This order does not apply to any of the above drugs or class of drugs legally supplied or prescribed for treatment of Katrina Agnes Ball by a dentist or medical practitioner or by a veterinary surgeon or administration to an animal in her care.

## RUNDLE MALL MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY

*Notice of Approval of a Subsidiary*

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## PART 1—PRELIMINARY

### 1.1 DICTIONARY

In this Charter:

**Act** means Local Government Act 1999.

**Authority** means Rundle Mall Management Authority established as a single Council Subsidiary pursuant to Section 42 of the Act.

**Board** means the Board of Management of the Authority.

**Budget** means a budget that conforms to Part 13 and last adopted by the Board.

**Business Plan** means a business plan that conforms to Part 12 and last adopted by the Board.

**Council** means the Corporation of the City of Adelaide.

**deliberative vote** means a vote cast by each director (including the Chairperson) for the purpose of deciding a matter under deliberation.

**Director** means at any time a member of the Board.

**simple majority** means a majority of those present and entitled to vote.

Subject to the above, words and expressions in this Charter have the same meaning as in a provision of the Act that deals with the same matter.

### 1.2 INTERPRETATION

In this Charter: the singular includes the plural and *vice versa* and words importing a gender include other genders; words importing natural persons include corporations; reference to a section(s) is to a section of the Act and includes any section that substantially replaces that section and deals with the same matter; headings are for ease of reference only and do not affect the construction of this Charter.

### 1.3 ABOUT THIS CHARTER

1.3.1 This Charter is the charter of the Authority.

1.3.2 This Charter binds the Authority and the Council.

1.3.3 Despite any other provision in this Charter:

1.3.3.1 if the Act prohibits a thing being done, the thing may not be done;

1.3.3.2 if the Act requires a thing to be done, authority is given for that thing to be done;

1.3.3.3 if a provision of this Charter is, or becomes, inconsistent with the Act, that provision must be read down or, failing that, severed from this Charter to the extent of the inconsistency.

1.3.4 This Charter may not be amended except by the Council by passing resolution in the same terms. An amendment is not effective unless and until published in the *Gazette*.

1.3.5 The Council may review this Charter at any time but must in any event review this Charter when it reviews its Strategic Management Plans.

## PART 2—AUTHORITY

### 2.1 ABOUT THE AUTHORITY

The Authority is a Council subsidiary established pursuant to section 42 of the Act to improve and enhance the economic viability of the Rundle Mall precinct.

### 2.2 NAME OF THE AUTHORITY

The name of the Authority is the Rundle Mall Management Authority.

### 2.3 CORPORATE STATUS

The Authority is a body corporate under the Act and in all things acts through the Board.

## PART 3—FUNCTIONS AND POWERS

### 3.1 FUNCTIONS

3.1.1 The Authority has these functions:

3.1.1.1 to position the Rundle Mall precinct in a way that sustains retail, business and economic growth and maintains economic viability;

3.1.1.2 to enhance and sustain Rundle Mall as the State's premier retail and commercial shopping precinct;

- 3.1.1.3 to provide greater engagement and partnership with key stakeholders of Rundle Mall to achieve greater competitiveness, development and success for Rundle Mall;
- 3.1.1.4 to prepare a strategic management plan for the Rundle Mall precinct;
- 3.1.1.5 to refine and redefine the strategic management framework for the Rundle Mall precinct in response to changing circumstances;
- 3.1.1.6 to promote the Rundle Mall precinct and to encourage its use by residents, visitors and the community in general;
- 3.1.1.7 to make recommendations to Council in relation to the maintenance and upgrade of the precinct's existing infrastructure and physical appearance to ensure it is maintained to a high standard;
- 3.1.1.8 to monitor that aspect of the annual budget approved by Council relating to the Authority's financial and general performance;
- 3.1.1.9 to report regularly to Council on the Authority's financial and general performance; and
- 3.1.1.10 to promote and co-ordinate strategic management actions in a way that will ensure ongoing participation and commitment from traders, investors, property owners and the Council.

### 3.2 POWERS & DUTIES

- 3.2.1 The Authority may do any thing necessary, expedient or incidental to performing or discharging its functions including, without limitation:
  - 3.2.1.1 receive gifts of money or property from any person;
  - 3.2.1.2 contract with any person;
  - 3.2.1.3 operate an account with a bank or with the Local Government Finance Authority, or both;
  - 3.2.1.4 insure against any risk;
  - 3.2.1.5 compromise, compound, abandon or settle a debt or claim owed to the Authority;
  - 3.2.1.6 refer a dispute to mediation;
  - 3.2.1.7 allocate receipts and expenditure between projects;
  - 3.2.1.8 incur expenditure necessary in the performance of its functions and duties in accordance with the objectives of this Charter and within budgets approved by the Council;
  - 3.2.1.9 plan, cost, endorse and report upon projects to the Council and to stakeholders of the Authority;
  - 3.2.1.10 make application for funds and other revenue deemed necessary for the performance of its functions;
  - 3.2.1.11 with the approval of the Council, invest funds in accordance with Part 4 of Chapter 9 of the Act;
  - 3.2.1.12 promote and market the Rundle Mall precinct and generally retain all business activities in the Council area;
  - 3.2.1.13 raise funds over and above those raised through the separate rate in accordance with its functions; and
  - 3.2.1.14 all things incidental to the exercise of any other power of the Authority.
- 3.2.2 The Authority may only borrow funds with the approval of the Council.
- 3.2.3 Funds raised through the separate rate must be expended in accordance with the annual business plan and budget and upon projects specifically designated and approved.
- 3.2.4 Funds that remain unspent in relation to specific projects, may be accumulated for expenditure in a later period within the Rundle Mall precinct.
- 3.2.5 The Authority may assess the contestability of contracts for services provided to the Authority.

### 3.3 GUIDING PRINCIPLES

The Authority must, in the performance of its functions and in all of its plans, policies and activities, give due weight to economic, social and environmental considerations.

**PART 4—COUNCIL****4.1 COUNCIL MAY ACT INDEPENDENTLY**

- 4.1.1 The establishment of the Authority does not preclude the Council from performing for itself the same functions and powers as the Authority could on behalf of the Council.
- 4.1.2 The Authority is subject to the direction and control of the Council.
- 4.1.3 To be effective against the Authority, a determination or direction or other decision must be evidenced by either:
- 4.1.3.1 a minute signed by an authorised delegate of the Council;
  - 4.1.3.2 a resolution in favour of that decision passed by the Council; or
  - 4.1.3.3 a minute signed by the chair of a committee that is an authorised delegate of the Council where a resolution was duly passed in favour of that decision.
- 4.1.4 As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 14 (1) of the Act provides that liabilities incurred or assumed by the Authority are guaranteed by the Council.

**PART 5—DIRECTORS****5.1 QUALIFICATIONS OF DIRECTORS**

- 5.1.1 A Director appointed under subclause 5.2.1.2 must be a natural person but need not be an officer, employee or elected member of the Council.
- 5.1.2 The appointment of the Directors for the purposes of subclause 5.2.1.2 must endeavour to achieve, in the membership of the Board, a range of knowledge, skills and/or experience across the following areas:
- 5.1.2.1 retail business experience;
  - 5.1.2.2 marketing and/or advertising experience;
  - 5.1.2.3 retail property management experience;
  - 5.1.2.4 experience as a Director or Board member of a similar body;
  - 5.1.2.5 financial management experience; or
  - 5.1.2.6 local government experience.

**5.2 APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS**

- 5.2.1 The Board shall comprise of eight Directors appointed as follows:
- 5.2.1.1 at all times, two Directors will be members of the Council appointed by the Council for a term specified by the Council (but not exceeding four years), comprising:
    - 5.2.1.1.1 one Director being the Lord Mayor or, if the Lord Mayor chooses not to be a Director, another member of the Council; and
    - 5.2.1.1.2 one other Director being a member of the Council;
  - 5.2.1.2 at all times, the remaining six Directors will be appointed by the Council by resolution following the process outlined at subclause 5.2.2.
- 5.2.2 The six Directors to be appointed pursuant to subclause 5.2.1.2 will be appointed as follows:
- 5.2.2.1 the first appointments will be made in accordance with Clause 5.2.3 by the Council after seeking expressions of interest; and
  - 5.2.2.2 thereafter all appointments will be made by the Council upon recommendation of the Board after a public expression of interest process.
- 5.2.3 The six Directors appointed pursuant to subclause 5.2.1.2 will be appointed for a term of office as follows:
- 5.2.3.1 the first appointments will be made upon the basis that half of the Directors are appointed for a one year term and the remaining half for a two year term; and
  - 5.2.3.2 thereafter all appointments will be for a two year term.
- 5.2.4 A Board member is eligible for reappointment at the expiration of a term of office.
- 5.2.5 Prior to the conclusion of the term of office of any Director, a further appointment will be made by the Council in accordance with Clause 5.2.2.

5.2.6 The Council must give to the Authority a written notice of appointment of a Director.

5.2.7 Each Director must give to the Authority a signed written consent to act as a Director.

### 5.3 REMOVAL OF DIRECTORS

5.3.1 Neither the Authority nor the Board may remove a Director.

5.3.2 The Council may remove a Director from office by giving to the Authority a written notice of removal of the Director, signed by or for the Authority.

5.3.3 The Council may remove a Director who is absent, without leave of the Board, from three consecutive ordinary meetings of the Board.

5.3.4 The Council may remove a Director, either of its own volition or upon recommendation of the Board, by a two-thirds majority vote of the Directors present (excluding the Director subject to this subclause 5.3.4) for:

5.3.4.1 any behaviour of the Director which, in the opinion of the Board, amounts to impropriety;

5.3.4.2 serious neglect of duty in attending to the responsibilities of a Director;

5.3.4.3 breach of fiduciary duty to the Board or the Council;

5.3.4.4 breach of the duty of confidentiality to the Board and/or the Council;

5.3.4.5 breach of the propriety requirements of the Board; or

5.3.4.6 any other behaviour which may discredit the Board.

### 5.4 VACATION OF THE OFFICE OF DIRECTOR

5.4.1 A person vacates office as a Director if and when:

5.4.1.1 Clauses 5.3.2 to 5.3.4 inclusive requires;

5.4.1.2 Schedule 2, Clause 4 (3) of the Act requires or permits; or

5.4.1.3 the person was, when appointed, an elected member of the Council and ceases to be an elected member.

5.4.2 A Director need not retire from office at any time.

### 5.5 REMUNERATION AND EXPENSES OF DIRECTORS

5.5.1 The Authority is entitled to pay appropriate Remuneration Fees as approved by the Council.

5.5.2 The Authority must pay to a Director any travelling and other expenses that are properly incurred in connection with the Authority's business and with the prior approval of the Board as recorded in minutes of a Board meeting.

5.5.3 Attendance is recognised as a significant factor towards the success of the Subsidiary and therefore the payment of fees will be subject to attendance.

### 5.6 CASUAL VACANCIES

If any casual vacancy occurs in the membership of the Board, it will be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. The person appointed to the Board to fill a casual vacancy will be appointed for the balance of the term of the original appointment.

### 5.7 REGISTER OF INTERESTS

A Director is not required to submit returns to the Authority under Chapter 5, Part 4, Division 2 of the Act.

### 5.8 PROTECTION FROM LIABILITY

As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 38 of the Act protects a Director from certain civil liabilities.

### 5.9 SAVING PROVISION

5.9.1 As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 40 of the Act states that no act or proceeding of the Authority is invalid by reason of:

5.9.1.1 a vacancy or vacancies in the membership of the Board; or

5.9.1.2 a defect in the appointment of a Director.

**PART 6—OTHER OFFICERS****6.1 MANAGER**

- 6.1.1 The Board may appoint a person to the office of Manager of the Authority for a period, and on terms (including as to remuneration), as the Board sees fit.
- 6.1.2 The Board may revoke or vary an appointment of a Manager, subject to any agreement made between the Manager and the Authority.
- 6.1.3 The Board may delegate to the Manager any of the powers that the Board can exercise.
- 6.1.4 The Board may revoke or vary a delegation of powers on the Manager.

**6.2 AUDITOR**

The Authority must have an auditor. Subject to the Act, and this Charter, an auditor holds office on the terms and conditions (including as to remuneration) that the Board determines.

**PART 7—AUDIT COMMITTEE****7.1 AUDIT COMMITTEE**

As a matter of record, the Authority is required to establish an Audit Committee and Schedule 2, Clause 13 (4) of the Act governs the constitution and functions of the Audit Committee. It should be noted that the Subsidiary can set up its own Audit Committee or use the Council's Audit Committee.

**PART 8—STAFF****8.1 STAFF**

- 8.1.1 The Manager of the Authority is responsible for appointing, managing, suspending and dismissing any other employees of the Authority (on behalf of the Authority).
- 8.1.2 The Board and the Council may arrange for the Council to make available its staff in connection with the Authority's affairs for such remuneration (if any) as the parties may agree.
- 8.1.3 The appointment of staff is consistent with the Council's employment policies and conditions and, as such, are not allowed to erode over time.

**PART 9—BOARD****9.1 BOARD**

The Authority must at all times have a Board comprised of Directors.

**9.2 BOARD FUNCTIONS**

- 9.2.1 The Board has these functions:
  - 9.2.1.1 Formulating strategic plans and strategies aimed at improving the business of the Authority.
  - 9.2.1.2 Providing professional input and policy direction to the Authority.
  - 9.2.1.3 Monitoring, overseeing and measuring the performance of the Manager of the Authority.
  - 9.2.1.4 Ensuring that a code of conduct dealing with ethical behaviour and integrity is established and implemented in all business dealings of the Authority.
  - 9.2.1.5 Assisting in the development of strategic management and business plans.
  - 9.2.1.6 Exercising the care, diligence and skill that a prudent person of business would exercise in managing the affairs of other persons.
  - 9.2.1.7 The Board and/or the Council may as required wish to co-opt, second or invite person/s to provide information and specialist skills, or to assist with key tasks and projects over a period.

**9.3 BOARD POWERS**

- 9.3.1 As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 5 (1) of the Act provides that the Board is responsible for the administration of the affairs of the Authority.
- 9.3.2 As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 5 (3) of the Act provides that anything done by the Board in the administration of the Authority's affairs is binding on the Authority.
- 9.3.3 The Board may exercise all the powers of the Authority conferred by this Charter.

- 9.3.4 A delegation of powers by the Board:
- 9.3.4.1 may authorise the delegate to sub-delegate all or any of the powers vested in the delegate; and
- 9.3.4.2 may be concurrent with, or to the exclusion of, the exercise by the Board of those powers.

#### 9.4 **BOARD MEETINGS**

- 9.4.1 Subject to Schedule 2, Clause 5 of the Act, the Board may determine its own procedures for meetings, which must be fair and contribute to free and open decision making.
- 9.4.2 Any two Directors may call a Special Board meeting upon a minimum of 24 hours notice.
- 9.4.3 A Board meeting must be held at least once in every calendar month for the first year after the establishment of the Authority and thereafter as determined by the Board, provided that the Board meets at least once in every calendar quarter.
- 9.4.4 A notice of meeting must:
- 9.4.4.1 set out the place, date and time for the meeting;
- 9.4.4.2 state the general nature of the meeting's business;
- 9.4.4.3 be accompanied by relevant information so far as reasonably available (if not already given to the Director); and
- 9.4.4.4 be given at least three clear business days before the meeting (or such other period as all the Directors in office may, as a matter of general policy, determine otherwise).
- 9.4.5 Subject to Clause 9.5 and to the absolute discretion of the Board to conduct any meeting or part of any meeting in public, meetings of the Board will not be conducted in a place open to the public.
- 9.4.6 A Board meeting must be held at a reasonable time and, if the meeting is to be held in person, at a reasonable place.
- 9.4.7 As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 5 (11) of the Act obliges the Board to keep minutes of its proceedings. All minutes must be prepared and distributed to both Directors and the Council within five days of the meeting to which they relate.
- 9.4.8 As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 5 (5) of the Act permits a Board meeting to occur by telephone or videoconference.
- 9.4.9 For the purposes of this subclause, the contemporary linking together by telephone, audio-visual or other instantaneous medium ('telecommunications meeting') of a number of the Directors is deemed to constitute a meeting of the Board, provided that at least a quorum is present. Each of the Directors taking part in the meeting must at all times during the telecommunications meeting be able to hear and be heard by each of the other Directors present. At the commencement of the meeting, each Director must announce his/her presence to all other Directors taking part in the meeting. A Director must not leave a telecommunications meeting by disconnecting his/her telephone, audio visual or other communication equipment, unless that Director has previously notified the Chairperson of the meeting.
- 9.4.10 As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 5 (6) of the Act, may permit a resolution of the Board made in writing and not at a meeting.
- 9.4.11 As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 5 (8) of the Act, may permit a third party to attend (but not participate in) a Board meeting and have access to papers provided for the meeting.
- 9.4.12 The Chairperson of the Board shall be appointed by the Board and shall hold office for a term determined by the Board, unless he/she resigns or is removed from office pursuant to a resolution of the Board, or until he/she is otherwise no longer eligible to act as a Director.
- 9.4.13 There shall also be a Deputy Chairperson of the Board who shall be appointed by the Board from amongst its members and shall hold office for a term determined by the Board, unless he/she resigns or is removed from office pursuant to a resolution of the Board or until he/she is otherwise no longer eligible to act as a Director.
- 9.4.14 The Chairperson and the Deputy Chairperson are eligible for re-appointment at the expiration of their term of office but shall only hold office for a maximum of three consecutive terms.
- 9.4.15 In the event that the appointed Chairperson either resigns or is no longer eligible to act as a Director prior to the expiration of that persons term, then the Deputy Chairperson shall act in that office. In the event of the Deputy Chairperson refusing or being unable to so act, the Board shall elect from amongst the other Directors a new Deputy Chairperson who shall hold office until a further appointment is made whereupon the person so appointed will hold office for the duration of the original appointment.

- 9.4.16 The Chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the Board and, in the event of the Chairperson being absent from a meeting, the Deputy Chairperson shall preside. In the event of both the Chairperson and the Deputy Chairperson being absent from a meeting, the Directors present shall appoint a member from amongst them, who shall preside for that meeting or until the Chairperson or the Deputy Chairperson is present.
- 9.4.17 Unless the Directors determine otherwise, the quorum for a Board meeting is four Directors. A quorum must be present at all times during the meeting.
- 9.4.18 Each Director present at a Board meeting has one vote on a question arising for decision at that meeting and, if the votes are equal, the Board member presiding at the meeting may exercise a casting vote.

## 9.5 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

- 9.5.1 An Annual General Meeting of the Board shall be held prior to November in each year at a place and time determined by a resolution of the Board.
- 9.5.2 Notice of the Annual General Meeting will be given by:
- 9.5.2.1 placing a copy of the notice and agenda on public display at the principal office of the Authority and of the Council; and
  - 9.5.2.2 by giving notice in newspapers that circulate in the area of the Council; or
  - 9.5.2.3 in such other manner as the Manager considers appropriate.
- 9.5.3 The notice and agenda must be placed on public display at least 14 clear days before the Annual General Meeting and must be available to the public:
- 9.5.3.1 for inspection, without charge;
  - 9.5.3.2 by way of a copy, upon payment of a fee fixed by the Authority; and
  - 9.5.3.3 on public display until the completion of the Annual General Meeting.
- 9.5.4 A reasonable number of copies of the notice and agenda and any document or report supplied to Directors for the Annual General Meeting must be available for members of the public at the meeting.
- 9.5.5 The Annual General Meeting will be conducted in a place open to the public and will consider and deal with business of a general nature aimed at reviewing the progress and direction of the Authority over the immediately preceding financial year and shall include the following:
- 9.5.5.1 Chairperson's report;
  - 9.5.5.2 Manager's report;
  - 9.5.5.3 the annual budget for the ensuing financial year;
  - 9.5.5.4 the audited financial statements for the previous financial year; and
  - 9.5.5.5 any other general business determined by the Board to be considered at the Annual General Meeting.
- 9.5.6 The minutes of the Annual General Meeting must be available to the public within five days of the Meeting for inspection or by provision of a copy upon payment of a fixed fee by the Board.

## PART 10—COMPETITIVE NEUTRALITY

### 10.1 COMPETITIVE NEUTRALITY

For the purposes of Schedule 2, Clause 15 of the Act, the Authority is not, and is not to be, involved in a significant business activity.

## PART 11—GOVERNANCE

### 11.1 DIRECTOR'S CONFLICT OF INTEREST

As a matter of record, by section 75 (2) of the Act, the provisions of Chapter 5, Part 4, Division 3 apply to Directors.

### 11.2 DIRECTOR'S DUTIES OF CARE

As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 7 of the Act (care and diligence) and Schedule 2, Clause 34 of the Act (honesty, use of information, use of position) set out certain statutory duties of, and that apply to, a Director.

### 11.3 BOARD POLICIES

- 11.3.1 The Authority must prepare and adopt a code of conduct to be observed by Directors in the performance of their functions and duties.

- 11.3.2 The Authority must, in consultation with the Council, prepare and adopt, and thereafter keep under review, policies on:
- 11.3.2.1 governance including as concern:
    - 11.3.2.1.1 the operation of any account with a bank or Local Government Finance Authority;
    - 11.3.2.1.2 human resource management;
    - 11.3.2.1.3 improper assistance to a prospective contract party;
    - 11.3.2.1.4 improper offering of inducements to Directors or to staff of the Authority; and
    - 11.3.2.1.5 improper lobbying of Directors or staff of the Authority;
  - 11.3.2.2 occupational health and safety; and
  - 11.3.2.3 protection of the environment.
- 11.3.3 The Board must ensure that the code of conduct and the first policies are prepared and adopted within six months after the Authority is established.
- 11.3.4 To the extent it is able, the Board must ensure that the code of conduct and such policies as above are complied with in the affairs of the Authority.

#### 11.4 BOARD DUTIES TO MEMBERS

- 11.4.1 As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 6 (2) of the Act is that the Board must ensure as far as practicable:
- 11.4.1.1 that the Authority observes all plans, targets, structures, systems and practices required or applied to the Council;
  - 11.4.1.2 that all information furnished to the Council is accurate; and
  - 11.4.1.3 that the Council is advised, as soon as practicable, of any material development that affects the financial or operating capacity of the Authority or gives rise to the expectation that the Authority may not be able to meet its debts as and when they fall due.

#### 11.5 BOARD DUTIES TO THE AUTHORITY

- 11.5.1 The Board must ensure:
- 11.5.1.1 that the Authority acts in accordance with applicable laws, mandatory codes of practice and this Charter;
  - 11.5.1.2 that the Authority acts ethically and with integrity; and
  - 11.5.1.3 that the activities of the Authority are conducted efficiently and effectively and that the assets of the Authority are properly managed and maintained.
- 11.5.2 The Board must endeavour to ensure that the Authority performs its Business Plan and achieves the financial outcomes projected in its Budget.

### PART 12—BUSINESS PLANS

#### 12.1 BUSINESS PLAN

As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 8 of the Act sets out requirements for a Business Plan.

#### 12.2 BUSINESS PLAN TERM

A Business Plan must address at least the next 48 months and must be reviewed annually within three months of the adoption of the budget.

### PART 13—BUDGETS

#### 13.1 BUDGETS

As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 9 of the Act sets out requirements for Budgets.

#### 13.2 ABOUT A BUDGET

- 13.2.1 An adopted Budget binds the Authority and the Council and is authority for the Authority to perform work and incur debts and obligations according to its own terms without reference back to the Council (except to any extent the Budget otherwise requires).
- 13.2.2 The Authority shall prepare a draft budget for the next financial year, which must be delivered to the Council by 28 February in each year, and must prepare and adopt a final annual budget to be delivered to the Council on 1 June in each year.

**13.3 EXPENDITURE OUTSIDE A BUDGET**

As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 9 (4) provides that the Authority may incur, for the purpose of genuine emergency or hardship, spending that is not authorised by its Budget. Also, as a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 9 (5) provides that the Authority may, in a financial year, after consultation with the Council, incur spending before adoption of its Budget for the year, but the spending must be provided for in the appropriate Budget for the year.

**13.4 DEBT FUNDING**

The Authority may not borrow or raise money except as provided by Clause 3.2.

**13.5 REVENUE**

The Authority may earn revenue from activities undertaken within its functions and powers.

**13.6 INTEREST IN COMPANIES**

As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 39 of the Act prohibits the Authority from having an interest in most companies.

**PART 14—INSURANCE****14.1 INSURANCE**

14.1.1 The Authority must register with the Local Government Association Mutual Liability Scheme and comply with the rules of that Scheme.

14.1.2 If the Authority employs any person, it must register with the Local Government Superannuation Scheme and the Local Government Association Workers Compensation Scheme and comply with the rules of those Schemes.

**PART 15—FINANCIAL PRACTICES****15.1 ACCOUNTING RECORDS**

The Authority must comply with section 124 of the Act as if the Authority were a Council.

**15.2 OTHER FINANCIAL PRACTICES**

Except as may be stated elsewhere in this Charter, there are no special accounting, internal auditing or financial systems or practices to be established or observed by the Authority.

**PART 16—ACCESS TO INFORMATION****16.1 ACCESS TO RECORDS**

The Council has a right to inspect and take copies of the books and records of the Authority for any proper purpose.

**16.2 PROVISION OF INFORMATION**

As a matter of record Schedule 2, Clause 11 of the Act entitles the Council to be furnished with information or records of the Authority.

**16.3 MANAGEMENT REPORTS**

The Authority must provide management reports to the Directors at such times, in such format and with such content as the Board may determine.

**16.4 ANNUAL REPORTS**

As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 12 of the Act requires the Authority to furnish an annual report to the Council.

**PART 17—DISPUTE RESOLUTION****17.1 DISPUTE RESOLUTION**

17.1.1 About this clause:

17.1.1.1 The procedure in this clause must be applied to any dispute that arises between the Authority and the Council concerning the affairs of the Authority, including a dispute as to the meaning or effect of this Charter and whether the dispute concerns a claim in common law, equity or under statute.

17.1.1.2 The Authority and the Council must continue to observe and perform this Charter despite the application or operation of this clause.

- 17.1.1.3 This clause does not prejudice the right of a party to require the continuing observance and performance of this Charter by all parties or to institute proceedings to enforce payment due under this Charter or to seek injunctive relief to prevent immediate and irreparable harm.
- 17.1.1.4 Pending completion of the procedure set out in this clause, and subject to this clause, a dispute must not be the subject of legal proceedings between any of the parties in dispute. If legal proceedings are initiated or continued in breach of this provision, a party to the dispute is entitled to apply for, and be granted, an order of the court adjourning those proceedings pending completion of the procedure set out in this clause.

#### 17.2 **Step 1: Notice of dispute**

- 17.2.1 A party to the dispute must promptly notify the other party to the dispute of:
  - 17.2.1.1 the nature of the dispute, giving reasonable details; and
  - 17.2.1.2 what action (if any) the party giving notice thinks will resolve the dispute.
- 17.2.2 A failure to give such notice does not entitle the other party to damages.

#### 17.3 **Step 2: Meeting of the parties**

A party to the dispute who complies with the previous step may at the same or a later time notify each other party to the dispute that the first party requires a meeting in Adelaide within 14 days after the giving of such notice. In that case, each party to the dispute must send to the meeting a senior manager of that party with authority to resolve the dispute and, at the meeting, make a good faith attempt to resolve the dispute.

#### 17.4 **Step 3: Mediation**

- 17.4.1 Despite whether any previous step was taken, a dispute not resolved within 30 days must be referred to mediation, on the following terms:
  - 17.4.1.1 The mediator must be a person agreed to by the parties in dispute or, if they cannot agree within 14 days, a mediator nominated by the then President of the South Australian Bar Association (or equivalent officer of any successor organisation).
  - 17.4.1.2 The role of a mediator is to assist in negotiating a resolution of a dispute. A mediator may not make a decision binding on a party unless that party has so agreed in writing.
  - 17.4.1.3 The mediation must take place in Adelaide.
  - 17.4.1.4 A party in dispute must cooperate in arranging and expediting mediation.
  - 17.4.1.5 A party in dispute must send to the mediation a senior manager with authority to resolve the dispute.
  - 17.4.1.6 The mediator may exclude lawyers acting for the parties in dispute and may co-opt expert assistance as the mediator thinks fit.
  - 17.4.1.7 A party in dispute may withdraw from mediation if there is reason to believe the mediator is not acting in confidence or with good faith or is acting for a purpose other than resolving the dispute.
  - 17.4.1.8 Unless otherwise agreed in writing:
    - 17.4.1.8.1 everything that occurs before the mediator is in confidence and in closed session;
    - 17.4.1.8.2 discussions (including admissions and concessions) are without prejudice and may not be called into evidence in any subsequent litigation by a party;
    - 17.4.1.8.3 documents brought into existence specifically for the purpose of the mediation may not be admitted in evidence in any subsequent legal proceedings by a party; and
    - 17.4.1.8.4 the parties in dispute must report back to the mediator within 14 days on actions taken, based on the outcome of the mediation.
- 17.4.2 A party in dispute need not spend more than one day in mediation for a matter under dispute.
- 17.4.3 A party in dispute must bear an equal share of the costs and expenses of the mediator and otherwise bears their own costs.

**PART 18—COMMITTEES****18.1 COMMITTEES**

- 18.1.1 The Board may establish a committee comprised of any persons for the purpose of enquiring into, and reporting to, the Board on any matter within the Authority's functions and powers and as detailed in the terms of reference given by the Board to the committee.
- 18.1.2 The Board may establish a committee comprised only of Directors for the purpose of exercising, performing or discharging delegated powers, functions or duties.
- 18.1.3 A member of a committee established under this Clause holds office at the pleasure of the Board.
- 18.1.4 The Chairperson of the Board is an *ex-officio* member of any committee established by the Board.

**PART 19—WINDING UP****19.1 WINDING UP**

The Authority may be wound up in circumstances that Schedule 2, Clause 16 (1) of the Act allows or requires.

**19.2 DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES ON WINDING UP**

In the event the Authority commences to wind up the Authority must vest in the Council all of the Authority's assets and liabilities.

**PART 20—OTHER MATTERS****20.1 EXECUTION OF DOCUMENTS**

As a matter of record, Schedule 2, Clause 37 of the Act governs the execution of documents by the Authority.

**20.2 PRINCIPAL OFFICE**

The Authority's principal office must be c/o Level 1, 38 Gawler Place, Adelaide or as the Board may determine otherwise.

**20.3 SERVICE OF DOCUMENTS**

- 20.3.1 A document to be given by the Authority to the Council, or by the Council to the Authority, may be given in a manner that section 280 of the Act permits.
- 20.3.2 A written notice given by the Authority to the Council must be marked, "Attention: Chief Executive Officer".

**20.4 CIRCUMSTANCES NOT PROVIDED FOR**

If any circumstances arise about which this Charter is silent, or are incapable of taking effect or being implemented according to its terms, the Board may consider the circumstances and determine the action to be taken.

### **2—Commencement**

This proclamation will come into operation on 1 July 2009.

### **3—Variation of boundaries of NRM regions**

The boundaries of the NRM regions are varied such that the boundaries of each region are as defined in the part of General Registry Office Plan No. GP27/2008 relevant to that region.

## **Public Sector Management (Shared Services SA (5)) Proclamation 2008**

under section 7 of the *Public Sector Management Act 1995*

### **1—Short title**

This proclamation may be cited as the *Public Sector Management (Shared Services SA (5)) Proclamation 2008*.

### **2—Commencement**

This proclamation will come into operation on 13 October 2008.

### **3—Transfer of employees to Department of Treasury and Finance (for Shared Services SA)**

- (1) The employees referred to in Schedule 1 are transferred from the Attorney-General's Department to the Department of Treasury and Finance.
- (2) The employees referred to in Schedule 2 are transferred from the Department of Education and Children's Services to the Department of Treasury and Finance.
- (3) If an employee whose employment is subject to a contract under section 34 or 40 of the *Public Sector Management Act 1995* is transferred to the Department of Treasury and Finance under this clause, the provisions of the contract will continue to apply in relation to the employee's employment in the Department as if the contract had been entered into between the employee and the Chief Executive of the Department, subject to any necessary modifications or further agreement between the employee and the Chief Executive.

### **4—Incorporation of employees into Department of Treasury and Finance (for Shared Services SA)**

- (1) The public sector employees of the South Australian Fire and Emergency Services Commission referred to in Schedule 3 are incorporated into the Department of Treasury and Finance.
- (2) For the purposes of determining entitlements with respect to recreation leave, sick leave and long service leave of those employees—
  - (a) the service of the employees with the South Australian Fire and Emergency Services Commission will be taken to have been service under the *Public Sector Management Act 1995*; and
  - (b) the employees will be taken to have continuity of employment without termination of the employees' service.
- (3) Each employee incorporated into the Department of Treasury and Finance under this clause who was, immediately before incorporation, employed under a contract on a temporary or casual basis, or for a fixed term, will be taken to be appointed to the Department subject to a contract entered into between the employee and the Chief Executive of the Department under section 34 or 40 of the *Public Sector Management Act 1995* (as the case may require) on the same conditions and, if applicable, for the balance of the term of the contract in existence immediately before incorporation.
