Fees for storage, slipping, straddle carrier use and boat movements in boat yards at Port MacDonnell, Beachport and Kingscote are charged to recover some of the costs associated with the operation and administration of these facilities.

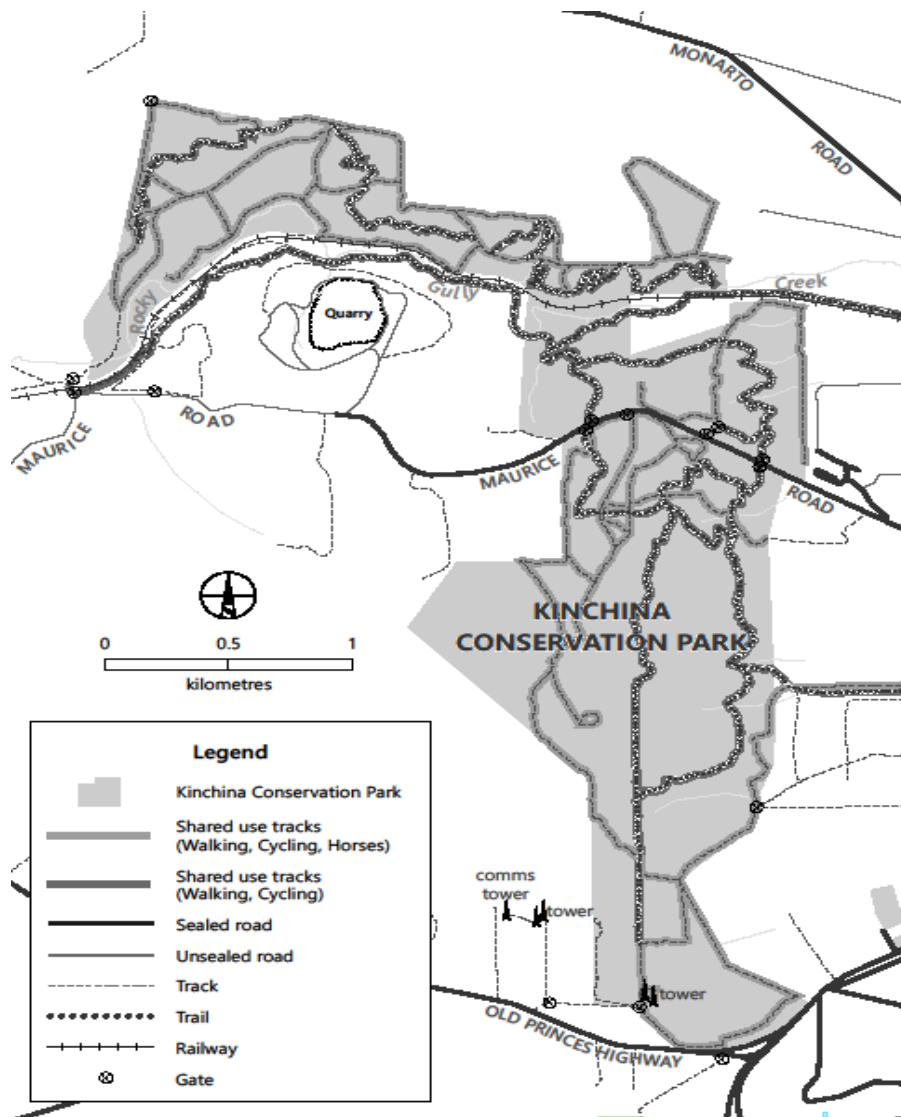
Map B1: Monarto Woodlands Conservation Park. East

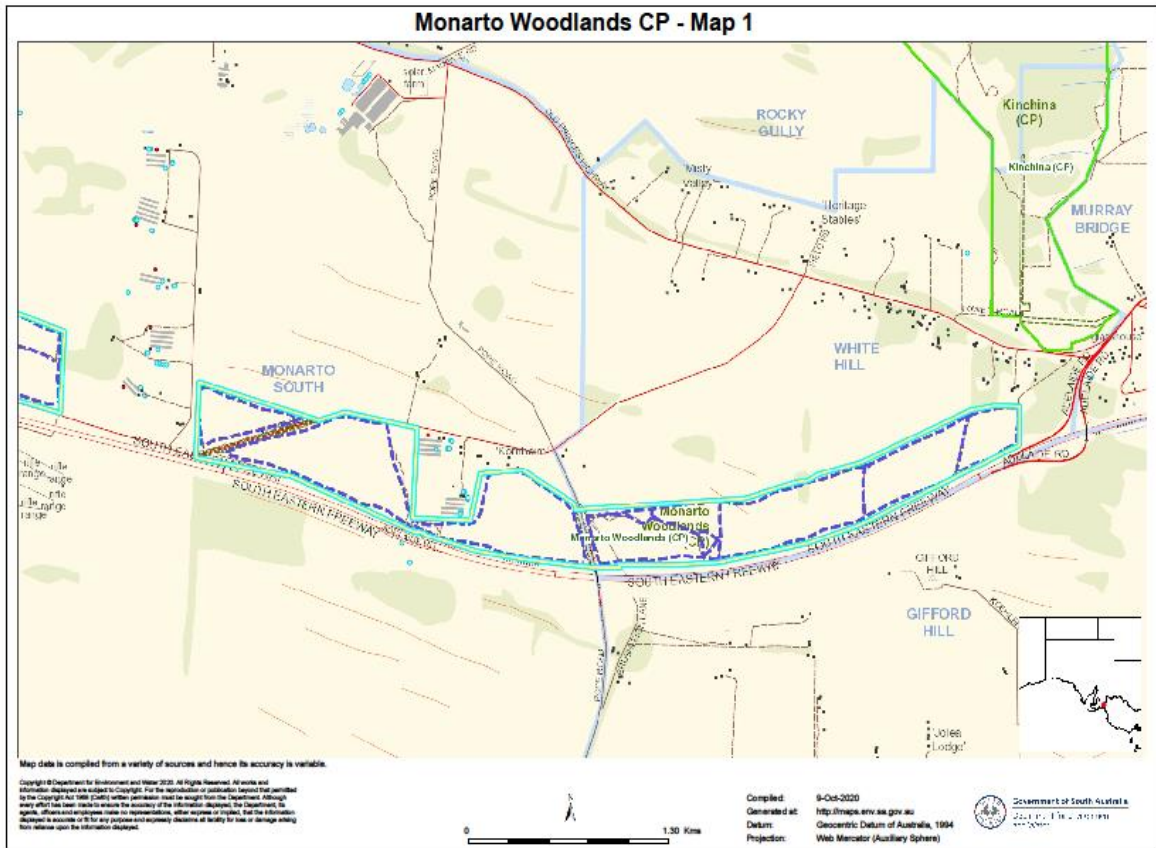

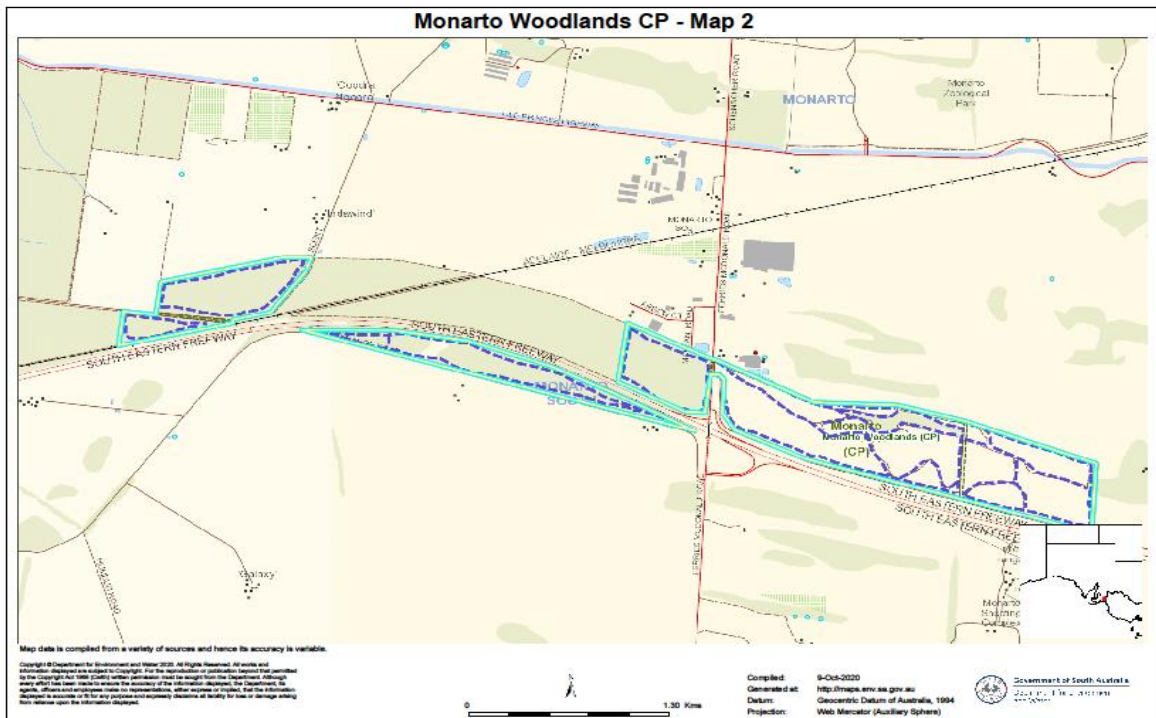
MAP A: KINCHINA CONSERVATION PARK

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999

By-law No. 1 of 2021—Permits and Penalties By-law 2021

To provide for a permit system, set penalties for breaches of by-laws, provide for certain matters pertaining to liability and evidence, set regulatory requirements, clarify the construction of Council's by-laws and for related purposes.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1. Short Title

This by-law may be cited as the *Permits and Penalties By-law 2021*.

2. Commencement

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the Gazette in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

3. Definitions

3.1 In any by-law of the Council, unless the contrary intention is clearly indicated:

- 3.1.1 **authorised person** means a person appointed as an authorised person pursuant to Section 260 of the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.1.2 **Council** means the District Council of Coober Pedy;
- 3.1.3 **drive** a vehicle means to be in control of the steering, movement or propulsion of the vehicle;
- 3.1.4 **driver** of a vehicle means the person driving the vehicle;
- 3.1.5 **motor vehicle** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961*;
- 3.1.6 **person** includes a natural person, a body corporate or incorporated association;
- 3.1.7 **road** has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.1.8 **vehicle** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961* and the *Australian Road Rules* and includes a motor vehicle.

3.2 In this by-law:

- 3.2.1 **owner** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961*;
- 3.2.2 **prescribed offence** means an offence against a by-law of the Council relating to the driving, parking or standing of vehicles.

4. Construction

Every by-law of the Council shall be subject to any Act of Parliament and Regulations made thereunder.

PART 2—PERMITS

5. Council May Grant Permits

If any by-law of the Council states that a person needs a 'permit' or 'permission' to do a specified thing, then the following provisions apply:

- 5.1 the permit must be in writing;
- 5.2 a person may apply for permission by:
 - 5.2.1 making a written application for permission to the Council or its duly authorised agent;
 - 5.2.2 making application by way of a website established by the Council for the purpose of issuing a permit of a particular kind;
 - 5.2.3 obtaining a permit from a permit vending-machine installed and maintained by the Council that has been designated by the Council for the purposes of issuing a permit of a particular kind;
- 5.3 the Council may:
 - 5.3.1 provide that the permit applies for a particular term;
 - 5.3.2 attach conditions to the permit the Council considers appropriate;
 - 5.3.3 change or revoke a condition, by notice in writing; or
 - 5.3.4 add new conditions, by notice in writing;
- 5.4 a person who holds a permit must comply with every condition attached to it. Failure to do so constitutes a breach of this by-law;
- 5.5 the Council may revoke a permit, by notice in writing, if:
 - 5.5.1 the holder of the permit fails to comply with a condition attached to it; or
 - 5.5.2 the permit is of a continuing nature, and the Council has reasonable grounds for revoking it;
- 5.6 the Council may, by resolution, fix, vary or revoke fees or charges for the granting of a permit to do a specified thing;
- 5.7 a person who applies for permission by way of subparagraph 5.2.2 or 5.2.3 is taken to have been granted permission when the following steps have been completed:
 - 5.7.1 the person pays the permit fee (if any) by (as the case may be):
 - 5.7.1.1 inserting sufficient coins or notes into the permit vending-machine;
 - 5.7.1.2 credit or debit card; or
 - 5.7.1.3 such other method of payment that may be approved by the Council by resolution;
 - 5.7.2 the person receives a notice identifying itself as a permit from the Council to undertake the activity specified in the permit.

PART 3—ENFORCEMENT

6. Penalties

- 6.1 A person who contravenes, or fails to comply with any by-law of the Council is guilty of an offence and is liable to a maximum penalty, being the maximum penalty referred to in the *Local Government Act 1999*, which may be fixed for offences against a by-law.
- 6.2 A person who is convicted of an offence against any by-law of the Council in respect of a continuing act or omission is liable, in addition to the penalty otherwise applicable, to a further penalty, being the maximum penalty referred to in the *Local Government Act 1999* which may be fixed for offences of a continuing nature against a by-law.

7. Liability of Vehicles Owners and Expiation of Certain Offences

- 7.1 Without derogating from the liability of any other person, but subject to this paragraph, if a vehicle is involved in a prescribed offence, the owner of the vehicle is guilty of an offence and liable to the same penalty as is prescribed for the principal offence and the expiation fee that is fixed for the principal offence applies in relation to an offence against this paragraph.
- 7.2 The owner and driver of a vehicle are not both liable through the operation of this paragraph to be convicted of an offence arising out of the same circumstances, and consequently conviction of the owner exonerates the driver and conversely conviction of the driver exonerates the owner.
- 7.3 An expiation notice or expiation reminder notice given under the *Expiation of Offences Act 1996* to the owner of a vehicle for an alleged prescribed offence involving the vehicle must be accompanied by a notice inviting the owner, if they were not the driver at the time of the alleged prescribed offence, to provide the Council or officer specified in the notice, within the period specified in the notice, with a statutory declaration:
 - 7.3.1 setting out the name and address of the driver; or
 - 7.3.2 if they had transferred ownership of the vehicle to another prior to the time of the alleged offence and has complied with the *Motor Vehicles Act 1959* in respect of the transfer—setting out details of the transfer (including the name and address of the transferee).
- 7.4 Before proceedings are commenced against the owner of a vehicle for an offence against this section involving the vehicle, the Informant must send the owner a notice:
 - 7.4.1 setting out particulars of the alleged prescribed offence; and
 - 7.4.2 inviting the owner, if he or she was not the driver at the time of the alleged prescribed offence, to provide the Informant, within 21 days of the date of the notice, with a statutory declaration setting out the matters referred to in subparagraph 7.3.
- 7.5 Subparagraph 7.4 does not apply to:
 - 7.5.1 proceedings commenced where an owner has elected under the *Expiation of Offences Act 1996* to be prosecuted for the offence; or
 - 7.5.2 proceedings commenced against an owner of a vehicle who has been named in a statutory declaration under this section as the driver of the vehicle.

- 7.6 Subject to subparagraph 7.7, in proceedings against the owner of a vehicle for an offence against this paragraph, it is a defence to prove:
- 7.6.1 that, in consequence of some unlawful act, the vehicle was not in the possession or control of the owner at the time of the alleged prescribed offence; or
- 7.6.2 that the owner provided the Informant with a statutory declaration in accordance with an invitation under this paragraph.
- 7.7 The defence in paragraph 7.6.2 does not apply if it is proved that the owner made the declaration knowing it to be false in a material particular.
- 7.8 If:
- 7.8.1 an expiation notice is given to a person named as the alleged driver in a statutory declaration under this paragraph; or
- 7.8.2 proceedings are commenced against a person named as the alleged driver in such a statutory declaration, the notice or summons, as the case may be, must be accompanied by a notice setting out particulars of the statutory declaration that named the person as the alleged driver.
- 7.9 The particulars of the statutory declaration provided to the person named as the alleged driver must not include the address of the person who provided the statutory declaration.

8. Evidence

In proceedings for a prescribed offence, an allegation in an Information that:

- 8.1 a specified place was a road or local government land; or
- 8.2 a specified vehicle was driven, parked or left standing in a specified place; or
- 8.3 a specified vehicle was parked or left standing for the purposes of soliciting business from a person or offering or exposing goods for sale; or
- 8.4 a specified place was not formed or otherwise set aside by the Council for the purposes of the driving, parking or standing of vehicles; or
- 8.5 a specified person was an authorised person; or
- 8.6 a specified provision was a condition of a specified permit granted under paragraph 5 of this by-law; or
- 8.7 a specified person was the owner or driver of a specified vehicle; or
- 8.8 a person named in a statutory declaration under paragraph 7 of this by-law for the prescribed offence to which the declaration relates was the driver of the vehicle at the time at which the alleged offence was committed; or
- 8.9 an owner or driver of a vehicle for a prescribed offence was given notice under paragraph 7 of this by-law on a specified day, is proof of the matters so alleged in the absence of proof to the contrary.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999

By-law No. 2 of 2021—Moveable Signs By-law 2021

To set standards for moveable signs on roads, to provide conditions for and the placement of such signs, to protect public safety and to protect or enhance the amenity of the area of the Council.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1. Short Title

This by-law may be cited as the *Moveable Signs By-law 2021*.

2. Commencement

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

3. Definitions

In this by-law, unless the contrary intention appears:

- 3.1 **approved construction** means a moveable sign which:
- 3.1.1 is not more than 1 metre high, 700mm in length and 700mm in width; and
- 3.1.2 when placed on a footpath in a display position is not more than 700mm in length; and
- 3.1.3 is constructed so as not to be (or likely to be) a hazard to a member of the public using the footpath upon which the moveable sign has been placed; and
- 3.1.4 is constructed so as to be (or likely to be) stable when displayed upon a footpath including being stable during adverse weather conditions; and
- 3.1.5 does not rotate, contain flashing lights or is illuminated internally or externally; and
- 3.1.6 does not have balloons, flags, streamers or other things attached to it;
- 3.2 **authorised person** has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.3 **banner** means a moveable sign constituted of a strip of cloth, plastic or other material hung or attached to a pole, fence or other structure;
- 3.4 **business premises** means the premises from which a business, trade or calling is conducted that is open to the public;

3.5 *footpath* means:

3.5.1 a footway, lane or other place made or constructed for the use of pedestrians and not for the use of vehicles;

3.5.2 that part of a road between the edge of the carriageway and the boundary between the road and the adjoining land on the same side of the carriageway as that edge;

3.6 *moveable sign* has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;

3.7 *road* has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;

3.8 *road related area* has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961*.

PART 2—PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO MOVEABLE SIGNS

4. Construction and Design

A moveable sign displayed on a road must be of an approved construction.

5. Appearance

A moveable sign on a road must, in the opinion of an authorised person:

5.1 be painted or otherwise detailed in a competent and professional manner; and

5.2 be aesthetically appealing, legible and simply worded to convey a precise message; and

5.3 be of such design and contain such colours:

5.3.1 as are compatible with the architectural design of the premises adjacent to the sign; and

5.3.2 which relate well to the townscape and overall amenity of the locality in which it is situated; and

5.3.3 which do not detract from or conflict with traffic, safety or direction signs or signals; and

5.4 contain combinations of colours and typographical styles which blend in with and reinforce the heritage qualities of the locality and the buildings where it is situated.

6. Placement

A moveable sign must:

6.1 only be placed on the footpath of a road; and

6.2 be adjacent to the business premises to which it relates; and

6.3 be placed at least 600mm from the kerb or where there is no kerb to define the footpath, must allow a set back of 600mm from the edge of the carriageway of a road; and

6.4 in the case of a flat sign, be in line with and against the property boundary of the road; and

6.5 be placed no less than 1.2 metres away from any structure, fixed object, tree, bush or plant (including another moveable sign); and

6.6 not be fixed, tied or chained to or leaned against any other structure, fixed object, tree, bush or plant (including another moveable sign); and

6.7 not be placed on a sealed part of any footpath, unless the sealed part is wide enough to contain the sign and still leave a clear thoroughfare at least 1.2 metres wide; and

6.8 not be placed within six metres of the corner or intersection of a road; and

6.9 not be placed on a designated parking area or within 1 metre of an entrance to or exit from business premises; and

6.10 not unreasonably:

6.10.1 restrict the use of the footpath or road; or

6.10.2 endanger the safety of members of the public.

7. Restrictions

A moveable sign displayed on a road must:

7.1 only display material which advertises a business being conducted on business premises adjacent to the sign, or the products available from that business; and

7.2 be limited to one per business premises; and

7.3 only be displayed when the business is open to the public; and

7.4 be securely fixed in position such that it cannot be blown over or swept away; and

7.5 not be placed in such a position or in such circumstances that the safety of any user of the road is at risk; and

7.6 not be displayed during the hours of darkness unless it is clearly visible; and

7.7 not to be displayed on a median strip, traffic island or on a carriageway of a road.

8. Banners

A banner must:

8.1 only be displayed on a road, footpath or road related area;

8.2 be securely fixed to a pole, fence or other structure so that it does not hang loose or flap;

8.3 not, without the Council's permission, be attached to any building, structure, fence, vegetation or other item owned by the Council on a road, or other improvement to a road owned by the Council;

8.4 not be displayed more than one month before and two days after the event it advertises;

8.5 not be displayed for a continuous period of more than one month and two days in any 12 month period;

8.6 not exceed 3m² in size.

PART 3—ENFORCEMENT

9. Removal of Unauthorised Moveable Signs

- 9.1 If a moveable sign has been placed on any public road or footpath in contravention of this by-law or of Section 226 of the *Local Government Act 1999*, an authorised person may order the owner of the sign to remove the moveable sign from the road or footpath.
- 9.2 If the authorised person cannot find the owner, or the owner fails to comply immediately with the order, the authorised person may remove the sign.
- 9.3 If a moveable sign is removed under subparagraph 9.1 of this by-law and is not claimed within 30 days of such removal the authorised person may sell, destroy or otherwise dispose of the moveable sign as the authorised person thinks fit.
- 9.4 Any person who displays an unauthorised moveable sign or who is the owner of an unauthorised moveable sign which has been removed under subparagraph 9.2 of this by-law must pay the Council any reasonable costs incurred in removing, storing or attempting to dispose of the moveable sign before being entitled to recover the moveable sign.

10. Removal of Authorised Moveable Signs

- 10.1 A moveable sign must be removed or relocated by the person who placed the moveable sign on a road or footpath or the owner of the moveable sign, at the request of an authorised officer if, in the opinion of the authorised person, and notwithstanding compliance with this by-law, there is any hazard or obstruction or there is likely to be a hazard or obstruction arising out of the location of the moveable sign.
- 10.2 A moveable sign must be removed or relocated by the person who placed the moveable sign on a road or public place or the owner of the sign, at the request of an authorised person, if so required by the authorised person for the purpose of special events, parades, road or footpath works or any other circumstances which, in the opinion of the authorised person, requires relocation or removal of the moveable sign.

PART 4—MISCELLANEOUS

11. Specified Exemptions

This by-law does not apply to a moveable sign which:

- 11.1 is a moveable sign that is placed on a public road pursuant to an authorisation under the *Local Government Act 1999* or another Act;
- 11.2 directs people to a current open inspection of any land or building that is available for purchase or lease;
- 11.3 directs people to a current garage sale that is being held on residential premises provided the sign does not restrict the use of the road or endanger the safety of members of the public;
- 11.4 is a flat sign containing only the banner or headlines of a newspaper or magazine provided:
- 11.4.1 the sign does not restrict the use of the road or endanger members of the public; and
- 11.4.2 only three such signs are displayed in relation to a business premises;
- 11.5 is related to a Commonwealth election that occurs during the period commencing at 5:00pm on the day before the issue of the writ or writs for the election and ending at the close of polls on polling day;
- 11.6 is related to a State election and is otherwise authorised to be exhibited under Section 226 of *Local Government Act 1999* or the *Electoral Act 1985*;
- 11.7 is related to an election held under the *Local Government Act 1999* or the *Local Government (Elections) Act 1999* and is otherwise authorised to be exhibited under Section 226 of *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 11.8 related to a referendum and is displayed during the course and for the purpose of that referendum;
- 11.9 is displayed with permission of the Council and in accordance with any conditions attached to that permission; or
- 11.10 is a sign of a class prescribed in the regulations.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999

By-law No. 3 of 2021—Local Government Land By-law 2021

For the management and regulation of the use of and access to all land vested in or under the control of the Council including the prohibition and regulation of particular activities on local government land.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1. Short Title

This by-law may be cited as the *Local Government Land By-law 2021*.

2. Commencement

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

3. Definitions

In this by-law:

- 3.1 **animal** includes birds and insects;
- 3.2 **authorised person** has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.3 **camp** includes setting up a camp, or causing or allowing a tent, sleeping bag, caravan or motor home to remain on land for the purpose of staying overnight whether or not any person is in attendance or sleeps on the land;

- 3.4 **children's playground** means any enclosed area in which there is equipment, apparatus or other installed devices for the purpose of children's play (or within 5 metres of such devices if there is no enclosed area);
- 3.5 **domestic animal** includes any duck, reptile or fish;
- 3.6 **e-cigarette** means:
- 3.6.1 a device that is designed to generate or release an aerosol or vapour for inhalation by its user in a manner similar to the inhalation of smoke from an ignited tobacco product; or
- 3.6.2 a device of a kind resolved by the Council and notified by notice in the *Gazette* to be an e-cigarette;
- 3.7 **electoral matter** has the same meaning as in the *Electoral Act 1985* provided that such electoral matter is not capable of causing physical damage or injury to any person within its immediate vicinity;
- 3.8 **emergency worker** has the same meaning as in Regulation 54 of the *Road Traffic (Road Rules—Ancillary and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 2014*;
- 3.9 **funeral ceremony** means a ceremony only (ie. a memorial service) and does not include a burial;
- 3.10 **liquor** has the same meaning as defined in the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*;
- 3.11 **local government land** has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*, but does not include any road;
- 3.12 **open container** means a container which:
- 3.12.1 after the contents thereof have been sealed at the time of manufacture and:
- 3.12.1.1 being a bottle, has had its cap, cork or top removed (whether or not it has since been replaced);
- 3.12.1.2 being a can, it has been opened or punctured;
- 3.12.1.3 being a cask, has had its tap placed in a position to allow it to be used;
- 3.12.1.4 being any form of container, it has been opened, broken, punctured or manipulated in such a way as to allow access to the contents thereof; or
- 3.12.2 is a flask, glass or mug or other container used for drinking purposes;
- 3.13 **organised competition or sport** does not include social play;
- 3.14 **smoke** means:
- 3.14.1 in relation to a tobacco product, smoke, hold, or otherwise have control over, an ignited tobacco product; or
- 3.14.2 in relation to an e-cigarette, to inhale from, hold or otherwise have control over, an e-cigarette that is in use;
- 3.15 **traffic control device** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961*;
- 3.16 **variable message sign** includes a permanent, portable or vehicle mounted electronic sign (except when the sign is used as a traffic control device).

PART 2—MANAGEMENT OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT LAND

4. Activities Requiring Permission

A person must not without the permission of Council on any local government land:

- 4.1 **Advertising and Signage**
- 4.1.1 display any sign for the purpose of commercial advertising, other than a moveable sign that is displayed in accordance with the *Moveable Signs By-law 2021*;
- 4.1.2 erect, install, place or display a variable message sign;
- 4.1.3 place or maintain any goods or sign on the land or park or stand a vehicle on the land for the purpose of:
- 4.1.3.1 soliciting any business from any person; or
- 4.1.3.2 offering or exposing goods or services for sale
- provided that this subparagraph 4.1.3 shall not apply to a person who is simply travelling along any part of local government land set aside by the Council;
- 4.2 **Aircraft**
- Subject to the *Civil Aviation Act 1988*, land or take off any aircraft on or from the land;
- 4.3 **Athletic and Ball Sports**
- 4.3.1 to which this subparagraph applies, promote, organise or take part in any organised athletic sport;
- 4.3.2 to which this subparagraph applies, play or practice the game of golf;
- 4.4 **Alteration to Local Government Land**
- Make an alteration to the land, including:
- 4.4.1 altering the construction or arrangement of the land to permit or facilitate access from an adjacent property; or
- 4.4.2 erecting or installing a structure (including pipes, wires, cables, pavers, fixtures, fittings and other objects) in, on, across, under or over the land; or
- 4.4.3 changing or interfering with the construction, arrangement or materials of the land; or
- 4.4.4 changing, interfering with or removing a structure (including pipes, wires, cables, fixtures, fittings or other objects) associated with the land; or
- 4.4.5 planting a tree or other vegetation on the land, interfering with the vegetation on the land or removing vegetation from the land;
- 4.5 **Amplification**
- Use an amplifier or other device whether mechanical or electrical for the purpose of amplifying sound to the public;

- 4.6 *Animals on Local Government Land*
- 4.6.1 cause or allow any animal to stray onto, move over, graze or be left unattended;
- 4.6.2 ride, lead or drive any horse, cattle or sheep, except on any track or car park on local government land that the Council has set aside (through the erection of signage) for the use by, or in connection with that animal;
- 4.6.3 allow an animal in that persons control, charge or ownership to damage Council property;
- 4.6.4 release or leave any domestic animal;
- 4.7 *Attachments*
Attach anything to a tree, plant, structure or fixture on local government land;
- 4.8 *Bees*
Place, or allow to remain, any bee hive;
- 4.9 *Burying and Memorials*
- 4.9.1 bury, inter or spread the ashes of any human or animal remains;
- 4.9.2 erect any memorial;
- 4.10 *Buildings and Structures*
- 4.10.1 erect or install a building;
- 4.10.2 use a building or structure other than for its intended purpose;
- 4.11 *Camping and Tents*
Camp or remain overnight, provided that this clause does not apply to a person where the person camps:
- 4.11.1 in caravan or motorhome; and
- 4.11.2 within 200m of a sign displayed by the Council indicating that camping in a caravan or motorhome is permitted on that land;
- 4.12 *Cemeteries*
Comprising a cemetery:
- 4.12.1 bury or inter any human or animal remains;
- 4.12.2 erect any memorial;
- 4.13 *Closed Lands*
Enter or remain on any part of the land:
- 4.13.1 at any time during which the Council has declared that it shall be closed to the public, and which is indicated by a sign to that effect; or
- 4.13.2 where the land is enclosed with fences and/or walls and gates, at any time when the gates have been closed and locked; or
- 4.13.3 where admission charges are payable, without paying those charges;
- 4.14 *Depositing Soil*
Deposit any soil, clay, gravel, sand, timber, stones, pebbles or any other matter on the land;
- 4.15 *Distribution*
Distribute anything to any bystander, passerby or other person;
- 4.16 *Donations*
Ask for or receive or indicate a desire for a donation of money or any other thing;
- 4.17 *Entertaining*
- 4.17.1 sing, busk or play any recording or upon any musical instrument so as to appear to be for the purpose of entertaining other persons whether or not receiving money;
- 4.17.2 conduct or hold a concert, festival, show, circus, performance or similar activity;
- 4.18 *Fauna*
Subject to the *Native Vegetation Act 1991* and the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1972*:
- 4.18.1 tease, remove or cause harm to any animal or bird or the eggs or young of any animal or bird;
- 4.18.2 use, possess or have control of any device for the purpose of killing or capturing any animal or bird;
- 4.19 *Fires*
Light any fire except:
- 4.19.1 in a place provided by the Council for that purpose; or
- 4.19.2 in a portable barbeque, as long as the barbeque is used in an area that is clear of flammable material for a distance of at least four metres; and
- 4.19.3 in accordance with the *Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005*;
- 4.20 *Fireworks*
Discharge any fireworks;
- 4.21 *Funerals and Scattering Ashes*
Conduct or participate in a funeral ceremony, or scatter ashes on land to which the Council has resolved this subparagraph will apply;
- 4.22 *Games*
- 4.22.1 participate in any game, recreation or amusement which involves the use of a ball, missile or other object which by the use thereof may cause or be likely to cause injury or discomfort to any person being on or in the vicinity of that land or detract from or be likely to detract from another person's lawful use and enjoyment of that land;
- 4.22.2 to which this subparagraph applies, play any organised competition sport, as distinct from organised social play;

- 4.23 *Lighting*
- 4.23.1 use or operate any fixed floodlight;
- 4.23.2 use or operate any portable floodlight on land to which this subparagraph applies;
- 4.24 *Model Aircraft*
- Subject to the *Civil Aviation Act 1988*, fly or operate a model aircraft or drone aircraft;
- 4.25 *Model Cars*
- operate a model or remote control vehicle in a manner which may cause or be likely to cause injury or discomfort to a person being on or in the vicinity of the land or detract from or be likely to detract from another person's lawful use of and enjoyment of the land;
- 4.26 *No Liquor*
- 4.26.1 consume, carry or be in possession or charge of any liquor on any local government land constituting a park or reserve to which this subparagraph applies;
- 4.26.2 excepting sealed containers, consume, carry or be in possession or charge of any liquor in an open container on any local government land constituting a park or reserve to which this subparagraph applies;
- 4.27 *Overhanging Articles*
- Suspend or hang any article or thing from any building, verandah, pergola, post or other structure where it might present a nuisance or danger to any person using local government land;
- 4.28 *Picking of Fruit, Nuts or Berries*
- Pick fruit, nuts, seeds or berries from any plant;
- 4.29 *Preaching and Canvassing*
- Preach, canvass, harangue or otherwise solicit for religious purposes except on any land or part thereof where the Council has, by resolution, determined this restriction shall not apply;
- 4.30 *Playing Area*
- Use or occupy a playing area:
- 4.30.1 in such a manner as to damage or be likely to damage the surface of the playing area or infrastructure (above and under ground level);
- 4.30.2 in a manner contrary to the purpose for which the playing area was intended to be used or occupied; or
- 4.30.3 contrary to directions of the Council made by resolution and indicated on a sign displayed adjacent to the playing area;
- 4.31 *Public Exhibitions and Displays*
- 4.31.1 sing, busk or play a musical instrument for the apparent purpose of either entertaining others or receiving money;
- 4.31.2 conduct or hold any concert, festival, show, public gathering, circus, performance or any other similar activity;
- 4.31.3 cause any public exhibitions or displays;
- 4.32 *Removing Soil etc.*
- Carry away or remove any earth, clay, gravel, sand, timber, stones, pebbles, rocks, minerals, plant material (dead or living), animal remains (including shells and fossils) or any part of the land;
- 4.33 *Rubbish and Rubbish Dumps*
- 4.33.1 interfere with, remove or take away any rubbish that has been discarded at any rubbish dump on local government land;
- 4.33.2 remove, disperse or interfere with any rubbish (including bottles, newspapers, cans, containers or packaging) that has been discarded in a Council rubbish bin on local government land;
- 4.33.3 deposit in any receptacle any rubbish emanating from domestic or trade purposes, unless designated by a sign or signs;
- 4.34 *Selling*
- Sell anything or display anything for sale;
- 4.35 *Smoking*
- To which this subparagraph applies, smoke;
- 4.36 *Skateboards and Small Wheeled Devices*
- Subject to the *Road Traffic Act 1961*, and the *Local Government Act 1999*, ride on a skateboard or use roller skates or roller blades on land to which the Council has resolved this subparagraph will apply;
- 4.37 *Trading*
- 4.37.1 carry on the business of selling or offering or exposing for sale any goods, merchandise, commodity, article or thing; or
- 4.37.2 set up a van or other vehicle or stall or other structure, tray, carpet or device for the purpose of buying or selling any goods, merchandise, commodity, article or thing;
- 4.38 *Vehicles*
- 4.38.1 drive or propel a motor vehicle thereon, unless on an area or road constructed or set aside by the Council for the parking or travelling of motor vehicles;
- 4.38.2 except on an area properly constructed for the purpose, promote, organise or take part in any race, test or trial of any kind in which motor vehicles, motor cycles, motor scooters or bicycles take part;
- 4.39 *Weddings*
- Conduct or participate in a marriage ceremony on land to which the Council has resolved this subparagraph will apply;
- 4.40 *Working on Vehicles*
- Perform the work of repairing, washing, painting, panel beating or other work of any nature on or to any vehicle, except for running repairs in the case of breakdown.

5. Prohibited Activities

A person must not, on any local government land:

5.1 *Animals*

5.1.1 send, drive, lead, ride or take any animal or permit any animal to be sent, driven, led, ridden or taken on any land which the Council has, by resolution, declared to be prohibited for such purpose;

5.1.2 allow any animal to be let loose or left unattended on any land which the council has, by resolution, declared to be prohibited for such purpose;

5.2 *Annoyances*

Unreasonably annoy or interfere with any other person:

5.2.1 using the land;

5.2.2 occupying nearby premises,

by making a noise or creating a disturbance that has not been authorised by the Council;

5.3 *Defacing Property*

Deface, paint, write, cut names or make marks on any tree, rock, gate, fence, building, sign or other property of the Council therein;

5.4 *Glass*

Wilfully break any glass, china or other brittle material;

5.5 *Interference with Permitted Use*

Interrupt, disrupt or interfere with any other person's use of local government land which is permitted or for which permission has been granted;

5.6 *Missiles*

Throw, roll or discharge any stone, substance or missile to the danger of any person or animal;

5.7 *Playing Games*

5.7.1 play or practice a game in any area where a sign indicates that the game is prohibited;

5.7.2 promote, organise or take part in any organised competition or sport in any area to which this subparagraph applies;

5.8 *Smoking*

Smoke tobacco or any other substance:

5.8.1 in any building or part of any building; or

5.8.2 on any land to which this subparagraph applies;

5.9 *Solicitation*

Tout or solicit customers for the parking of vehicles or for any other purpose;

5.10 *Toilets*

In any public convenience:

5.10.1 urinate other than in a urinal or pan or defecate other than in a pan provided for that purpose;

5.10.2 smoke tobacco or any other substance;

5.10.3 deposit anything in a pan, urinal or drain which is likely to cause a blockage;

5.10.4 use it for a purpose for which it was not designed or constructed;

5.10.5 enter any toilet that is set aside for use by the opposite sex except where:

5.10.5.1 a child under the age of five accompanied by an adult person of that other sex; and/or

5.10.5.2 to provide assistance to a disabled person;

5.11 *Use of Equipment*

Use any item of equipment or property belonging to the Council other than in the manner and for the purpose for which it was designed or set aside.

PART 3—MISCELLANEOUS

6. Directions

A person must comply with any reasonable direction or request from an authorised person relating to:

6.1 that person's use of the land;

6.2 that person's conduct and behaviour on the land;

6.3 that person's safety on the land;

6.4 the safety and enjoyment of the land by other persons.

7. Removal of Animals and Exclusion of Persons

7.1 If any animal is found on local government land in breach of this by-law:

7.1.1 any person in charge of the animal shall forthwith remove it from that land on the request of an authorised person; and

7.1.2 any authorised person may remove any animal from the land if the person fails to comply with the request, or if no person is in charge of the animal.

7.2 An authorised person may direct any person who is considered to be committing, or has committed, a breach of this by-law to leave local government land and not return for a period of no longer than 24 hours.

8. Removal of Encroachment or Interference

Any person who encroaches onto or interferes with local government land contrary to this by-law must at the request in writing of an authorised person, cease the encroachment or interference and remove the source of the encroachment or interference, and reinstate the land to the same standard as the state of the land prior to the encroachment or interference.

9. Council May Do Work

If a person fails to remove an encroachment or interference on local government land in accordance with a request of an authorised person pursuant to paragraph 8 of this by-law, then the Council may:

- 9.1 undertake the work itself; and
- 9.2 recover the cost of doing so from that person.

10. Exemptions

10.1 The restrictions in this by-law do not apply to any Police Officer, Council Officer or Council employee acting in the course and within the scope of that person's normal duties, or to a contractor while performing work for the Council and while acting under the supervision of a Council Officer, or to an emergency worker performing emergency duties.

10.2 The restrictions in paragraph 4.1.2, 4.5, 4.7, 4.15, 4.27, 4.29, 4.31.2 and 4.31.3 of this by-law do not apply to:

- 10.2.1 electoral matters authorised by a candidate and which is related to a State or Commonwealth election and is displayed during the period commencing at 5.00pm on the day before the day of the issue of writ or writs for the election and ending at the close of polls on polling day; or
- 10.2.2 electoral matters authorised by a candidate and which relate to an election under the *Local Government Act 1999* or the *Local Government (Elections) Act 1999* that occurs during the period commencing four weeks immediately before the date that has been set (either by or under either Act) for polling day and ending at the close of voting on polling day; or
- 10.2.3 matters which relate to, and occur during the course of and for the purpose of a referendum.

11. Application

Any of paragraphs 4.3, 4.21, 4.22.2, 4.23.2, 4.26, 4.35, 4.36, 4.39, 5.1, 5.7.2 and 5.8.2 of this by-law shall apply only in such portion or portions of the area as the Council may by resolution direct from time to time in accordance with Section 246(3)(e) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999
By-law No. 4 of 2021—Roads By-law 2021

For the management of public roads.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1. Short Title

This by-law may be cited as the *Roads By-law 2021*.

2. Commencement

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

3. Definitions

In this by-law, unless the contrary intention appears:

- 3.1 **adjacent land** has the same meaning as in the *Australian Road Rules*;
- 3.2 **animal** includes birds and poultry but does not include a dog or a cat;
- 3.3 **authorised person** has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.4 **camp** includes setting up a camp, or causing or allowing a tent, sleeping bag, caravan or motor home to remain on land for the purpose of staying overnight whether or not any person is in attendance or sleeps on the land;
- 3.5 **cat** has the same meaning as in the *Dog and Cat Management Act 1995*;
- 3.6 **dog** has the same meaning as in the *Dog and Cat Management Act 1995*;
- 3.7 **electoral matter** has the same meaning as in the *Electoral Act 1985* provided that such electoral matter is not capable of causing physical damage or injury to any person within its immediate vicinity;
- 3.8 **emergency worker** has the same meaning as in Regulation 54 of the *Road Traffic (Road Rules—Ancillary and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 2014*;
- 3.9 **road** has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*.

PART 2—MANAGEMENT OF ROADS

4. Activities Requiring Permission

A person must not on any road, without the permission of Council:

4.1 Advertising

- 4.1.1 display any sign for the purpose of commercial advertising, other than a moveable sign which is displayed on a public road in accordance with the Council's *Moveable Signs By-law 2021*;

- 4.1.2 place or maintain any goods or sign on the road or park or stand a vehicle on the road for the purpose of:
- 4.1.2.1 soliciting any business from any person; or
- 4.1.2.2 offering or exposing goods or services for sale
- provided that this subparagraph 4.1.2 shall not apply to a person who is simply travelling along a road.
- 4.2 *Amplification*
Use an amplifier or other device whether mechanical or electrical for the purposes of amplifying sound to the public;
- 4.3 *Animals*
- 4.3.1 cause or allow any animal, to stray onto, graze, wander on or be left unattended on any road except where the Council has set aside a track or other area for use by or in connection with an animal of that kind and, then only if under the effective control of a person;
- 4.3.2 lead, drive or exercise any animal in such a manner as to cause a nuisance or endanger the safety of a person;
- 4.4 *Camping*
- 4.4.1 erect any tent or other structure of calico, canvas, plastic or similar material as a place of habitation;
- 4.4.2 camp or remain overnight, provided that this clause does not apply to a person where the person camps:
- 4.4.2.1 in a caravan or motorhome; and
- 4.4.2.2 within 200m of a sign displayed by the Council indicating that camping in a caravan or motorhome is permitted on that road;
- 4.5 *Donations*
Ask for or receive or indicate that he or she desires a donation of money or any other thing;
- 4.6 *Driving on Formed Surface*
Drive a motor vehicle other than on a portion of the road that has been formed or otherwise set aside by the Council for the driving of motor vehicles, unless it is not reasonably practical to do so;
- 4.7 *Fires*
Light any fire except:
- 4.7.1 in a place provided by the Council for that purpose; or
- 4.7.2 in a portable barbeque, as long as the barbeque is used in an area that is clear of flammable material for a distance of at least four metres; and
- 4.7.3 in accordance with the *Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005*;
- 4.8 *Obstructions*
Erect, install or place or cause to be erected, installed or placed any structure, object or material of any kind so as to obstruct a road or footway, water-channel, or watercourse in a road;
- 4.9 *Preaching*
Preach or harangue;
- 4.10 *Public Exhibitions and Displays*
- 4.10.1 sing, busk, play a recording or use a music instrument, or perform similar activities;
- 4.10.2 conduct or hold a concert, festival, show, circus, performance or a similar activity;
- 4.10.3 erect a stage or structure for the purpose of conducting or holding a concert, festival, show, circus, performance or a similar activity;
- 4.10.4 cause any public exhibitions or displays;
- 4.11 *Soliciting for Religious or Charitable Purposes*
Ask for or receive or indicate a desire for a donation of money or any other thing, or otherwise solicit for religious or charitable purposes;
- 4.12 *Working on Vehicles*
Perform the work of repairing, washing, painting, panel beating or other work of any nature on or to any vehicle, except for running repairs in the case of breakdown.

PART 3—MISCELLANEOUS

5. Directions

A person must comply with any reasonable direction or request from an authorised person relating to:

- 5.1 that person's use of the road;
- 5.2 that person's conduct and behaviour on the road;
- 5.3 that person's safety on the road;
- 5.4 the safety and enjoyment of the road by other persons.

6. Removal of Animals

If any animal is found on a road in breach of this by-law:

- 6.1 any person in charge of the animal shall forthwith remove it from that land on the request of an authorised person; and
- 6.2 any authorised person may remove any animal from the road if the person fails to comply with the request, or if no person is in charge of the animal.

7. Exemptions

- 7.1 The restrictions in this by-law do not apply to any Police Officer, Council Officer or Council employee acting in the course and within the scope of that person's normal duties, or to a contractor while performing work for the Council and while acting under the supervision of a Council Officer, or to an emergency worker performing emergency duties.
- 7.2 The restrictions in subparagraphs 4.2 and 4.10 of this by-law do not apply to:
- 7.2.1 electoral matters authorised by a candidate and which is related to a State or Commonwealth election and is displayed during the period commencing at 5.00pm on the day before the day of the issue of writ or writs for the election and ending at the close of polls on polling day;
- 7.2.2 electoral matters authorised by a candidate and which relate to an election under the *Local Government Act 1999* or the *Local Government (Elections) Act 1999* that occurs during the period commencing four weeks immediately before the date that has been set (either by or under either Act) for polling day and ending at the close of voting on polling day; or
- 7.2.3 matters which relate to, and occur during the course of and for the purpose of a referendum.
- 7.3 Subparagraph 4.6 of this by-law does not apply to a motor vehicle being driven to or from adjacent land by the shortest practical route.

DOG AND CAT MANAGEMENT ACT 1995

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999

By-law No. 5 of 2021—Dogs By-law 2021

For the management and control of dogs within the Council's area

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1. Short Title

This by-law may be cited as the *Dogs By-law 2021*.

2. Commencement

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

3. Definitions

In this by-law unless the context otherwise requires:

- 3.1 *Act* means the *Dog and Cat Management Act 1995*;
- 3.2 *approved kennel establishment* means a building, structure or area approved by the relevant authority, pursuant to the *Planning Development and Infrastructure Act 2016* for the keeping of dogs on a temporary or permanent basis;
- 3.3 *assistance dog* means a hearing dog, guide dog or a disability dog as defined in the Act;
- 3.4 *authorised person* means a person appointed as an authorised person pursuant to Section 25A of the Act and an authorised person under Section 260 of the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.5 *dog* has the same meaning as in the Act;
- 3.6 *effective control* means a person exercising effective control of a dog either:
- 3.6.1 by means of a physical restraint; or
- 3.6.2 by command, the dog being in close proximity to the person and the person being able to see the dog at all times;
- 3.7 *local government land* has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.8 *premises* means any domestic and non-domestic premises, except an approved kennel establishment in respect of which a development authorisation is in force under the *Planning Development and Infrastructure Act 2016*;
- 3.9 *small dwelling* means a flat, serviced flat, home unit, strata unit, community lot or suite of rooms which is wholly occupied, or designed or intended to be occupied, as a separate dwelling.

PART 2—DOG MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL

4. Dog Free Areas

A person must not on any local government land to which this paragraph applies, cause suffer or permit any dog (other than an assistance dog) under that person's control, charge or authority to be, or remain in that place.

5. Dogs on Leash Areas

A person must not on any local government land to which this paragraph applies, cause, suffer or permit any dog under that person's control, charge or authority to be or remain in that public unless such dog is restrained by a strong leash not exceeding two metres in length and either tethered securely to a fixed object or held by a person capable of controlling the dog and preventing it from being a nuisance or a danger to other persons.

6. Dog Exercise Areas

- 6.1 Any person may enter upon any part of local government land to which this paragraph applies in accordance with paragraph 9 of this by-law, for the purpose of exercising a dog under his or her effective control;
- 6.2 Where a person enters upon such part of local government land for that purpose, that person must ensure that the dog or dogs under his or her control remain under effective control while on the land;
- 6.3 The council will erect signs to denote the land to which this paragraph applies, and information shall be provided to the public in a manner determined by the Council's Chief Executive Officer to inform the public about such land.

7. Limit on Dog Numbers

- 7.1 The limit on the number of dogs kept in a small dwelling is one dog.
- 7.2 The limit on the number of dogs kept in premises other than a small dwelling is two dogs.
- 7.3 A person must not, without permission, keep any dog on any premises where the number of dogs on the premises exceeds the limit unless:
- 7.3.1 the Council, or such person authorised by the Council, has exempted the premises from compliance with this paragraph; or
- 7.3.2 the premises is an approved kennel establishment.

8. Orders

- 8.1 If a person engages in conduct that is in contravention of this by-law, an authorised person may order that person:
- 8.1.1 if the conduct is still continuing—to stop the conduct; and
- 8.1.2 whether or not the conduct is still continuing—to take specified action to remedy the contravention.
- 8.2 A person must comply with an order under this clause.
- 8.3 If a person does not comply with an order, the authorised person may take action reasonably required to have the order carried out, and the Council may recover its costs of any action so taken from the person to whom the order was directed.
- 8.4 However, an authorised person may not use force against a person under this clause.

PART 3—MISCELLANEOUS

9. Application of Paragraphs

- 9.1 Any of paragraphs 4, 5 and subparagraph 6.1 of this by-law shall apply only in such portion or portions of Council land as the Council may by resolution direct in accordance with Section 246(3)(e) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.
- 9.2 The limits prescribed in paragraph 7 of this by-law do not include any dog that is under three months of age.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999

By-law No. 6 of 2021—Nuisances By-law 2021

To prevent and suppress certain kinds of nuisances in the Council's area.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1. Short Title

This by-law may be cited as the *Nuisances By-law 2021*.

2. Commencement

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

3. Definitions

In this by-law:

- 3.1 **Blower** means a mechanical or electrical device which is primarily designed to convey soil through the use of a fan or fans for the purposes of opal mining or the construction of dugouts;
- 3.2 **Coober Pedy Precious Stones Field** has the same meaning as in the *Opal Mining Regulations 2012*.

PART 2—REGULATION OF BLOWERS

4. No Unauthorised Use

- 4.1 No person shall use a Blower within the area of the Council without having first obtained a permit from the Council.
- 4.2 A permit will only be granted where the Council is satisfied that the use of a Blower and the times during which it is to be used are such that a nuisance will not be caused to nearby persons or property.
- 4.3 The requirement to obtain a permit set out in subparagraph 4.1 of this by law does not apply to a Blower being used for opal mining activities undertaken on the Coober Pedy Precious Stones Field, unless the activities are being conducted within 300m of a residence.

5. Use of Devices Generally

Subject to paragraph 4 of this by-law, no person shall use a Blower or other mechanical or electrical device within the area of the Council so as to cause a nuisance by reason of:

- 5.1 the generation of dust;
- 5.2 fumes emanating from the Blower or other device; or
- 5.3 noise.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999*By-law No. 7 of 2021—Cats By-law 2021*

To limit the number of cats that can be kept on premises and to provide for the management and control of cats in the Council's area.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1. Short Title

This by-law may be cited as the *Cats By-law 2021*.

2. Commencement

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

3. Definitions

In this by-law unless the context otherwise requires:

- 3.1 **approved kennel establishment** means a building, structure, premises or area approved by the relevant authority pursuant to the *Planning Development and Infrastructure Act 2016* or otherwise lawfully established for the keeping of cats on a temporary or permanent basis;
- 3.2 **cat** has the same meaning as in the *Dog and Cat Management Act 1995*;
- 3.3 **keep** includes the provision of food or shelter;
- 3.4 **premises** includes land and part of any premises or land whether used or occupied for domestic or non-domestic purposes.

PART 2—CAT MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL

4. Cats Not to Be a Nuisance

No person shall keep or allow to remain on any premises of which he or she is the owner or occupier, any cat or cats so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health by reason of:

- 4.1 the noise or odour generated by the presence of the cat or cats;
- 4.2 the aggressive nature of the cat or cats; or
- 4.3 the cat or cats being allowed to wander from the land.

5. Limit on Keeping Cats

- 5.1 No person shall, without permission keep more than two cats on any premises.
- 5.2 The limit set out in subparagraph 5.1 of this by-law does not apply to:
 - 5.2.1 an approved kennel establishment operating in accordance with all approvals and consents; or
 - 5.2.2 where the Council otherwise grants permission.

By-law No. 8 of 2021—Water Conservation By-law 2021

To assist in the conservation of water and protect the integrity of Council's water supply network.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1. Short Title

This by-law may be cited as the *Water Conservation By-law 2021*.

2. Commencement

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

3. Definitions

In this by-law:

- 3.1 **new swimming pool** means a swimming pool in respect of which construction is completed after the commencement of this by-law;
- 3.2 **swimming pool** includes any public or private swimming pool, spa pool, waterslide pool, wave pool, hydrotherapy pool or other similar structure;
- 3.3 **water** means water supplied by the Council by way of a water supply network.

PART 2—WATER CONSERVATION MEASURES

4. Swimming Pools

- 4.1 A person must not use water to fill for the first time a new swimming pool except under the authority of a permit.
- 4.2 A person must not use water to refill a swimming pool except under the authority of a permit if the volume of water to be used exceed or be likely to exceed 30 kilolitres.

5. Other Significant uses of Water

- 5.1 A person must not use more than 5 kilolitres of water per hour for any purpose without providing the Council with at least 48 hours written notice prior to commencing the use.
- 5.2 Paragraph 5.1 does not apply to a use of water authorised by a permit granted for the purposes of paragraph 4 of this by-law.

Note: Without limiting its operation, the provisions of this paragraph may apply to:

- the operation of a large-scale sprinkler system;
- a private contractor utilising Council's standpipe;
- water-carting operations.
