the Livestock (Restrictions on Entry of Aquaculture Stock) Notice 2008. Such an approval must be made available upon request.

8. The permit holder must report any diseases and must not import any diseases into the State.

9. A screen of durable material must be erected at the overflow point to stop any movement of ova, fry or adult fish from the dam and into the local catchment.

10. While engaged in the permitted activity, the permit holder or his agents must be in possession of a copy of this permit. It must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Officer if requested.

11. The permit holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Management Act 2007, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically permitted by this notice.

1. DEFINITIONS

In this Notice:

- 1.1 'Primary Notice' means the Notice of Approval and Exemption titled 'Operation of Road Train Vehicles in South Australia', dated 19 August 2011;
- 1.2 'Supplementary Notice' means this Supplementary Notice for the 'Operation of Road Train vehicles in South Australia greater than 25 m and up to 30 m in length'; and
- 1.3 'Code of Practice' means the Code of Practice for Road Trains, dated August 2011 as issued by the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure.

2. VARIATION OF CONDITIONS FOR APPROVED VEHICLES

- 2.1 The minimum length for a Road Train as prescribed in Clause 15.2 of the Code of Practice is hereby varied such that the overall length must be greater than 25 m and up to 30 m.

3. CONTINUED COMPLIANCE WITH THE PRIMARY NOTICE

- 3.1 A driver of an Approved Vehicle must continue to comply with all conditions and requirements of the Primary Notice, except as varied by this notice.
- 3.2 You must carry a legible, current and complete copy of this Notice either in hardcopy or in an electronic format so that it can be read from a device having a visual display (e.g. smart phone, tablet or laptop PC, in vehicle unit) that is carried within the vehicle and that is accessible, to a DPTI Authorised Officer appointed under the *Road Traffic Act 1961* or a Police Officer, from outside the vehicle.
