DEVELOPMENT ACT 1993

Provision of Truss Information

Preamble

1. The Development (Trusses) Variation Regulations 2011, were made by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council on 29 September 2011 and were published in the *Gazette* on the same day.

2. The Development (Trusses) Variation Regulations 2011, will come into operation on 1 July 2012.

3. Regulation 74 A requires a person who is engaged to manufacture a roof truss to furnish information to specified parties, in a manner determined by the Minister, for the purposes of the Regulation.

NOTICE

FOR the purpose of Regulation 74 A, the information must be furnished in the following manner:

- (a) The information must be sent in a manner that it is received by the parties specified in Regulation 74 A (1) within one business day of it being sent.
- (b) If the information is sent electronically, there must be a record that the message was received, such as a 'read receipt'.

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007: SECTION 79

TAKE note that the notice made under Section 79 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, dated 22 March 2012, referring to the Spencer Gulf Prawn Fishery, is hereby revoked.

Take note that the notice made under Section 79 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, dated 12 January 2012 and published in the *South Australian Government Gazette* dated 19 January 2012, on page 222, being the third notice on that page, referring to the Spencer Gulf Prawn Fishery, is hereby varied such that it will not be unlawful for a person fishing pursuant to a Spencer Gulf Prawn Fishery Licence to use prawn trawl nets in the areas specified in Schedule 1, during the period specified in Schedule 2 and under the conditions specified in Schedule 3.

OPERATION OF MOTOR GRADER TOWING TWO TRAILERS UP TO 26 METRES IN LENGTH FOR USE IN ROAD CONSTRUCTION AND/OR ROAD MAINTENANCE**1. APPROVAL**

- 1.1 I hereby approve motor graders towing two trailers up to an overall length of 26 m, to travel on regional Council roads, for the purpose of road construction and/or road maintenance of regional Council roads.

2. EXEMPTION

- 2.1 I hereby exempt a motor grader, operating under the terms and conditions of this notice, from the following provisions of the *Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Rules 1999*:
- 2.1.1 Part 5, Division 1, Regulation 27(4)—Steering;
- 2.1.2 Part 8, Division 8, Regulation 94—Vehicles needing Side Marker Lights.
- 2.2 I hereby exempt a motor grader, operating under the terms and conditions of this notice, from the following provisions of the *Road Traffic (Oversize or Overmass Vehicle Exemptions) Regulations 1999*:
- 2.2.1 Part 3, Regulation 25—Prohibition on towing other vehicles.
- 2.3 I hereby exempt trailers towed in combination with a motor grader, operating under terms and conditions of this notice, from the following provisions of the *Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Rules 1999*:
- 2.3.1 Part 8, Division 7—Clearance Lights;
- 2.3.2 Part 8, Division 8—Side Marker Lights;
- 2.3.3 Part 8, Division 19—Other Lights, Reflectors, Rear Marking Plates or Signals;
- 2.3.4 Rule 132—Trailer braking requirements.

3. CONDITIONS

- 3.1 The motor grader and two trailer combination is only permitted to travel on a regional council road or road related area for the purpose of:
- 3.1.1 Undertaking activities involved directly with road construction and/or road maintenance; or
- 3.1.2 Transport from a place of road construction and/or road maintenance operation to another place of road construction and/or road maintenance.
- 3.2 The motor grader and two trailer combination shall not be driven or used on a road or road related area between the hours of sunset and sunrise as specified in the *Proof of Sunrise and Sunset Act 1923*, as amended, and published in the *South Australian Government Gazette*.
- 3.3 The motor grader and two trailer combination shall not be driven or used on a road or road related area during periods of low visibility.
- Note:** For the purpose of this notice ‘a period of low visibility’ means any time when, owing to insufficient daylight or unfavourable conditions, persons or vehicles on a road are not clearly visible at a distance of 250 m to a person of normal vision.
- 3.4 The vehicle combination shall not travel within the ‘Adelaide Area (Metropolitan)’ or the ‘Adelaide Hills Area’.
- Note:** For the purposes of this notice, the ‘Adelaide Area (Metropolitan)’ is defined as the area described in ‘Map 1 Adelaide Area (Metropolitan)—Overwidth Agricultural Vehicles’ of this notice.
- Note:** For the purposes of this notice the ‘Adelaide Hills Area’ is defined as the shaded areas shown in ‘Map 2, Adelaide Hills Area—Overwidth Agricultural Vehicles’ of this notice.
- 3.5 The motor grader and two trailer combination shall not be operated at a speed exceeding 40 km/h.
- 3.6 The motor grader and two trailer combination may cross DPTI roads only if the combination does not exceed 19 m in length.
- 3.7 That all vehicles in combination shall be appropriately registered (e.g. not registered for use on worksites only).
- 3.8 The sum of the load carrying capacity of tyres fitted to each unit of the combination must match the manufacturer’s gross vehicle mass (GVM), or gross trailer mass (GCM) of that vehicle, where applicable. If no GVM or GTM is specified then statutory axle mass limits will apply.
- 3.9 The motor grader and two trailer combination shall not exceed statutory axle mass limits.
- 3.10 The motor grader and two trailer combination shall not exceed manufacturer’s GVM and/or GTM for each vehicle in the combination, where applicable.
- 3.11 The tow coupling attached to each vehicle in the combination must be of a sufficient rating for its use in the combination.

- 3.12 When in transit, any road construction equipment (e.g. towed roller) in the combination, must travel without any additional weight added (ie. No ballast).
- 3.13 The motor grader shall display a warning light or lights (revolving yellow flashing lights) so that the light emanating from at least one of them is clearly visible at a distance of 500 m in any direction and which meet the following specifications:
- 3.13.1 Emit a rotating, flashing, yellow coloured light; and
 - 3.13.2 Flash at a rate between 120 and 200 times per minute; and
 - 3.13.3 Have a power of at least 55 watts; and
 - 3.13.4 Not be a strobe light.
- 3.14 Warning light(s) shall be either permanently connected into the electrical system of the vehicle or use standard automotive connectors to allow easy electrical disconnection and removal of the light(s) when not required.
- 3.15 Warning light(s) shall have incorporated into their electrical system, an 'on/off' switch control which is located within easy reach of the driver, when seated in the driving position.

The motor grader and two trailer combination shall be fitted with:

- 3.16 A 'Long Vehicle' warning sign complying with Part 6, Section 60, Section 61 and Section 62 of the *Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Rules 1999*.
- 3.17 A audible warning device complying with Rule 34 of the *Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Rules 1999*, if the vehicle was manufactured on or after 1 July 1996.
- 3.18 A rear vision mirror or mirrors complying with the requirements of Rules 35 and 36 of the *Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Rules 1999*.
- 3.19 Parking lights that operate effectively and clearly visible, if the motor grader and two trailer combination is left standing on a road or road related area between the hours of sunset and sunrise or during periods of low visibility.
- 3.20 Clearance lights and side marker lights that operate effectively and clearly visible, if the motor grader and two trailer combination is left standing on a road or road related area between the hours of sunset and sunrise or during periods of low visibility.
- 3.21 Service brakes:
- 3.21.1 Operating on four or more wheels complying with the performance requirements of Rule 128 of the *Road Traffic (Vehicles Standards) Rules 1999*; or
 - 3.21.2 Utilising a vehicular transmission retardation system commonly referred to as a 'hydrostatic braking system', complying with the performance requirements of Rule 128 of the *Road Traffic (Vehicles Standards) Rules 1999*.
- 3.22 A parking brake that operates on at least two wheels and that is capable of holding the vehicle stationary on a 12 per cent gradient.
- 3.23 An actuating mechanism for the parking brake that incorporates a device that prevents accidental release of that mechanism and holds the brake in the applied position unless intentionally released by the driver.

NOTES

For the purpose of this notice a vehicle which incorporates a positive transmission locking system that operates by locking two transmission gears together or engaging a transmission parking pawl is deemed to satisfy the requirements of Clauses 3.22 and 3.23 above provided that the mechanism is capable of holding the vehicle stationary on a 12 per cent gradient.

In accordance with Rule 226 of the *Australian Road Rules* a person shall not drive a vehicle with a GVM over 12 tonnes unless the vehicle is equipped with at least 3 portable warning triangles that must be used in accordance with Rule 227 of the *Australian Road Rules*. If the GVM of the vehicle is not specified, the unladen mass of the vehicle shall apply.





Higher payroll tax receipts for the September quarter 2011 compared with the same period a year ago reflects growth in taxable payrolls.

September quarter land tax receipts are typically low relative to the full year estimate, as they mainly comprise the final instalment of the previous year's land tax assessment for taxpayers who choose to pay in quarterly instalments. Taxpayers who pay annually mainly pay a single amount in either the December or March quarters.

Stamp duty receipts were lower in the September quarter 2011 compared to the same period a year ago. This was mainly due to softer property market conditions which are affecting conveyance duty revenue, and the timing of receipts relating to stamp duty on motor vehicle registrations and transfers and renewal certificates for Compulsory Third Party insurance from the Department of Transport.

Royalties

Higher royalty receipts for the September quarter 2011 compared with the same period in 2010 mainly relate to higher royalties from Olympic Dam due to the return to full production and higher royalties due to increased mineral prices.

Fees and charges

The increase in fees and charges for the September quarter 2011 compared with the same period in 2010 mainly reflects the increase in guarantee fees received.

Commonwealth – General Purpose Grants

Growth in general purpose grants between the first quarter of 2011-12 and the corresponding quarter for 2010-11 is not indicative of underlying Goods and Services Tax (GST) revenue growth. This is because monthly grants are paid according to a payment schedule prepared by the Commonwealth Government at the commencement of a financial year rather than in accordance with the actual emerging monthly GST collections.

In its 2011-12 Budget, the Commonwealth Government estimated the GST pool would grow by 6.4% in 2011-12.

Commonwealth – Specific Purpose Grants

Specific Purpose Grants for the September quarter 2011 were higher than the same period for the previous year mainly due to the annual indexation arrangements for grant payments and increased funding for disability services.

Commonwealth - National Partnership Payments

Prior to 2011-12, National Partnership funding received by the Consolidated Account was recognised at the end of the year, although payments were received throughout the year in accordance with the terms of the National Partnership Agreements. From 2011-12, National Partnership Payments received by the Consolidated Account will be recorded in the quarter in which they are received from the Commonwealth.

Receipts in the September quarter 2011 were lower than those attributed to the same quarter in 2010 (\$13.9 million) due to the phasing out of payments made under the Commonwealth's First Home Owners Boost scheme, which applied to eligible first home contacts entered into between 14 October 2008 and 31 December 2009

Payments

Payments were made pursuant to the *Appropriation Act 2011* and also in accordance with other Acts for which specific appropriation has been authorized.

Payments made from the Consolidated Account, for the September quarter, were higher than the same period in 2010-11 due mainly to the timing of the past service superannuation payment.

Note

Caution should be exercised in interpreting the quarterly statement of Consolidated Account transactions. Unlike the State Budget, which comprises transactions on an accrual basis, the information reflected in the quarterly statements is limited to cash transactions. Also, the Consolidated Account does not capture all the transactions undertaken by the general government sector (in particular, it does not record receipts to and payments from special deposit accounts). Finally, the timing of receipts and payments could be volatile within a particular year. As a result, apparently large movements between years may only be due to changes in the timing of receipts and payments and therefore may not have consequences for the underlying budget position.



SUPREME COURT CRIMINAL RULES 1992
(Amendment No. 29)

BY virtue and in pursuance of Section 72 of the Supreme Court Act 1935, and all other enabling powers, We, Judges of the Supreme Court of South Australia, make the following Supreme Court Criminal Rules 1992, (Amendment No. 29).

1. These Rules may be cited as the “*Supreme Court Criminal Rules 1992* (Amendment No 29)”.
2. The *Supreme Court Criminal Rules 1992* are amended as set out below.
3. This amendment will commence on 1 April 2012, or upon its gazettal, whichever is the later.
4. A new Rule 32 is inserted immediately after Rule 31 as follows:

“Notices of Intention to Adduce Evidence of Discreditable Conduct under s 34P of the *Evidence Act 1929*”

32.01 The Notice required by s 34P(4) of the *Evidence Act 1929* of an intention to adduce evidence of a discreditable conduct is:

- (a) in the case of a Notice being given by the Director of Public Prosecutions (State or Commonwealth), to be in Form 25;
- (b) in all other cases, and whether the evidence is to be led in evidence-in-chief or adduced in cross-examination, to be in Form 26.

32.02 The Notice must be filed in the Court and served on all other parties to the proceedings:

- (a) in the case of a Notice by the Director of Public Prosecutions (State or Commonwealth), no later than 21 days after the date on which the proceedings are listed for trial;
- (b) in all other cases, not less than 21 days before the listed trial date.

32.03 Any party who intends to object to the admission of proposed evidence of discreditable conduct must file in the Court and serve on all other parties to the proceedings a written Notice of Objection using Form 27.

32.04 The Notice of Objection under Rule 32.03 must be filed in the Court and served on all other parties to the proceedings:

- (a) in the case of an objection to evidence proposed to be led by the Director of Public Prosecutions (State or Commonwealth), no later than 28 days after the filing of the Director’s Notice;
- (b) in all other cases, not less than seven days before the listed trial date.

32.05 The Court may enlarge or shorten the time within which any Notice under this Rule may be filed and served.”

District Court (Criminal And Miscellaneous)
Rules 1992
(Amendment No. 11)

BY virtue and in pursuance of Section 51 of the District Court Act 1991 and all other enabling powers, we, Terence Anthony Worthington, Chief Judge, and Dean Ernest Clayton, and Kevin Gordon Nicholson, Judges of the District Court of South Australia, do hereby make the following Rules of Court:

1. These Rules may be cited as the “District Court (Criminal and Miscellaneous) Rules 1992 (Amendment No 11)”.
2. The District Court (Criminal and Miscellaneous) Rules 1992 are amended as set out below.

- (a) provide for the adjustment of aggregate base premiums and total remuneration so that they apply on an annualised basis in cases where the period to which the premium payable by a particular employer is less than 12 months; and
 - (b) rely on estimates at the beginning of a particular premium period and then adjust an assignment of an employer to a particular category at the time that an adjusted premium or a hindsight premium payable by the employer falls to be determined.
- (4) Nothing in this regulation limits or affects the ability of the Corporation to aggregate base premiums or total remuneration of all employers within a group so as to determine the category into which all employers within the group will be assigned.
