## AUTHORISED BETTING OPERATIONS ACT 2000

### Section 4 (1) (b)

#### *Notice of Approval of Contingencies*

NO. 6 OF 2004

INDEPENDENT GAMBLING AUTHORITY, by this notice, approves contingencies relating to sporting or other events within Australia:

#### 1. *Citation*

This notice may be cited as the Approved Contingencies (Marree Picnic Races—Gallopings) Notice 2004.

#### 2. *Approval*

(1) The contingencies listed in the table are approved in respect of fixed odds betting by licensed bookmakers.

(2) This approval is subject to the provisions of the Authorised Betting Operations Act 2000 ('Act'), the Bookmakers Licensing Rules 2000, any other rules made under section 62 of the Act, and the conditions to which a licence or permit are subject.

(3) This approval of contingencies may be amended or revoked by further notice.

#### 3. *Definitions*

In this Notice:

'Event'—

- (a) means a race on the flat for horses where each animal is ridden by a person;
- (b) includes, in relation to an event mentioned in paragraph (a) for which there were more accepters than places, a division of that event offering the same prize as the event.

'Place' means the contingency that a specified Entrant will place either first, second or third (or, if applicable, fourth) in a specified Event (including where different odds are offered by a bookmaker for first place vis-a-vis any of second, third or, if applicable, fourth place).

'race', with respect to horses, includes—

- (a) a race conducted by a licensed racing club; and
- (b) a race at a picnic race meeting or a gymkhana.

'Win' means the contingency that a specified Entrant will place first in or win a specified Event.

## ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION ACT 1993

*Approval of Category A Containers*

I, STEPHEN RICHARD SMITH, Senior Adviser, Container Deposit Legislation and Delegate of the Environment Protection Authority ('the Authority'), pursuant to section 69 of the Environment Protection Act 1993 (SA) ('the Act') hereby:

*Approval of Category A Containers:*

Approve as Category A Containers, as identified in column 5 of the Schedule, subject to the conditions in subclauses (i) and (ii) below, each of the classes of containers identified by reference to the following matters described in the first 4 columns of Schedule 1 of this Notice which are sold in South Australia:

- (a) the product which each class of containers shall contain;
- (b) the size of the containers;
- (c) the type of containers;
- (d) the name of the holders of these approvals.

(i) *Subsection 69 (3) Arrangements:*

The holders of these approvals must ensure that the empty containers which belong to their respective class of containers hereby approved as Category A Containers are collected from the retailers that sell them, and recycled in an appropriate manner. Disposal at landfill is not considered an appropriate method of disposal.

(ii) *Approved Refund Markings:*

- (a) The holders of these approvals must ensure that each container which belongs to their respective class of containers hereby approved as Category A Containers bears the refund marking approved by the Authority in respect of that class of containers.
- (b) The refund marking that appears on each container that belongs to the class of containers hereby approved, must be a minimum 1.5 mm for the smallest letter in the statement and a minimum 3 mm for the numeric ('5') in the statement.

Approve as Category B Containers, subject to the conditions in subclauses (i) and (ii) below, each of the classes of containers identified by reference to the following matters described in the first 4 columns of Schedule 1 of this Notice which are sold in South Australia:

- (a) the product which each class of containers shall contain;
- (b) the size of the containers;
- (c) the type of containers;
- (d) the name of the holders of these approvals.

(i) *Subsection 69 (3) Arrangements:*

The holders of these approvals must ensure that the empty containers which belong to their respective class of containers hereby approved as Category B Containers are collected from collection depots approved under section 69 of the Act by the party named in Column 5 of Schedule 1 of this Notice; and

(ii) *Approved Refund Markings:*

- (a) The holders of these approvals must ensure that each container which belongs to their respective class of containers hereby approved as Category B Containers bears the refund marking approved by the Authority in respect of that class of containers.
- (b) The refund marking that appears on each container that belongs to the class of containers hereby approved, must be a minimum 1.5 mm for the smallest letter in the statement and a minimum 3 mm for the numeric ('5') in the statement.



Pursuant to section 87(1)(a) of the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the recommendation of the Minister of Commerce (being satisfied as to the matters required by section 87(2) of that Act) makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

**1 Title**

These regulations are the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (Revival of Temporary Exemption for Water Heaters) Regulations 2004.

**2 Commencement**

These regulations come into force on gazettal.

**3 Interpretation**

In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—

**Efficiency Regulations** means the Energy Efficiency (Energy Using Products) Regulations 2002

**water heaters** means goods in the product classes “**Low-pressure copper thermal storage electric water heaters**” or “**Storage water heaters (electrically heated)**” in Schedule 1 of the Efficiency Regulations; but does not include cylinders designed specifically for use with a solar collector or mains pressure cylinders with 3 or more heating elements.

**4 Temporary exemptions**

- (1) Regulations 4 and 5 of the Efficiency Regulations are exempted from the Act to the extent that they apply to water heaters.
- (2) The period of exemption is the period from the making of these regulations to the close of 31 January 2005.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on gazettal, exempt, until the close of 31 January 2005, regulations 4 and 5 of the Energy Efficiency (Energy Using Products) Regulations 2002 from the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997 to the extent that those regulations apply to certain water heaters.

Under the Act, a product that is produced in, or imported into, Australia and that can be sold in Australia may also be sold in New Zealand, even though it may not comply with a more stringent New Zealand standard or other requirement for that product. From 1 February 2003 (when the relevant New Zealand standards came into force), Australia's minimum energy performance standards for electric storage water heaters have been less stringent than the New Zealand standards set out in the Energy Efficiency (Energy Using Products) Regulations 2002. This potentially jeopardises the New Zealand Government's energy efficiency objectives, with potential adverse effects on the environment. Therefore, a temporary 12-month exemption in relation to water heaters was granted under the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (Temporary Exemption) Regulation 2003, with the result that all water heaters sold in New Zealand must meet the New Zealand standards set out in the Energy Efficiency (Energy Using Products) Regulations 2002.

The effect of these regulations is that for a period from the making of these regulations until the close of 31 January 2005, the exemption is revived so that the water heaters to which these regulations apply, whether capable of being sold in Australia or not, must comply with regulations 4 and 5 of the Energy Efficiency (Energy Using Products) Regulations 2002.

### Compulsory Third Party (CTP) Insurance - Policy of Insurance

1. The insurer (the Motor Accident Commission) insures the owner of the motor vehicle and any other person who at any time drives or is a passenger in or on the vehicle, whether with or without the consent of the owner, in respect of all liability that may be incurred by the owner or other person in respect of the death of, or bodily injury to, any person caused by, or arising out of the use of the vehicle in any part of the Commonwealth.
2. A person so insured warrants that he or she will not-
  - (a) drive the vehicle, or do or omit to do anything in relation to the vehicle, with the intention of causing death of, or bodily injury to, a person or damage to another's property or with reckless indifference as to whether such death, bodily injury or damage results; or
  - (b) drive the vehicle while so much under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a drug as to be incapable of exercising effective control of the vehicle; or
  - (c) drive the vehicle while there is present in his or her blood a concentration of .15 grams\* or more of alcohol in 100 millilitres of blood; or
  - (d) drive the vehicle while not duly licensed or otherwise permitted by law to drive the motor vehicle; or
  - (e) drive the vehicle while the vehicle is overloaded, or in an unsafe, unroadworthy or damaged condition; or
  - (f) use the vehicle otherwise than-
    - (i) for the purposes stated in the application for registration, renewal of registration, exemption from registration or a permit, in respect of the vehicle; or
    - (ii) if trade plates are affixed to the vehicle - for purposes stated in the application for the issuing of those plates; or
    - (iii) for purposes agreed on between the insurer and the registered owner of the vehicle.
3. The owner of the vehicle warrants that no person will, with his or her knowledge or consent (which will be presumed in any proceedings in the absence of proof to the contrary), drive or use the vehicle, or do or omit to do anything in relation to the vehicle, contrary to any paragraphs of clause 2.

\* The insurer's right to recover claims costs is in addition to all other penalties applying to offences involving the driving of a vehicle with a blood alcohol concentration in excess of the legal limit, namely 0.05%.

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR VEHICLE OWNERS ON CTP INSURANCE

#### ASSISTANCE IN DETERMINING THE APPROPRIATE PREMIUM CLASS

The premium class and premium payable may be determined by referring to the CTP Insurance Schedule shown overleaf. In determining the premium class, attention should be given to:

- Type of vehicle
- The purpose for which it is used
- The input tax credit (ITC) entitlement of the registered owner (see below)
- The postcode area in which it is usually garaged (see below)

#### GST

The premiums shown overleaf include a component to recover the cost of stamp duty payable by the insurer. In accordance with GST laws, no GST is payable on this component of the premium. Consequently, the GST payable will be less than 1/11th of the total premium.

#### The Input Tax Credit (ITC) Entitlement of the registered owner

Where alternative premiums are offered, you MUST select an 'ITC Entitled' higher premium class if the vehicle is used for any purpose that entitles you to claim back any part of the GST component of the CTP Premium. Under the Commonwealth GST Law\*, this is known as an 'Input Tax Credit' (ITC). Upon payment of any 'ITC Entitled' premium, a Tax Invoice will automatically be provided with your Certificate of Registration.

A 'No ITC Entitlement' premium is only available where you are NOT entitled to an ITC in relation to the premium paid. Where a 'No ITC Entitlement' premium class has been selected a Tax Invoice will not be provided with your Certificate of Registration. If a Tax Invoice is required for a 'No ITC Entitlement' premium class payment, an application form must be completed and lodged with a Transport SA or Service SA Customer Service Centre. This form can be obtained from any Transport SA or Service SA Customer Service Centre.

#### **Payment of the incorrect premium may incur a penalty up to \$250. This penalty is in addition to any premium differential payable.**

In addition, if the incorrect premium is paid this constitutes a breach of the Policy of Insurance. Section 124A(2) of the Motor Vehicles Act 1959 allows the insurer, by action in a court of competent jurisdiction, to recover from the insured person a portion of the money paid or costs incurred by the insurer in respect of the liability incurred by the insured person. Accordingly, use of the vehicle otherwise than for the purposes stated in your application renders you liable to recovery action in the event that a claim on your policy is paid by the insurer. The insurer considers that an amount of 10% of the money paid or costs incurred by the insurer to be an appropriate amount and will accept that sum as settlement of its claim under Section 124A(2) of the Motor Vehicles Act 1959.

\*GST Law means the Commonwealth legislation: A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999.

- is such that the quantity of water available can no longer meet the demand; and
- there is a risk that the available water will not be sufficient to meet future demand; and
- is affecting the quality of water in the watercourse;

hereby restrict the taking of water from the River Murray Prescribed Watercourse, in the manner and subject to the conditions, specified in Schedule 2.

- 136 gigalitres.

(c) A person holding a water licence endorsed with a water (taking) allocation for the taking of water for urban water supply through reticulated water supply infrastructure under the Waterworks Act 1932 (Country Towns) entitling that person to take:

- a quantity of water equivalent to 70% of the water (taking) allocation endorsed on the water licence, excluding water allocations for the purposes specified in clause 7 and subject to the provision of clause 4.

(d) A person who during the period of this Notice, receives approval to convert a water (holding) allocation to a water (taking) allocation under the Water Resources Act 1997 entitling that person to take:

- a quantity of water equivalent to 70% of the water (taking) allocation endorsed on the water licence after conversion, excluding water allocations for purposes specified in clause 7 and subject to the provision of clause 4.

4. Where a water allocation is transferred to the State of South Australia for taking purposes from interstate the total volume transferred may be taken by the transferee.

5. The following condition applies to the taking of water in accordance with this Notice:

- The water may only be taken through a meter that accurately measures the quantity of water taken and is at all times in good working condition, unless water is taken to irrigate reclaimed land within the Lower Murray Reclaimed Irrigation Management Zone as defined in the Water Allocation Plan for the River Murray Prescribed Watercourse adopted on 1 July 2002.

6. An authorisation granted under this Notice will terminate if the person to whom the authorisation was granted no longer holds a licence endorsed with a water (taking) allocation.
