Approval of Category B Containers

I, STEPHEN RICHARD SMITH, Senior Adviser, Container Deposit Legislation and Delegate of the Environment Protection Authority ('the Authority'), pursuant to section 69 of the Environment Protection Act 1993 (SA) ('the Act') hereby:

Approval of Category B Containers

Approve as Category B Containers, subject to the conditions in subclauses (i) and (ii) below, each of the classes of containers identified by reference to the following matters described in the first 4 columns of Schedule 1 of this Notice which are sold in South Australia:

- (a) the product which each class of containers shall contain;
- (b) the size of the containers;
- (c) the type of containers;
- (d) the name of the holders of these approvals.

(i) *Subsection 69 (3) Arrangements*

The holders of these approvals must ensure that the empty containers which belong to their respective class of containers hereby approved as Category B Containers are collected from collection depots approved under section 69 of the Act by the party named in Column 5 of Schedule 1 of this Notice; and

(ii) *Approved Refund Markings*

The holders of these approvals must ensure that each container which belongs to their respective class of containers hereby approved as Category B Containers bears the refund marking approved by the Authority in respect of that class of containers.



ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1961

Exemption from the Fitting of Brakes to Boat Trailers

UNDER section 163AA of the Road Traffic Act 1961, I hereby grant exemption for boat trailers built prior to July 1990 which have an unladen mass not exceeding 750 kilograms and a laden mass not exceeding 2 tonnes:

1. *Exemption*

From the following provisions of the Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Rules 1999:

- Rule 132 (1)—Trailer braking requirements;
- Rule 133—Operation of brakes on trailers;
- Rule 20, but only insofar as it requires compliance with third edition Australian Design Rule ('ADR') 38—all other requirements under Rule 20 must be complied with.

2. *Definition*

For the purpose of this Notice a boat trailer is defined as a trailer built for the sole purpose of carrying a boat and its design prevents it being used for general duties. A boat trailer is towed at normal road speeds in general traffic conditions.

3. *Conditions Applying to this Exemption*

Subject to the following conditions:

- 3.1 That the unladen mass of the towing vehicle is at least 1.2 times greater than the total laden mass of the boat trailer, boat and other equipment carried thereon.
- 3.2 The laden mass of the towed boat trailer must not exceed the maximum legal unbraked towing capacity specified by the manufacturer of the towing vehicle:
 - 3.2.1 For the purpose of this Notice 'Laden Mass' means the mass of the boat trailer, boat and any other equipment carried thereon that is borne on the surfaces on which the trailer is standing or stationary when disconnected from the towing vehicle.
- 3.3 The speed of the vehicle combination does not exceed 90 km/h.
- 3.4 That the trailer complies with all other requirements of the Road Traffic Act 1961.

4. *Commencement and Expiry of this Notice*

This Notice is valid from the date of publication and will expire at midnight on 30 September 2006.

 - 12.02 Subject to Rule 12.04, the complainant (or other duly authorised person) may make a complaint by stating the matter of complaint to a witness who must be a Registrar, Deputy Registrar or Justice of the Peace.
 - 12.03 The complaint when reduced to writing must be:
 - (i) signed by the complainant (or other duly authorised person), and, subject to Rule 12.04;
 - (ii) signed and dated by the witness.
 - 12.04 A 'public authority' or 'public officer' (as defined in section 57a of the Act) or a legal practitioner may make a complaint in writing on signing and dating it without appearing before a witness.
 - 12.05 Where a complaint is made by a police officer in the execution of his duty the complaint and proceedings thereon may be entitled 'Police v '.
 - 12.06 Where a complaint is made by a 'public authority' (as defined in section 57a of the Act) the complaint and proceedings thereon may be entitled ' (Name of public authority) v..... '.
 - 12.07 A complaint must be filed in the Court within seven days of being made unless not practicable.
 - 12.08 A copy of the complaint shall be given to the defendant on or before the time of the first Court appearance.
 - 12.09 A complaint for contempt of Court may be made by a judicial officer as provided for in Rule 12.04.
 - 12.10 A complaint shall comply with Rule 15.03.

COMMENTARY TO THE STATEMENT OF THE AMOUNTS CREDITED TO AND ISSUED FROM THE CONSOLIDATED ACCOUNT FOR THE QUARTERS ENDED 31 MARCH 2003 AND 31 MARCH 2002

Receipts

Taxation

Taxation receipts for the first nine months of 2002-03 are significantly higher than for the same period a year ago mainly on account of continuing strength in the property market as reflected in stamp duty receipts.

The 2002-03 Budget forecasts assumed that the property market had peaked in 2001-02. The anticipated weakening in the property market during 2002-03 has not eventuated. Although property market activity levels are below those recorded in 2001-02 they remain at historically high levels while property prices have continued to record very strong growth.

Stamp duty on insurance has also continued to record strong growth reflecting industry wide increases in premium levels as part of structural adjustments in the insurance industry.

Lower year to date land tax receipts in 2002-03 compared to 2001-02 reflect the later timing of land tax payments by the SA Housing Trust in 2002-03 (\$58.1m). Reflecting strong growth in land values, full year land tax receipts are expected to be higher in 2002-03 than in 2001-02.

The higher level of collections of Commonwealth Places Mirror Taxes in the first nine months of 2002-03 compared to the same period in 2001-02 reflects the first full year of operation of the mirror tax arrangements with the Commonwealth, which came into effect in February 2002.

Royalties

For the first nine months of 2002-03, royalty revenue is comparable to that received in 2001-02. An apparent strong increase in royalty revenue in the March quarter of 2003 reflects an abnormally low result in the same quarter a year earlier. The low result in the March quarter 2002 reflects the impact of the fire at Olympic Dam, which damaged the solvent extraction plant. Delays in rebuilding the plant have also impacted on production levels in 2002-03.

Payments

Payments have been made pursuant to the *Appropriation Act*, passed at the time of issuing the 2002-03 State Budget and in accordance with various acts for which specific appropriation has been authorised.

The large deficit for the both the quarter and nine months ending 31 March 2003 is due to the Past Service Superannuation payment (\$183 m) being made in March 2003 compared to June in the previous financial year.

The total payments for the nine months ending 31 March 2003 are in line with the estimated outcome for the 2002-03 financial year.

Note

Considerable caution should be exercised in interpreting the quarterly statement of consolidated account transactions. Unlike the State budget, the information is purely limited to cash transactions. As reported in the Mid Year Budget Review for 2002-03, there have been significant upward revisions to taxation revenue estimates for 2002-03 based on experience in the first six months of the 2002-03 year.

The upward revisions to taxation estimates mainly relate to conveyance duty with smaller improvements being recorded for payroll tax, insurance duty and land tax.

The 2002-03 Budget forecasts assumed that the property market had peaked in 2001-02 and would be followed by a downturn in 2002-03. However, the property market has remained strong in 2002-03.

Upward revisions to land tax revenue reflect stronger than budgeted growth in commercial, industrial and residential (non principal place of residence) land values, impacting on 2002-03 receipts.

Payroll tax receipts reflect higher than anticipated activity levels in the non-farm sector and back payments of tax identified through tax compliance effort.

Stamp duty on insurance also exceeded expectations in the opening months of 2002-03. This reflects a continuation of the uplift in premium levels experienced in 2001-02 as a consequence of structural change in the insurance industry.

Royalties

Royalty revenue receipts in the first six months of 2002-03 were lower than projected reflecting the impact of lower international copper prices on Olympic Dam operations.
