permit on his monthly catch and effort summary provided to the South Australian Research and Development Institute (SARDI).

4. Whilst engaged in the collection activity the exemption holder must have in or about his possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer forthwith, if and when an officer requests the exemption holder to produce it.

5. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Mario Georgaris (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), 25 Richard Avenue, Mitchell Park, S.A. 5043, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M171, is exempt from the provision of Clause 61 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, in that the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking up to 150 razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) in any one day, from South Australian coastal marine waters from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002.

SCHEDULE 1

1. All razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken shall be used for bait only.

2. The total number of razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken in any one day, shall be no greater than one hundred and fifty.

3. The exemption holder must include all razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken under this permit on his monthly catch and effort summary provided to the South Australian Research and Development Institute (SARDI).

4. Whilst engaged in the collection activity the exemption holder must have in or about his possession a copy of this notice and produce that notice to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer forthwith, if and when an officer requests the exemption holder to produce it.

5. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

TAKE notice that that pursuant to Section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Victor Bell (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), P.O. Box 131, Kingscote, S.A. 5223, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M104, is exempt from the provisions of section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking undersized fish of the species cockles (*Katelysia*

spp.), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002.

SCHEDULE 1

1. The exemption holder may engage in the following fishing activity (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity') namely the taking of undersized fish as specified in Schedule 2, within those waters specified in Schedule 3.

2. Any fish taken by the exemption holder pursuant to this notice must be used for bait only and must not be sold.

3. While engaged in the exempted activity, the exemption holder shall carry or have about or near his person a copy of this notice and must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer upon request.

4. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulation made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

The waters in the vicinity of Kingscote bounded as follows:

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Peter Bell (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), P.O. Box 298, Kingscote, S.A. 5223, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M040, is exempt from the provisions of section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking undersized fish of the species cockles (*Katelysia spp.*) (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), within those waters specified in Schedule 1, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002.

2. Any fish taken by the exemption holder pursuant to this notice must be used for bait only and must not be sold.

3. While engaged in the exempted activity, the exemption holder shall carry or have about or near his person, a copy of this notice and must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer upon request.

4. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulation made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, David G. Ayres (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), P.O. Box 366, Victor Harbor, S.A. 5211, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M206, is exempt from the provisions of Regulation 9 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when using up to a maximum of 1 000 octopus traps for the purpose of trade or business pursuant to Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M206 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1 from the date of this notice until 30 June 2002.

SCHEDULE 1

1. Octopus pots must be marked with a white buoy which complies with the regulations, and bear a 50 mm red stripe around its circumference, so as to be visible above the water.

2. Octopus pots must not be baited and must not have doors.

3. A monthly catch and effort return for octopus must be completed and sent to the South Australian Research and Development Institute (SARDI) within 15 days of the end of each month for which the return is completed.

4. Whilst engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must have in his possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer.

5. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.
