must be vaccinated with a Newcastle Disease vaccine, in accordance with the Newcastle Disease Vaccination Program Standard Operating Procedures as approved, from time to time, by the National Management Group of the Primary Industries Standing Committee and the Chief Inspector of Stock.

In addition, no person may introduce into South Australia any poultry destined for use within the commercial poultry industry unless the birds have been vaccinated for Newcastle Disease virus in accordance with the Newcastle Disease Vaccination Program Standard Operating Procedures.


