BUILDING WORK CONTRACTORS ACT 1995

Exemption

TAKE notice that, pursuant to Section 45 of the Building Work Contractors Act 1995, I, Paul White, Commissioner for Consumer Affairs, do hereby exempt the licensee named in Schedule 1 from the application of Division 3 of Part 5 of the above Act in relation to domestic building work described in Schedule 2 and subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3.

SCHEDULE 2

Construction of an extension to a house that is to be the family residence of Michael J. Farrugia and Sonya Williams, on land situated at Allotment 82 in Deposited Plan 3349 in the area named Glengowrie, Hundred of Noarlunga (Certificate of Title Volume 5716, Folio 397).

SCHEDULE 3

1. This exemption is limited to domestic building work personally performed by the licensee in relation to the construction of an extension to a house that is to be the family residence of Michael J. Farrugia and Sonya Farrugia, on land situated at Allotment 82 in Deposited Plan 3349 in the area named Glengowrie, Hundred of Noarlunga (Certificate of Title Volume 5716, Folio 397).

2. This exemption does not apply to any domestic building work the licensee sub-contracts to another building work contractor, for which that contractor is required by law to hold building indemnity insurance.

3. That the licensee does not transfer his interest in the land prior to five years from the date of completion of the building work the subject of this exemption, without the prior authorisation of the Commissioner for Consumer Affairs. Before giving such authorisation, the Commissioner for Consumer Affairs may require the licensee to take any reasonable steps to protect the future purchaser(s) of the property, including but not limited to:

- providing evidence that an adequate policy of building indemnity insurance is in force to cover the balance of the five-year period from the date of completion of the building work the subject of this exemption;
- providing evidence of an independent expert inspection of the building work the subject of this exemption;
- making an independent expert report available to prospective purchasers of the property; and
- giving prospective purchasers of the property notice of the absence of a policy of building indemnity insurance.

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007: SECTION 79

TAKE note that the notice made under Section 79 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, dated 25 March 2014, and published in the *South Australian Government Gazette* on page 1326, dated 27 March 2014, being the first notice on that page, referring to the West Coast Prawn Fishery is hereby varied.

The notice is varied to:

1. Amend Schedule 2, by replacing Condition 5 with the following condition:

No fishing activity may be undertaken between the prescribed times of sunrise and sunset for Adelaide (as published in the *South Australian Government Gazette* pursuant to the requirements of the Proof of Sunrise and Sunset Act 1923) during the period specified in Schedule 3.

2. Amend Schedule 3 by replacing the relevant period with the following period:

Commence at sunset on 4 April 2014 and end at sunrise on 7 April 2014.

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007: SECTION 115

TAKE notice that pursuant to Section 115 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, Jessica Farley of CSIRO Marine and Atmospheric Research, Castray Esplanade, Hobart, Tasmania 7000 and Michael Dodd, holder of Charter Boat Fishery Licence H084 and his registered master/s and assisting agents (the 'exemption holder'), are exempt from Sections 55 and 70 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, Regulation 7 and Clause 67 of Schedule 6 of the Fisheries Management (General) Regulations 2007 and Condition 5661 of Charter Boat Fishery Licence H084, but only insofar as they may engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1, (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 2, from 8 April 2014 until 30 May 2014, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

The collection of 10 Southern Bluefin Tuna (SBT) *Thunnus maccoyii* using a vessel registered on Charter Boat Fishery Licence H084 for research purposes (in waters of the State, excluding marine park sanctuary zones and aquatic reserves).

SCHEDULE 2

1. SBT collected by the exemption holder are for scientific and research purposes only and are to be provided directly to CSIRO Marine and Atmospheric Research.

2. The collection of SBT on behalf of CSIRO for research purposes can be undertaken by the licence holder, registered master, assisting agent and customers on-board the Charter Boat Fishery Licence H084.

3. The licence holder, registered master, assisting agent and customers on-board may only undertake the exempted activity for the purpose of collecting SBT for scientific research pursuant to this notice.

4. A maximum of 10 SBT weighing less than 2 kg may be collected during the exempted period and each SBT must be identified with a tag addressed to Jessica Farley of CSIRO. SBT collected under this exemption must be kept separately to SBT taken by customers of the charter boat.

5. The customers of the charter boat can still take their recreational charter boat fishing daily bag limits.

6. Before collecting any SBT pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder or a person acting as an agent must contact the PIRSA Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 and answer a series of questions about the exempted activity. The exemption holder will need to have a copy of the exemption at the time of making the call and be able to provide information about the area and time of the exempted activity, the vehicles and/or boats involved, the number of agents undertaking the exempted activity and other related questions. Exemption No. ME9902691.

7. The exemption holder must report to the Executive Director of Fisheries within seven days of collecting the 10 SBT and provide it to the Executive Director, Fisheries and Aquaculture, G.P.O. Box 1625, Adelaide, S.A. 5001.

8. While engaged in the exempted activity, the exemption holder or agent must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a Fisheries Officer if requested.

9. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Management Act 2007 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

This notice does not purport to override the provisions or operation of any other Act including but not limited to the Marine Parks Act 2007. The exemption holder and his agents must comply with any relevant regulations, permits, requirements and directions from the Department of Environment, Water and Natural Resources when undertaking activities within a marine park.

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007: SECTION 115

TAKE notice that pursuant to Section 115 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, Kieran Sheridan of Urban Virons Group, 24-26 Tikalara Street, Regency Park, S.A. 5010 (the 'exemption holder') is exempt from Section 70 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, and Regulation 7 and 10, Clause 72, 73 of Schedule 6 and 'other waters' as defined in Schedule 7 of the Fisheries Management (General) Regulations 2007, but only insofar as they may take fish in the waters set out in Schedule 1 using the gear specified in Schedule 2 (the exempted activity), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3, from 8 April 2014 until 30 June 2014, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

- Stebonheath wetlands, Munno Para.

SCHEDULE 2

- 1 x seine net with a minimum mesh size of 19 mm and a maximum length of 75 m.

SCHEDULE 3

1. The exemption holders may only take non-native species of fish and must immediately destroy them.

2. The non-native species of fish taken must be disposed of appropriately at an approved waste facility and must not be used for any commercial purpose.

3. The exemption holders must immediately return to the water all native fish captured incidentally while undertaking this exempted activity.

4. The exemption holder must notify PIRSA Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 at least two hours prior to conducting the exempted activity and answer a series of questions about the exempted activity. The exemption holder will need to have a copy of the exemption notice at the time of making the call, and be able to provide information about the area and time of the exempted activity, the vehicles and boats involved, the number of agents undertaking the exempted activity and other related questions. Exemption No. ME9902694.

5. The exemption holder must provide a written report to the Executive Director, Fisheries and Aquaculture at (G.P.O. Box 1625, Adelaide, S.A. 5001) within fourteen days of the completion of each collection made pursuant to this exemption, providing details of the numbers, location, time and conditions of the collection.

6. While engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder or agent must be in possession of a copy of this notice and such a notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Officer if requested.

7. The exemption holders must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Management Act 2007, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION ACT 1993

Vary the Approval of Category B Containers

I, ANDREA KAYE WOODS, Delegate of the Environment Protection Authority ('the Authority'), pursuant to Section 68 of the Environment Protection Act 1993 (SA) ('the Act') hereby:

Vary the Approval of Category B Containers

Approve as Category B Containers, subject to the Conditions 1-4 below, each of the classes of containers identified by reference to the following matters described in the first 4 columns of Schedule 1 of this Notice which are sold in South Australia:

- (a) the product which each class of containers shall contain;
 - (b) the size of the containers;
 - (c) the type of containers;
 - (d) the name of the holders of these approvals.
- (1) That containers of the class to which the approval relates must bear the refund marking specified by the Authority for containers of that class. The Authority specifies the following refund markings for Category B Containers:
 - (i) '10c refund at collection depots when sold in SA', or
 - (ii) '10c refund at SA/NT collection depots in State/Territory of purchase'.
 - (2) The holder of the approval must have in place an effective and appropriate waste management arrangement in relation to containers of that class. For the purpose of this approval notice the company named in Column 5 of Schedule 1 of this Notice is the nominated super collector.
 - (3) In the case of an approval in relation to Category B Containers that the waste management arrangement must require the holder of the approval to provide specified super collectors with a declaration in the form determined by the Authority in relation to each sale of such containers by the holder of the approval as soon as practicable after the sale.
 - (4) The holder of these approvals must ensure that if a sticker bearing the refund marking has been approved, and is applied to the container, then the sticker must not be placed on any portion of the opening mechanism or in any other place that would require complete or partial removal of the sticker before the contents may be consumed.

 - 18.04A The document containing the contact details of the protected person(s) must be stored electronically, separately from the hard file and any hardcopy of the document can be subsequently destroyed.
4. Sub-Rule 18.08 is deleted and replaced, and 18.08A and 18.08B are inserted, as follows:
 - 18.08 An application for variation or revocation of an Intervention Order must comply with a Form 31 and must be served personally.
 - 18.08A An application to the Court for variation or revocation of an Intervention Order must comply with a Form 31. The application must be accompanied by the following details of any listed protected person(s) on a separate document:
 - (a) the person's full name;
 - (b) address;
 - (c) telephone number;
 - (d) email address; and
 - (e) preferred method of notification.
 - 18.04B The document containing the contact details of the protected person(s) must be stored electronically, separately from the hard file and any hardcopy of the document can be subsequently destroyed.
5. Rule 18B is inserted as follows:
 - 18B.00 CHILD SEX OFFENDERS REGISTRATION ACT 2006
