Magistrates Court of South Australia
Amendment No. 41 to the Magistrates Court
(Civil) Rules 1992

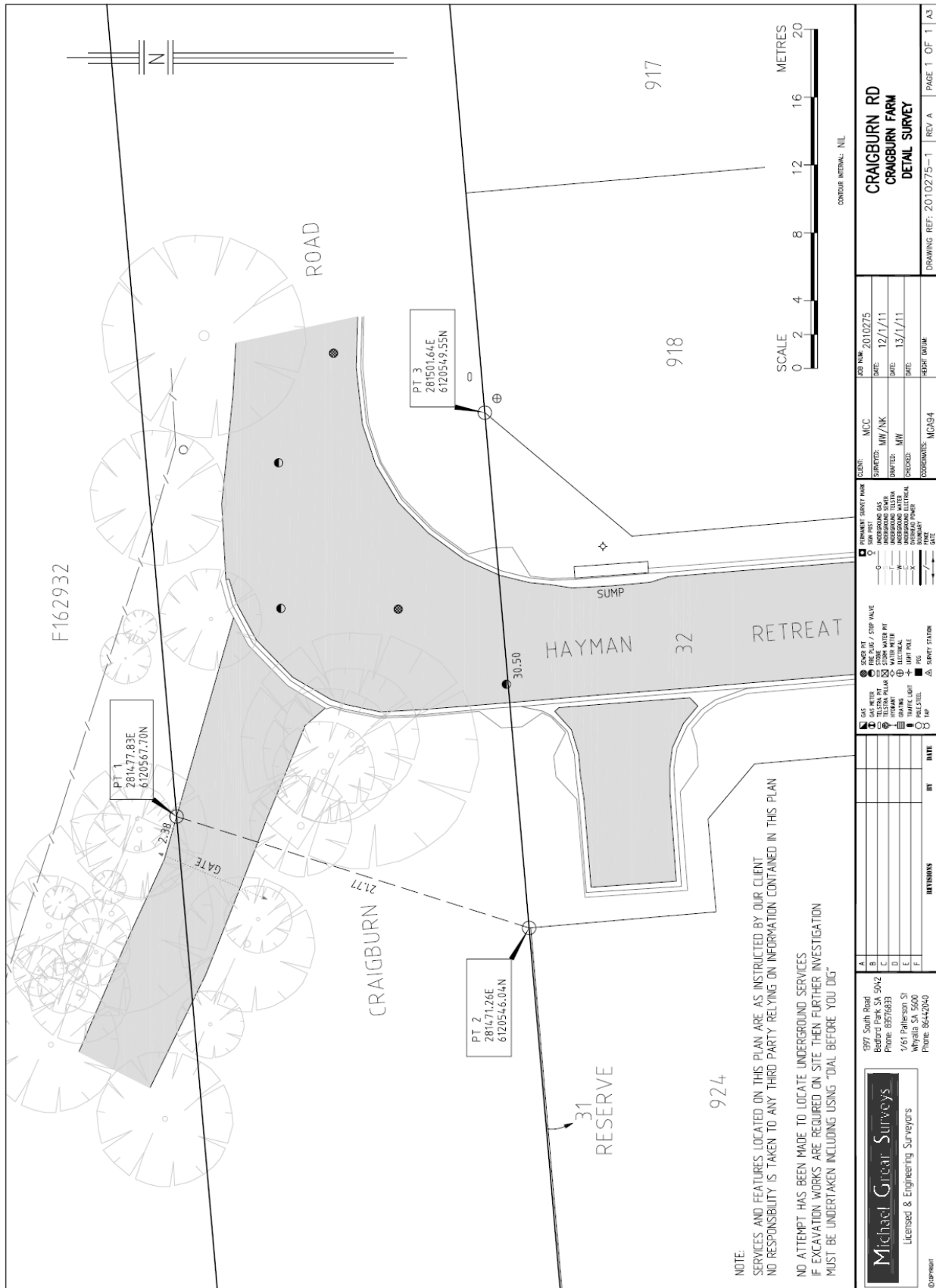
