## CROWN LAND MANAGEMENT ACT 2009



  - 'Except where (a), (b), (c), (d) or (e) applies, the office:
    - (a) forms part of a mixed use development;
    - (b) is within Precinct 1 Anzac Highway;
    - (c) is within the Local Commercial Policy Area 3;
    - (d) is within the District Commercial Policy Area 2; and
    - (e) is within the Office Park Policy Area 4.'
- (b) amend PDC 1 within the District Commercial Policy Area 2 by adding the land use 'office' in alphabetical order to the list of envisaged forms of development; and
- (c) fix the day on which this notice is published in the *Gazette* as the day on which the amendment will come into operation.

PURSUANT to Section 29 (2) (b) (ii) of the Development Act 1993, I amend the West Torrens Council Development Plan consolidated on 18 July 2011 as follows:

- (a) replace the following maps with the contents of 'Attachment A':
  - (i) Council Index Map;
  - (ii) Zone Map WeTo/14; and
  - (iii) Policy Area Map WeTo/14;
- (b) amend the Map Reference Table by deleting the reference to Zone Map WeTo/14 as aligned with the Local Centre Zone listing; and



WEST TORRENS COUNCIL





## ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION ACT 1993

*Vary the Approval of Category B Containers*

I, ANDREA KAYE WOODS, Delegate of the Environment Protection Authority ('the Authority'), pursuant to Section 68 of the Environment Protection Act 1993 (SA) ('the Act') hereby:

*Vary the Approval of Category B Containers*

Approve as Category B Containers, subject to the conditions 1-4 below, each of the classes of containers identified by reference to the following matters described in the first 4 columns of Schedule 1 of this Notice which are sold in South Australia:

- (a) the product which each class of containers shall contain;
  - (b) the size of the containers;
  - (c) the type of containers; and
  - (d) the name of the holders of these approvals.
- (1) That containers of the class to which the approval relates must bear the refund marking specified by the Authority for containers of that class. The Authority specifies the following refund markings for Category B containers:
    - (i) '10c refund at collection depots when sold in SA', or
    - (ii) '10c refund at SA/NT collection depots in State/Territory of purchase'.
  - (2) The holder of the approval must have in place an effective and appropriate waste management arrangement in relation to containers of that class. For the purpose of this approval notice the company named in Column 5 of Schedule 1 of this Notice is the nominated super collector.
  - (3) In the case of an approval in relation to category B containers that the waste management arrangement must require the holder of the approval to provide specified super collectors with a declaration in the form determined by the Authority in relation to each sale of such containers by the holder of the approval as soon as practicable after the sale.
  - (4) The holder of these approvals must ensure that if a sticker bearing the refund marking has been approved, and is applied to the container, then the sticker must not be placed on any portion of the opening mechanism or in any other place that would require complete or partial removal of the sticker before the contents may be consumed.

## FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007: SECTION 115

TAKE notice that pursuant to Section 115 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, Anthony Lever, 78 Murray Street, Wentworth, S.A. 2648, (the 'exemption holder'), of River Fishery Licence No. R32, is exempt from Section 53 (2) of the Fisheries Management Act 2007 and Regulation 7 (b) (i) and Clause 6 of Schedule 6 of the Fisheries Management (General) Regulations 2007, but only insofar as he may use the device described in Schedule 1 to take carp, bony bream and other non-native species in the areas specified in Schedule 2 for the purpose of trade or business (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3, from 6 October 2011 until 6 October 2012, unless varied or revoked earlier. Exemption No. 9902475.

## SCHEDULE 1

'Carp net'—a gill net with a ply greater than 5, having a maximum length of 50 m and a minimum mesh size of 10 cm and a maximum mesh size not exceeding 18 cm.

The exemption holder may conduct fishing activities pursuant to his licence R32 in all backwaters of the River Murray excluding the following areas according to the table below:

The licence holder may conduct fishing operations within the closure areas and periods listed above if given written approval by the Director of Fisheries to undertake specified carp eradication work in a specified area for a specified period.

## SCHEDULE 3

1. The exemption holder must not use more than 30 carp nets at any one time in permitted backwaters of the River Murray.
2. The exemption holder must not have more than 30 carp nets in his possession at any time when he is deploying carp nets in the backwaters of the River Murray.
3. The exemption holder may only engage in the exempted activity when also fishing pursuant to River Fishery Licence No. R32 and may only use a boat to engage in the exempted activity if that boat is registered by endorsement on River Fishery Licence No. R32.
4. The exemption holder must not cause or permit a person to act as his agent when engaged in the exempted activity unless that person may lawfully act as an agent for the exemption holder in relation to River Fishery Licence No. R32.
5. All native fish (excluding bony bream and yabbies) taken in the course of the exempted activity must be immediately returned to the water.
6. Immediately prior to commencing the exempted activity, the exemption holder must contact the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 and provide the following details:
  - The licence number and person(s) conducting the activity.
  - The exact location(s) of the fishing activities.
  - The number of carp nets being used.
  - Exemption No. 9902475.

7. The exemption holder must ensure that the carp nets are checked and all fish removed at least once during each 24 hour period.

8. When the exemption holder moves the carp nets more than 3 km from the reported location of the nets under Condition 6, or removes the nets from the River completely, the exemption holder must again report to PIRSA Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 and provide either details, as required under Condition 6 of this exemption notice, or report that fishing with carp nets has ceased.

9. While engaged in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer as requested.

10. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Management Act 2007, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

made under section 250 of the *Local Government Act 1999*

### 1 Definitions

In this by-law:

- 1.1 **Authorised Person** has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 1.2 **Building** includes any structure and/or fixture of any kind whether for human habitation or not;
- 1.3 **Electoral Matter** has the same meaning as in the *Electoral Act 1985*;
- 1.4 **Emergency Worker** has the same meaning as in the *Criminal Law Consolidation Act 1935*;
- 1.5 **Permission** means the permission of the Council, or such other person as the Council may by resolution authorise for that purpose, given in writing prior to the act, event or activity to which it relates;
- 1.6 **Permit Holder** means a person granted permission under paragraph 5;
- 1.7 **the Council** means the local government council that has adopted this by-law;
- 1.8 **Wheeled Recreational Device** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961*.

### 2 Activities Requiring Permission

A person must not without Permission in a pedestrian mall or in the vicinity of a pedestrian mall:

- 2.1 Amplification  
use an amplifier or other device whether mechanical or electrical for the purpose of amplifying sound;
- 2.2 Athletic and Ball Sports and Games
  - 2.2.1 promote, organise or take part in any athletic sport, ball sport or game;
  - 2.2.2 play or practice any game which is likely to cause damage to the pedestrian mall or any fixtures or fittings thereon;
- 2.3 Burials and Memorials
  - 2.3.1 spread the ashes of any human or animal remains;
  - 2.3.2 erect any memorial;
- 2.4 Erection of Structures
  - 2.4.1 erect a fence or hoarding;
  - 2.4.2 erect, place, use or allow to remain:
    - 2.4.2.1 a ladder, step-ladder, trestle, stage, scaffolding, planter box, crate or any item used as a platform; or

- 2.4.2.2 any other equipment, appliance, object or material likely to cause an obstruction or danger to any person;
- 2.4.3 park, place, use or allow to remain a mobile crane, scissor lift, elevated platform vehicle or cherry picker;
- 2.5 Firearms and Fireworks  
use, discharge or explode any firearms or fireworks;
- 2.6 Model Aircraft and Cars  
fly or operate a model aircraft or model/remote control car which by the use thereof may cause or be likely to cause injury or discomfort to any person being in the pedestrian mall or detract from or be likely to detract from another person's lawful use of and enjoyment of the pedestrian mall;
- 2.7 Organised Ceremonies and Events etc  
hold, conduct or participate in a funeral, marriage ceremony, picnic, or other like event or entertainment;
- 2.8 Overhanging Articles  
suspend or hang any article or thing from any building, verandah, pergola, post or other structure;
- 2.9 Rubbish and Rubbish Dumps  
remove, disperse or interfere with any rubbish (including bottles, newspapers, cans, containers or packaging etc) that has been discarded in a Council bin;
- 2.10 Touting for Business  
tout for business.

### 3 **Prohibited Activities**

A person must not in a pedestrian mall or in the vicinity of a pedestrian mall:

- 3.1 Birds  
feed any bird;
- 3.2 Climbing  
climb on or over any fixture, fitting, plant, object or building;
- 3.3 Damaging or Defacing Property
  - 3.3.1 deface, damage, paint, write, cut names or make marks on any tree, rock, gate, fence, building, sign or other property of the Council;
  - 3.3.2 attach any object, including an animal on a leash or a bike to any tree, gate, fence or other fixture other than a designated bicycle rack;
- 3.4 Glass  
wilfully break any glass, china or other brittle material;
- 3.5 Interference with Permitted Use  
interrupt, disrupt or interfere with any other person's use of the pedestrian mall which is permitted or for which Permission has been granted;
- 3.6 Missiles  
throw, roll or discharge any stone, substance or missile to the danger of any person, property or animal;

### 3.7 Playing Games

play or practice a game:

- 3.7.1 which is likely to cause damage to the pedestrian mall or anything in it or in the vicinity of the pedestrian mall; or
- 3.7.2 which endangers the safety or interferes with the comfort of any person; or
- 3.7.3 in any area where a sign indicates that the game is prohibited;

### 3.8 Public conveniences

- 3.8.1 urinate other than in a urinal or pan or defecate other than in a pan set apart for that purpose, in a public convenience;
- 3.8.2 deposit anything in a pan, urinal or drain in a public convenience which is likely to cause a blockage;
- 3.8.3 use a public convenience for a purpose for which it was not designed or constructed;
- 3.8.4 enter any public convenience that is set aside for use of the opposite gender except:
  - 3.8.4.1 if the person is under the age of eight years accompanying an adult; or
  - 3.8.4.2 to provide assistance to a disabled person; or
  - 3.8.4.3 in the case of a genuine emergency;

### 3.9 Wheeled Recreational Devices

use a Wheeled Recreational Device.

## 4 **Removal of Obstructions**

If an object is obstructing any part of a pedestrian mall then the Council may remove the object provided that this paragraph does not apply to any object that has been placed in the pedestrian mall with the Permission of the Council or by some other lawful authority.

## 5 **Permits**

- 5.1 Where this by-law requires that Permission be obtained, any person seeking the grant of Permission must submit an application to the Council in the form (if any) and accompanied by the fee (if any) prescribed by the Council.
  - 5.1.1 The Council, or such other person as the Council may by resolution authorise for that purpose, may attach such conditions (including but not limited to time limits, renewal and transfer requirements) to a grant of Permission as it thinks fit, and may vary or revoke such conditions or impose new conditions by notice in writing to the Permit Holder.
  - 5.1.2 A Permit Holder must comply with every such condition.
  - 5.1.3 The Council, or such other person as the Council may by resolution authorise for that purpose, may suspend or revoke such grant of Permission at any time by notice in writing to the Permit Holder.
- 5.2 The Council may by resolution fix, vary or revoke fees or charges for the granting of Permission for any of the activities listed in paragraph 2 of this by-law.

**6 Offences and Penalties**

6.1 A person who contravenes, or fails to comply with, this by-law is guilty of an offence.

Maximum penalty: \$750

6.2 A person who is convicted of an offence against this by-law in respect of a continuing act or omission is liable, in addition to the penalty otherwise applicable to the offence, to a maximum penalty of \$50 for each day during which the act or omission continued.

**7 Exemptions**

The restrictions in this by-law do not apply to any police officer, emergency worker, Council Officer or employee of the Council acting in the course and within the scope of that person's normal duties, or to a contractor while performing work for the Council.
