## DETERMINATION OF THE REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

NO. 1 OF 2002

MINISTERS OF THE CROWN AND OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT

1. *Scope of Determination*

This Determination applies to the undermentioned Ministers of the Crown and Officers and Members of Parliament.

2. *Electorate Allowances for Members*

(1) There shall be payable to a member in respect of the expenses of discharging duties in the electoral district the member represents, an electorate allowance at the following annual rate:

(2) The electorate allowance payable to a member under paragraph (1) of this clause shall, in the case of a member elected after 9 February 2002, be calculated from the day on which he or she commences to be a member, but in the case of those who are already members on 9 February 2002, shall be calculated from 9 February 2002, and except as provided by paragraph (3) of this clause, shall cease to be payable on the day from which such person ceases to be a member.

(3) A former member of Parliament shall be deemed to continue as a member of the Parliament until a successor is elected in his or her place.

3. *Expense Allowances of Ministers of the Crown*

(1) The Minister for the time being holding an office listed below shall be paid an expense allowance as follows:

(b) Deputy Premier.....	6 900
(c) Leader of Government in the Legislative Council .....	6 550
(d) Minister (other than a Minister holding an office listed in (a) to (c) of this paragraph).....	5 750

(2) If a person holds more ministerial offices than one, he or she shall be paid an expense allowance under this paragraph in respect of one only of those offices.

#### 4. Expense Allowances of Officers of Parliament

(1) The person for the time being holding an office listed below shall be paid an expense allowance as follows:

<b>A. House of Assembly</b>	
(a) Speaker .....	3 250
(b) Chairman of Committees .....	1 640
(c) Leader of the Opposition .....	5 750
(d) Deputy Leader of the Opposition .....	1 820
<b>B. Legislative Council</b>

(b) Leader of the Opposition .....	1 820

(2) If immediately before ceasing to be a member of the Parliament the former member held an office mentioned in subparagraphs A (a), A (b) or B (a) or was a person referred to in any of subparagraphs A (c), A (d) or B (b) of paragraph (1) the former member shall be deemed to continue in that office until:

- (a) a successor is elected as a member in his or her place; or
- (b) the office is filled by someone other than the former member,

whichever first occurs.

#### 5. Country Member's Accommodation Allowance

A member of either House of Parliament (including a Minister of the Crown or the Leader of the Opposition in the House of Assembly) whose usual place of residence is more than 75 km by road from the General Post Office at Adelaide and who is required to stay in Adelaide overnight in order to attend not only to Parliamentary duties but also to the member's duty to be actively involved in community affairs and to represent and assist constituents in dealings with governmental and other public agencies and authorities, shall be paid an accommodation allowance up to one hundred and fifty-eight dollars (\$158) for each such night up to a maximum of twenty-one thousand three hundred and thirty dollars (\$21 330) in each twelve month period, the first such period commencing from 1 July 2000.

#### 6. Travelling and Accommodation Allowances

(1) A Minister who actually incurs expenditure when travelling on official business shall be paid:

- (a) outside the metropolitan area, as defined by the Development Plan published pursuant to Part 4 of the Planning Act 1982, but within the State—up to one hundred and seventy-five dollars (\$175) per day;
- (b) Interstate—up to three hundred and twenty-three dollars (\$323) per day for Sydney and up to three hundred and eleven dollars (\$311) per day for places other than Sydney;
- (c) any extra expenditure necessarily incurred in addition to the allowances provided in (a) and (b) above.

(2) The allowances provided by this clause shall also be payable to the Leader of the Opposition who actually incurs expenditure when travelling on official business, and to the Deputy Leader of the Opposition when he or she deputises, at the Leader's request, for the Leader of the Opposition in his or her official capacity.

#### 7. Date of Operation

The provisions of this Determination, which supersede those of all preceding Determinations, with the exception of Clause 5 which shall operate from 1 July 2000, shall operate from 9 February 2002.

#### DEVELOPMENT ACT 1993, SECTION 48: DECISION BY THE DEVELOPMENT ASSESSMENT COMMISSION AS DELEGATE OF THE GOVERNOR

##### Preamble

1. The decision of the Governor under section 48 of the Development Act 1993, to approve the development of Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development located adjacent to Chappell Drive, Glenelg was published in the *Government Gazette* on 8 June 2000.

2. An amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development was subsequently considered and approved by the Development Assessment Commission and published in the *Government Gazette* on 7 December 2000.

3. A further amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development was subsequently considered and approved by the Development Assessment Commission and published in the *Government Gazette* on 1 March 2001.

4. Another further amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development was subsequently considered and approved by the Development Assessment Commission and published in the *Government Gazette* on 17 May 2001.

5. A subsequent amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development has now been under consideration under Division 2 of Part 4 of the Development Act 1993.

6. The proposed amendments include:

- (a) an increase in café/restaurant seats;
- (b) the inclusion of outdoor seating;
- (c) an increase in bar area;
- (d) a decrease in lounge areas;
- (e) a decrease in function areas;
- (f) a marginally smaller winter garden lounge;
- (g) a smaller coffee shop area;
- (h) minor changes to the house layout and circulation areas; and
- (i) the provision of an accessway on the eastern façade at the northern end.

7. The amendments to the development are contained in:

- (a) the letter from Woodhead International on behalf of the Holdfast Shores Consortium to the Development Assessment Commission dated 26 November 2001;
- (b) the report entitled 'Holdfast Shores Stage 2—Pier Hotel Ground Floor Variations' prepared by Master Plan SA Pty Ltd dated November 2001;
- (c) the letters on 'Car parking review of amendment nos 2/3 with a variation including the final layout of ground floor' from Murray F. Young and Associates dated 21 November 2001 and 13 December 2001; and
- (d) the following plan prepared by Terence R. Feltus Architect:
  - Ground Floor Fit-out Plan supplementary plan SP64 amendments dated 20 November 2001.

8. The Development Assessment Commission has, in considering the application, had regard to all relevant matters under section 48 (5) of the Development Act 1993.

9. The Development Assessment Commission is satisfied that the amendments do not require the preparation of a further or amended Development Report.

##### Decision

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Development Act 1993, the Development Assessment Commission, as delegate of the Governor, grants development approval to the amended Holdfast Shores Stage 2A proposal located adjacent to Chappell Drive, Glenelg for a hotel, car parking, landscaping and associated works, subject to conditions.

*Conditions of approval*

1. The Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development must be undertaken in accordance with:

(a) the following plans contained in the Development Report dated December 1999, as they relate to the proposals for Stage 2A, except to the extent that they are varied by the plans described in paragraphs (c), (d) (e) and (f):

- Site plan, Plan 5;
- Pedestrian movement, Plan 7;
- Vehicular movement, Plan 8;
- Urban spaces, Plan 9;
- Hotel environs study, Plan 18;
- Public art Masterplan, Plan 21; and
- Hotel: landscaping plan, Plan 36; and

(b) the following plans contained in the report from Woodhead International and Masterplan to Planning SA (a branch of the Department of Transport, Urban Planning and the Arts) dated 25 February 2000, except to the extent that they are varied by the plans described in paragraphs (c) and (d):

- Revised hotel plaza plan, supplementary plan SP6, dated February 2000;
- Revised hotel plaza section, supplementary plan SP7, dated February 2000;
- Revised hotel plaza details, supplementary plan SP8, dated February 2000;
- Bridge—plan, elevation and details, supplementary plan SP23, dated February 2000;
- West plaza level detail, supplementary plan SP30, dated February 2000;
- East plaza level detail, supplementary plan SP31, dated February 2000;
- Open space/vegetation, supplementary plan SP32, dated December 1999; and
- Amended dining room window, supplementary plan SP33, dated December 1999; and

(c) the following plans except that they are varied by the plans described in paragraph (d):

- Hotel undercroft plan, supplementary plan SP34 Rev. A, dated 27 March 2000;
- Hotel plaza plan, supplementary plan SP35 Rev. A, dated 27 March 2000;
- Temporary carpark option 1, supplementary plan SP36, undated;
- Temporary toilets, supplementary plan SP39, dated 27 March 2000;
- Hotel western edge, plan detail, supplementary plan SP40A, dated April 2000; and
- Hotel western edge, section details, supplementary plan SP41A, dated April 2000; and

(d) the following plans except that they are varied by the plans described in paragraph (e):

- Perspective, supplementary plan SP42 dated 15 November 2000;
- Site Coverage Comparison: Original Masterplan and Amended Plan, supplementary plan SP50 dated 15 November 2000;
- Site Coverage Comparison: Approved Plan and Amended Plan, supplementary plan SP51 dated 15 November 2000;
- Traffic Circulation Diagram, supplementary plan SP52 dated 15 November 2000; and
- Eastern Plaza: Urban Design Amendments, supplementary plan SP53 dated 15 November 2000; and

(e) the following plans except that they are varied by the plans described in paragraph (f):

- Car Park Floor Plan supplementary plan SP55 dated 2 February 2001;

- Ground Floor Plan supplementary plan SP56 dated 2 February 2001;
- First, Second, Third, Fourth Floor Plans supplementary plan SP57 dated 2 February 2001;
- Fifth, Sixth, Seventh Roof Plans supplementary plan SP58 dated 2 February 2001;
- Elevations supplementary plan SP59 dated 2 February 2001;
- Elevations supplementary plan SP60 dated 2 February 2001;
- Sections supplementary plan SP61 dated 2 February 2001; and
- Supplementary plan SP62 dated 16 February 2001; and

(f) the following plan except that it is varied by the plans described in paragraph (g):

- Ground Floor Fit-out Plan supplementary plan SP64 amendment A dated 20 November 2001; and

(g) the following plan:

- Map Reference 6628-50-j and h dated 10 May 2001 by Alexander Symonds;

(h) the following documents except to the extent that they are varied by the plans described in paragraphs (a) to (g) inclusive:

- facsimiles dated 3 March 2000, 20 March 2000 and 22 March 2000, from Woodhead International to Planning SA (a branch of the Department of Transport, Urban Planning and the Arts);
- the reports dated 25 February 2000, 28 February 2000, 29 February 2000, 14 March 2000 and 4 April 2000, from Woodhead International and Masterplan to Planning SA (a branch of the Department of Transport, Urban Planning and the Arts);
- the two reports dated 18 April 2000, from Woodhead International to Planning SA (a branch of the Department of Transport, Urban Planning and the Arts);
- the letters from Murray Young and Associates, traffic consultants, to Woodhead International dated 3 April 2000, 14 April 2000, 28 April 2000 and 9 November 2000;
- the letter from Woodhead International to the Development Assessment Commission dated 10 November 2000;
- the report entitled 'Holdfast Shores Stage 2. Hotel and Associated Facilities Amendment Report' prepared by Master Plan SA Pty Ltd dated November 2000;
- the letter from Woodhead International to the Development Assessment Commission dated 31 January 2001;
- the report entitled 'Holdfast Shores Stage 2—Hotel and Associated Facilities Amendment Report 2' prepared by Master Plan SA Pty Ltd dated February 2001;
- the 'Car Parking Review of Amendment 2' from Murray F. Young and Associates dated February 2001 and 12 February 2001;
- the letter from Woodhead International to the Development Assessment Commission dated 26 November 2001;
- the report entitled 'Holdfast Shores Stage 2—Pier Hotel Ground Floor Variations' prepared by Master Plan SA Pty Ltd dated November 2001; and
- the letters from Murray Young and Associates, traffic consultants, to Woodhead International dated 21 November 2001 and 13 December 2001.

2. No works may be commenced unless and until:

- (a) a private certifier or the City of Holdfast Bay has certified to the Development Assessment Commission that all work that constitutes building work under the Development Act 1993, complies with the Building Rules;

- (b) an Environmental Management Plan (EMP) has been prepared in consultation with the Environment Protection Authority and the City of Holdfast Bay to address the management issues during construction. Matters to be addressed in the EMP must include:
- traffic management during construction, including transport beyond the development site;
  - control and management of construction noise;
  - dust and mud control;
  - working hours;
  - stormwater management during construction;
  - site security and fencing;
  - disposal of building waste and refuse;
  - protection and cleaning of roads and pathways;
  - site clean up; and
- (c) adherence to all relevant Environment Protection Authority codes of practice for construction sites.

3. The hotel must not be used or occupied for the purposes outlined in the application until:

- (a) all car parks proposed for Stage 2A have been established in accordance with the plans listed in Condition 1 (e);
- (b) plans for street furniture and directional signs for Stage 2A (including siting, elevations and materials) have been prepared by the proponent to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission in consultation with the City of Holdfast Bay;
- (c) plans for public art for Stage 2A in accordance with plan 21 entitled 'Public Art Masterplan' and dated December 1999 (including siting, elevations and materials) have been prepared by the proponent to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission in consultation with the City of Holdfast Bay;
- (d) lighting of all external areas has been provided to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission to ensure the safety of users of the pedestrian paths and plazas; and
- (e) (i) plans for the drainage of stormwater from the Stage 2A site (including siting, elevations and materials) have been prepared by the proponent to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission in consultation with the City of Holdfast Bay;
- (ii) stormwater infrastructure has been installed in accordance with the plans prepared pursuant to condition 3 (e) (i) to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission in consultation with the City of Holdfast Bay; and
- (iii) stormwater infrastructure is operational.

4. Street furniture and directional signs for the Stage 2A development must be established in accordance with the plans prepared pursuant to condition 3 (b) within six months of the first occupation of the hotel to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission.

5. Public art for the Stage 2A development must be established in accordance with the plans prepared pursuant to condition 3 (c) within six months of the first occupation of the hotel to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission.

6. The car parking areas must be designed in accordance with Australian Standards 2890.1-1993 and line markings must be maintained in good and substantial condition at all times.

7. The pedestrian paths and plazas proposed in the application, including the area situated between the existing Glenelg Surf Life Saving Club and the hotel building, must be open for pedestrian use from the commencement of use and occupation of the hotel and must then be kept open for pedestrian use at all times.

*By-law No. 4—Dogs*

TO limit the number of dogs kept on premises and for the management of dogs in the council's area.

*Definitions*

1. In this by-law:

- (1) 'Dog' has the same meaning as in the Dog and Cat Management Act 1995.
- (2) 'Small dwelling' means a flat, a serviced flat, home unit, strata unit, community lot, or a suite of rooms which is wholly occupied, or designed or intended to be occupied, as a separate dwelling, but does not include a detached, semi-detached or row dwelling house.
- (3) 'Detached dwelling', 'row dwelling' and 'semi-detached dwelling' have the same meanings as in Schedule 1 of the Development Regulations 1993.
- (4) 'Dog and Cat Management Officer' is a person appointed by council as such, pursuant to the Dog and Cat Management Act 1995.
- (5) 'Approved kennel establishment' means a building, structure or area approved by relevant authority; pursuant to the Development Act 1993, for the keeping of dogs on a temporary or permanent basis.
- (6) 'Guide dog' means a dog used for guiding a person who is wholly or partially blind, or wholly or partially deaf and that has undergone the accredited training.

*Limit on Dog Numbers*

2. (1) The limit on the number of dogs kept shall be:

- (a) in a small dwelling, one dog;  
 (b) in premises other than a small dwelling, two dogs.

(2) No person shall, without obtaining written permission of the council, keep any dog on any premises where the number of dogs exceeds the limit:

- (a) unless the premises is an approved kennel establishment; or  
 (b) the council has exempted any premises from compliance with paragraph 2 of this by-law by the granting of an exemption.

*Existing Dogs*

3. Paragraph 2 does not stop a person from continuing to keep a dog at the addresses at which that dog was registered immediately before the commencement of this by-law.

*Dog Free Areas*

4. (1) No person shall, in a place to which this paragraph applies, cause, suffer or permit any dog (except a guide dog), under that persons control or authority to be or remain in that place.

(2) Signs shall be erected to denote land to which this paragraph applies.

*Dogs on Leashes*

5. (1) No person shall, in a place to which this paragraph applies, cause, suffer or permit any dog under that person's control, charge or authority to be or remain in a place unless such dog is restrained by a strong leash not exceeding 2 m in length and either tethered securely to a fixed object or held by a person capable of controlling the dog and preventing it from being a nuisance or danger to other persons.

(2) Signs shall be erected to denote land to which this paragraph applies.

*Dog Exercise Areas*

6. (1) Any person may enter upon any part of local government land to which this paragraph applies for the purpose of exercising a dog under his or her control.

(2) Where a person enters upon such part of local government land for that purpose, he or she shall ensure that the dog or dogs under his or her control remain under effective control (within the meaning of the Dog and Cat Management Act 1995) while on that land.

(3) Signs shall be erected to denote land to which this paragraph applies.

*Application of Paragraphs*

7. Paragraphs 4, 5 and 6 of this by-law shall apply only in such portion or portions of the area as the council may by resolution direct (in accordance with section 246 (3) (e) of the Local Government Act 1999).

##### *By-Law No. 3—Streets and Roads*

FOR the management, regulation and control of activities on streets and roads.

##### *Definitions*

1. In this by-law:

- (1) 'Authorised Person' means a person appointed an authorised person pursuant to Section 260 of the Local Government Act 1999.
- (2) 'Emergency Vehicle' has the same meaning as in the Australian Road Rules 1999 and the Road Traffic (Road Rules—Ancillary and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 1999.
- (3) 'Road' has the same meaning as in the Local Government Act 1999.

##### *Activities Requiring Permission*

2. No person shall without permission on any street or road:

##### *Work on Vehicles*

- (1) perform the work of repairing, washing, painting, panel beating or other work of any nature on or to any vehicle, except for running repairs in the case of a breakdown;

##### *Preaching*

- (2) preach or harangue;

##### *Donations*

- (3) Ask for or receive or indicate that he or she desires a donation of money or any other thing;

##### *Amplification*

- (4) use an amplifier or other device whether mechanical or electrical for the purposes of amplifying sound or broadcasting announcements or advertising;

##### *Canvassing*

- (5) Convey any advertising, religious or other message to any bystander, passerby or other person except for any message or material conveyed for the purpose of a Local, State or Federal election;

##### *Posting of Bills etc*

- (6) Post any bills, advertisements or other papers or items on a building or structure on a street or road;

##### *Movement of Animals on Roads*

- (7) (a) The owner or person in charge of any cattle or horses that are driven over, across or along any road in any town or township, shall forthwith after such animals have completed their passage remove any dung left by those animals during their passage;
- (b) The person responsible for looking after any cattle, sheep, goats, horses or other farm animals (but not dogs or cats) shall ensure that any of those animals do not move across, along or on any road unattended.

##### *Removal of Animals and Persons*

3. (1) If any animal is found on any part of a road in breach of a by-law:

- (a) Any person in charge of the animal shall forthwith remove it from that part on the request of an authorised person; and
- (b) An authorised person may remove it if the person fails to comply with the request, or if no person is in charge of the animal.

(2) An authorised person may direct any person who is considered to be committing or has committed a breach of this by-law to leave that part of the road. Failure to comply with that direction forthwith is a breach of this by-law.

#### *Exemptions*

4. The restrictions in this by-law do not apply to any Police Officer, Council Officer or employee acting in the course and within the scope of that person's normal duties, or to a contractor while performing work for the Council and while acting under the supervision of a Council Officer, or an emergency worker when driving an Emergency Vehicle.

#### *Construction*

5. This by-law is subject to any Act of Parliament and Regulations made thereunder.

#### *By-Law No. 4—Local Government Land*

FOR the management and regulation of activities and access to local government land vested in or under the control of council (except streets and roads).

#### *Definitions*

1. In this by-law:

- (1) 'Emergency Vehicle' has the same meaning as in the Australian Road Rules 1999 and the Road Traffic (Road Rules—Ancillary and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 1999;
- (2) 'local government land' means land owned by the council or under the council's care, control and management (except streets and roads);
- (3) 'the Council' means the Light Regional Council;
- (4) 'authorised person' as defined in the Local Government Act 1999.

#### *Activities requiring permission*

2. No person shall without permission on any local government land:

#### *Vehicles Generally*

- (1) (a) being the driver of a vehicle, fail to obey the indications given by any sign erected by or with the authority of the Council, for regulating traffic or indicating the direction or route to be followed by traffic on that land;

- (b) drive or propel a vehicle on any part thereof where the Council has excluded vehicles generally, or of that class, pursuant to Section 359 of the Local Government Act 1934;

#### *Vehicles on parklands and cemeteries*

- (2) comprising a cemetery or parkland or reserve;
  - (a) drive or propel a vehicle thereon, (except a wheelchair), unless on an area, path, or road constructed or set aside by the Council for the parking or travelling of that kind of vehicle;
  - (b) promote, organise or take part in any race, test or trial of any kind in which motor vehicles, motor cycles, motor scooters or bicycles take part (except in parklands or a reserve on a properly constructed area for the purpose);

#### *Trading*

- (3) (a) carry on the business of buying, selling, offering or exposing for sale or the hiring or leasing of any goods, merchandise, commodity, article, service or thing (including any vehicle, watercraft or aircraft); or
- (b) set up a van or other vehicle or stall or other structure, tray, carpet or device for the purpose of buying, selling, offering or exposing for sale or the hiring or leasing of any goods, merchandise, commodity, article, service or thing (including any vehicle, watercraft or aircraft);

#### *Advertising*

- (4) display any sign for the purpose of commercial advertising, other than a moveable sign which is displayed on a public street or road in accordance with any by-law of the Council concerning moveable signs;

#### *Fires*

- (5) light or maintain any fire, except:
  - (a) in a place provided by the Council for that purpose; or
  - (b) in a portable barbecue;

#### *Tents*

- (6) erect any tent, booth, marquee or other structure (except the Council or Government);

#### *Camping*

- (7) camp or stay overnight;

#### *Attachments to trees*

- (8) attach, hang or fix any rug, blanket, sheet, rope or other material to any tree, shrub, plant, tree guard, tree stake, notice board, seat, fence, post, wall or other item or structure the property of Council;

#### *Flora and fauna*

- (9) Subject to the Native Vegetation Act 1991, and the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1972:
  - (a) damage, pick or interfere with any plant or flower thereon; or
  - (b) tease, or cause harm to any animal, bird or marine creature;

#### *Athletic and ball sports*

- (10) (a) promote, organise or take part in any organised athletic sport;
- (b) to which this subparagraph 2 (10) (b) applies, play or practice any game which involves kicking, hitting or throwing a ball;

#### *No Liquor*

- (11) to which this subparagraph 2 (11) applies, (except streets and roads which are not part of parklands or reserves), consume, carry or be in possession or charge of any liquor;

#### *Swimming*

- (12) swim or bathe in any pond or lake to which this subparagraph (12) applies;

*Fishing*

- (13) (a) fish in any pond or lake to which this sub-paragraph 2 (13) (a) applies;  
 (b) fish from any bridge or structure;

*Animals in Ponds*

- (14) to which this subparagraph 2 (14) applies, allow or suffer any animal to enter or remain in a pond or lake;

*Removal of Soil etc.*

- (15) carry away or remove any soil, sand, timber, stones, pebbles, other inorganic or organic materials or any part of the land;

*Fruit Picking*

- (16) pick fruits, nuts or berries from any tree or bush;

*Weddings and Private Ceremonies*

- (17) conduct or participate in a group ceremony on any land or reserve;

*Cemeteries*

- (18) comprising a cemetery:  
 (a) bury or inter any human or animal remains;  
 (b) erect any memorial;

*Use of Boats*

- (19) use a boat in any pond or lake to which this subparagraph 2 (19) applies;

*Closed Lands*

- (20) enter or remain on any part of local government land:  
 (a) at any time during which the council has declared that it shall be closed to the public;  
 (b) where the land is enclosed with fences and/or walls and gates, at any time when the gates have been closed or locked; or  
 (c) where admission charges apply, to enter without paying charges;

*Prohibited activities*

3. No person shall on local government land:

*Smoking*

- (1) smoke tobacco or any other substance in any building or part thereof to which this subparagraph 3 (1) applies;

*Use of equipment*

- (2) use any equipment or Council property other than in the manner and for the purpose for which it was designed or set aside;

*Annoyances*

- (3) annoy or unreasonably interfere with any other person's normal use of the land by making noise or creating a disturbance;

*Interference with permitted use*

- (4) interrupt or disrupt to interfere with any person's use of parklands or reserves for which permission has been granted.

*Restricted Lands*

4. No person shall enter or remain on any part of local government land except a public street or road:

- (1) at any time during which the Council has by resolution declared that part to be closed to the public, and which is indicated by sign adjacent to the entrance to the part; or  
 (2) where the land is enclosed with fences and/or walls and gates at any time when the gates have been closed and locked; or  
 (3) at any time when the Council has fixed a fee for entry to that part, without payment of the fee, or otherwise without permission.

*Removal of Animals and Persons*

5. (1) If any animal is found on part of local government land in breach of a by-law:

- (a) Any person in charge of the animal shall forthwith remove it from that part on the request of an authorised person; and  
 (b) An authorised person may remove it therefrom if the person fails to comply with the request, or if no person is in charge of the animal.

- (2) An authorised person may direct any person who is considered to be committing or has committed a breach of this by-law to leave that part of the local government land. Failure to comply with that direction forthwith is a breach of this by-law.

*Application*

6. Any of paragraphs 2 (10) (b), 2 (11), 2 (12), 2 (13) (a), 2 (14), 2 (19) or 3 (1) of this by-law shall apply only in such portion or portions of the area as the Council may by resolution direct (in accordance with Section 246 (3) (e) of the Local Government Act 1999).

*Exemptions*

7. The restrictions in this by-law do not apply to any Police Officer, Council Officer or employee acting in the course and within the scope of that person's normal duties, or to a contractor while performing work for the Council and while acting under the supervision of a Council Officer, or an emergency worker when driving an Emergency Vehicle.

*Construction*

8. This by-law is subject to any Act of Parliament and Regulations made thereunder.
